Amit Shah will attend the 72nd convocation ceremony of Gujarat Vidyapith as the chief guest, where he will award degrees to graduating students and address the gathering, acknowledging their academic achievements. He will also preside over a review meeting in Ahmedabad regarding preparations for the Commonwealth Games. He is set to discuss infrastructure requirements, the pro-



gress of arrangements, and coordination efforts with officials. Additionally, Amit Shah will inaugurate various water conservation projects being undertaken in the state. Officials stated that these initiatives prioritize water resource preservation, groundwater replenishment, and rainwater harvesting. Water conservation projects are expected to improve water availability in both rural and urban areas while

also catering to future needs. Officials stated that these initiatives would contribute to sustainable water management in the state. Amit Shah's visit has gained significance as he is set to participate in programs related to key sectors such as education, sports, infrastructure, and water conservation. CISF Reviews Delhi Metro Security

High-level review of operational readiness

New Delhi, August 27 Trinet News: CISF Director General Praveer Ranjan visited the CISF-DMRC unit in Delhi on Thursday to review the security arrangements and operational readiness of the Delhi Metro Rail system. During the visit, he inspected the functioning of the security system alongside senior officers and reviewed matters concerning passenger safety. As part of the visit, Director General Praveer Ranjan met with Suvasis Choudhury, the Director (Operations) and Chief Security Commissioner of Delhi Metro. They held extensive discussions on Metro security preparedness, inter-departmental coordination, operational requirements, and future security strategies. He directed that measures be continued to ensure there are no lapses in passenger safety. Subsequently, the Director General inaugurated the CISF barracks constructed at Yamuna Bank. He inspected the amenities, residential facilities, and welfare measures provided to the personnel and gathered details from the officials. He noted that providing better facilities to security personnel on duty would further enhance their operational efficiency. DG Pravir Ranjan met with CISF personnel during a 'Sainik Sammelan' (troop interaction session) held on this occasion. He urged them to discharge their national security responsibilities with utmost dedication and to always maintain vigilance, discipline, and professional competence. He also guided the personnel to uphold the highest standards while performing their duties. Emphasizing the paramount importance of security in public transport systems, he instructed officials to maintain continuous monitoring to prevent any security lapses in the Delhi Metro, which is used by lakhs of commuters daily. He highlighted the need to strengthen human resource capabilities alongside the use of technology. CISF officials stated that the primary objective of this review visit was to further bolster security for the Delhi Metro, a vital public transport system in the national capital. They affirmed that comprehensive security measures would continue to be implemented, with the highest priority accorded to passenger safety in the future.



A New Direction for Financial Inclusion through Jan Dhan Yojana

New Delhi, August 27, Trinet News: The Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, launched by the Central Government with the aim of making financial inclusion accessible to all citizens, has completed 12 years. According to data released by the Union Ministry of Finance, 59.09 crore Jan Dhan accounts have been opened nationwide so far, with total deposits exceeding ₹3.17 lakh crore. Officials stated that the scheme has played a pivotal role in bringing banking services closer to the common people. Statistics reveal a remarkable increase in women's participation among Jan Dhan account holders; the fact that 56 percent of the total accounts are held by women is seen as a testament to women's empowerment. Furthermore, with 78 percent of the accounts located in rural and semi-urban areas, it is evident that banking services have extensively reached rural populations. The scheme has served as a crucial instrument in bringing economically disadvantaged sections into the financial main-



stream. Jan Dhan Yojana has also played a key role in the expansion of digital transactions. The issuance of over 41 crore RuPay cards across the country has made digital payment facilities more accessible to the public. The Central Government noted that the initiative has not only encouraged cashless transactions but also enhanced financial security. The 'JAM Trinity'—formed by the integration of Jan Dhan, Aadhaar, and mobile connectivity—has brought about revolutionary changes in the implementation of welfare schemes. Transpar-

ency has increased with the introduction of a system where government subsidies, financial assistance, and other welfare benefits are credited directly to the beneficiaries' accounts. Officials explained that the intervention of middlemen has been reduced, effectively curbing the diversion of funds. The Central Government has noted that the Jan Dhan Yojana stands as a milestone in expanding banking services nationwide and bringing financial services within reach of the poor, farmers, women, and small business owners. It stated that the scheme has strengthened social security alongside financial empowerment. The Union Ministry of Finance indicated that the Jan Dhan Yojana will continue to play a pivotal role in further expanding financial inclusion and strengthening the digital economy. Officials expressed optimism that the scheme would continue to lay a strong foundation for the country's economic development, starting from rural areas.

Nara Lokesh, the State Minister for Education, IT, Electronics, and RTGS, held a review meeting with officials regarding the safety of pilgrims from Andhra Pradesh stranded in the massive floods in Nepal. He gathered details on the situation of pilgrims from the Telugu states in the flood-affected areas and discussed safety meas-

ures with the officials. He instructed them to gather information regularly, keeping in mind the anxiety of the pilgrims' family members. Officials informed the Minister that, according to reports from the Andhra Pradesh Bhavan in Delhi, four of the stranded pilgrims had been confirmed safe; they have been moved to safer locations and are receiving necessary assistance. Officials stated that they are continuously monitoring the situation and gathering further details. However, officials reported to the Minister that the whereabouts of Bala Subrahmanyam (from the Kuppam region) and Shashikumar and Rajyalakshmi (from the Isha Foundation group) remain unknown.

State-of-the-art Medical Facilities Bolster Services

Rathnakar, Managing Trustee of the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust, inaugurated several advanced medical and training facilities at the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences (Prashanthi Gram). The newly launched facilities include an Orthotics and Re-

habilitation Center, a Tissue Banking and Orthobiologics Center, a Dry Bone and Simulation Lab, and advanced C-arm and mobile X-ray units. Rathnakar stated that these new facilities would not only expand the scope of state-of-the-art medical services but also strengthen the provision of free healthcare. The Orthotics Center will utilize 3D technology to manufacture and provide customized assistive devices to both children and adults free of charge. At the 'Bone School,' or-

The Tissue Banking and Orthobiologics Center will offer free treatments such as bone allografts, amniotic membrane applications, PRP, and PRF. The C-arm unit will facilitate real-time imaging during surgeries, while mobile X-ray services will be utilized in emergency departments, ICUs, and wards. Comprehensive Measures to Prevent Maternal and Infant Deaths



Puttaparthi, August 27: District Collector A. Shyam Prasad has directed the Medical and Health Department, along with other relevant departments, to coordinate and implement comprehensive measures to prevent maternal and infant deaths in Sri Sathya Sai district. A review meeting was held at the Collectorate regarding maternal deaths recorded between April and July 2026. He instructed officials to



administer FCM injections to anemic pregnant women, conduct TIF-A scans for high-risk pregnancies, and perform 2D-Echo tests for those requiring them. He also directed that pregnant women with low body weight be provided with special nutritional food and double rations through the ICDS. He advised that the health and past pregnancy details of every expectant mother be recorded on a digital platform and that doctors

spend at least 10 minutes providing consultations during OPD visits. Furthermore, he ordered the conduct of extensive awareness programs in both rural and urban areas regarding the risks associated with child marriages and teenage pregnancies. The Collector instructed an expert committee to thoroughly analyze the recorded maternal death cases and implement preventive measures to ensure such incidents do not recur. He also urged the public to make effective use of PMSMA medical camps. DMHO Dr. Firoza Begum, DCHS Madhusudhan, DIO Chenna Reddy, gynecologists, pediatricians, and ICDS officials participated in the meeting.

Resolution for '22A' and 'Chukkala Bhumi' Issues Within 40 Days



MLA Palle Sindhura Reddy Bukkapatnam, August 27 Trinet News: Puttaparthi MLA Palle Sindhura Reddy conducted a special *Gram Sabha* in Krishnapuram Panchayat with the aim of finding a permanent solution to farmers' land-related issues. During the meeting, the MLA, former Minister Dr. Palle Raghunatha Reddy, and RDO Suvarna received petitions regarding land problems from the farmers. Farmers brought to the MLA's attention that out of the total land in Krishnapuram Panchayat, over 4,000 acres are affected, with approximately 1,157 acres classified under the '22A' cate-



gory and another 1,000 acres designated as 'Chukkala Bhumi' (disputed/ambiguous land status). The MLA directed revenue officials to provide a permanent resolution to these issues within 40 days and suggested implementing a special action plan to spare farmers the trouble of making repeated rounds of government offices. A farmer named Venkataramana expressed his gratitude after the MLA took special initiative during the *Gram Sabha* to resolve a '22A' land issue that had remained pending for 15 years. The MLA stated that her primary objective is to fill the 193 tanks

and two reservoirs in the constituency with water. She assured that efforts would be made to supply water from the Krishna River system to both the upstream and downstream tanks in Krishnapuram Panchayat. He also stated that measures are being taken to bring large-scale industries and investments to the constituency, thereby creating employment and livelihood opportunities for the youth. Former Minister Palle Raghunatha Reddy mentioned that officials are working sincerely to resolve farmers' issues in accordance with the regulations. Digital Identification for Autos via QR Codes



Kadiri, August 27Trinet News:District SP S. Satish Kumar (IPS) announced the implementation of a QR code-based digital identification system for auto-rickshaws to further enhance passenger safety. On Thursday, the SP distributed digital ID cards and QR code stickers to 250 auto drivers in Kadiri. He explained that scanning the QR



code provides access to details about the driver and vehicle, as well as services such as live location tracking, the nearest police station, emergency calling, and a complaint facility. autos in Kadiri, and the process is ongoing in Dharmavaram and Hindupur. AIYF lashes out at medical mafia in Anantapur.



Anantapur, August 27 Trinet News: The AIYF has demanded immediate action regarding the violation of regulations by medical shops, RMP clinics, scanning centers, and diagnostic labs in Anantapur city. A representation to this effect was submitted to the DMHO and the Drug Inspector. Medicines are being sold indiscriminately without doctors' prescriptions. There is rampant overcharging for services like CT scans, MRIs, ultrasound, 2D-Echo, and X-rays, with a complete lack of price regulation. Unqualified RMPs are endangering lives with substandard medical practices and are selling abortion pills and injections. Our key demands include: immediate inspections of all RMP and private clinics in the city; verification of RMP licenses

and a comprehensive inquiry into their qualifications; registration of criminal cases against RMPs who administer IV fluids and injections without proper qualifications; and the cancellation of licenses for medical agencies that sell medicines without prescriptions. Orders must be issued mandating the public display of rate charts at diagnostic labs and scanning centers to curb the exploitation caused by exorbitant pricing. Instances of private hospitals charging common people as

much as ₹30,000 for just ten minutes of medical care amount to daylight robbery; a special vigilance inquiry must be conducted into this matter. Officials need to recognize the corruption taking place under the guise of medical treatment. A special drive against the "medical mafia" must be carried out across the city. Under the banner of the AIYF, we urge the District Medical and Health Officer (DMHO) to immediately investigate these issues and take appropriate action. CM Reviews Mir Alam Tank Development

the lake to attract tourists. He directed that the islands located in the middle of the lake be developed attractively and transformed into special tourist hubs. Given the area's proximity to the international airport, he ordered its development in a manner that appeals to visitors from both within the country and abroad. Senior officials from the Musi Riverfront Development Corporation, Hyderabad Metro Water Works, and municipal departments participated in the Chief Minister's surprise visit. With the CM clearly instructing that the project works be completed within the stipulated deadline and their progress reviewed regularly, it appears likely that the pace of the project will accelerate.



Massive Nepal Disaster Shakes the Himalayas



Tri Net News, August 27: Massive flash floods have wreaked unprecedented havoc in the Nepal-Tibet border region. A torrent of water, mud, and rocks—triggered by the collapse of a massive glacier in the Himalayas—surged through the basins of the Bhote Koshi and Trishuli rivers. According to the latest reports, the death toll has reached between 165 and 168, while officials estimate that 1,300 to 1,500 people remain missing. This marks one of the most devastating natural disasters in Nepal’s recent history. The calamity struck around 8:40 AM (local time) on Wednesday. Although officials initially suspected an earthquake, subsequent assessments confirmed that the event was a massive debris flow caused by a glacier collapse. Thousands of tons of ice, rocks, and soil rushed into the valleys, causing river levels to surge suddenly and inundate downstream areas. CCTV footage showing a wall of mud and water—rising as high as multi-story buildings—surging forward illustrates the severity of the disaster. The districts of Rasuwa, Nuwakot, and Dhading have been the most severely affected. Several villages have been completely flattened. At least 19 bridges and over 40 kilometers of roads have been washed away. Power supplies have been disrupted due to the destruction of hydroelectric projects, and communication systems have failed in many areas. Officials reported that some villages have completely lost contact with the outside world. Thousands of families have been left homeless. A large number of foreign tourists and Kailash Mansarovar pilgrims are among the missing. According to Nepali officials, the whereabouts of hundreds of foreigners remain unknown; the list of the missing includes citizens from India, the US, the UK, Australia, South Korea, Canada, and Malaysia. While India’s Ministry of External Affairs is closely monitoring the situation, the Indian Embassy in Nepal has established emergency assistance centers. Nepal’s Foreign Minister revealed that approximately 300 Indians are among the missing. Relief operations in the affected areas are proceeding on a war footing. The Nepal Army, police, and disaster management teams are conducting search operations with the help of helicopters and drones. So far, hundreds of people have been evacuated to safety. However, thick mud, damaged roads, and ongoing rains are severely hampering relief operations. Officials believe that people may still be trapped under the debris in several areas. The impact of this disaster has not



been limited to Nepal alone; casualties have also been reported across the border in Tibet. Chinese authorities have deployed hundreds of rescue personnel. The United Nations, the Red Cross, and various nations have stepped forward to provide emergency assistance. While Chinese President Xi Jinping has ordered the acceleration of relief efforts, the Nepalese government is seeking international cooperation. Meanwhile, scientists are warning of another potential danger. They noted that a massive barrier of soil and rocks, formed following the glacier collapse, is still obstructing the river’s flow; if this barrier were to suddenly give way, it could trigger a secondary flood. Consequently, high alerts have been issued in Nepal as well as in the Indian border states of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. Experts warn that glaciers in the Himalayan region are melting rapidly due to climate change, increasing the likelihood of such disasters in the future. Studies indicate that a combination of glacial instability, heavy rainfall, and rising temperatures is turning the Himalayan region into a danger zone. Environmental experts view this disaster in Nepal as yet another warning from nature to the world. At present, a pall of gloom has descended across Nepal. As family members anxiously await news of the missing, rescue teams continue their efforts to search for survivors amidst the debris. Concern is mounting across the country as officials indicate that the death toll is likely to rise. This disaster is set to go down in history as one of the most tragic natural calamities in the Himalayan region.

Chief Minister Calls on Governor

The people of the state also hope that the Governor recovers quickly and resumes his normal duties. Hospital sources stated that his health condition is currently being monitored by doctors.

Tension in Warangal Following Harish Rao's Arrest



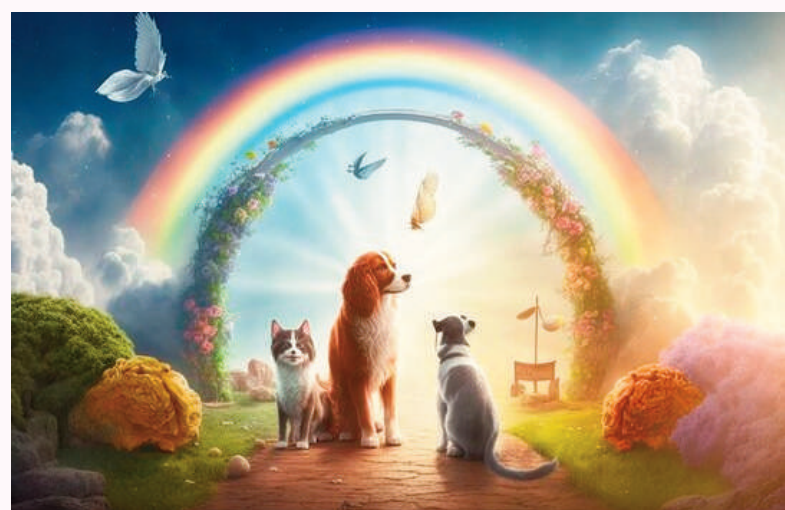
Trinet News : BRS MLA and former minister Tanniru Harish Rao was taken into custody by the Subedari police in Hanamkonda district on Thursday. Along with him, several other BRS leaders—including former minister Errabelli Dayakar Rao and former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar—were also arrested. This incident sparked political tension across the Warangal-Hanamkonda region. Harish Rao had visited the Hanamkonda District Collectorate to express solidarity with government em-

Police went on high alert after receiving information that he intended to proceed from there to a protest being held by Polytechnic college students near Warangal’s MGM Hospital. Be Vigilant Against Quacks: Sajjanar

Stating that the Hyderabad Police are committed to safeguarding public health, he mentioned that special surveillance has been established recently to take action against such individuals in the city. Sajjanar revealed that 12 quacks were identified during special inspections and legal action has been taken against them. He warned that individuals lacking any medical qualifications or even basic medical knowledge are posing as doctors and putting people's health at risk. He noted that these quacks indiscriminately administer an-

tibiotics, steroids, and medications for blood pressure and diabetes to patients, and also administer unnecessary injections and IV fluids. He cautioned that such practices pose a severe risk of damaging vital organs like the lungs, heart, and kidneys. People were advised to verify whether clinics and hospitals possess an official registration certificate issued by the District Medical and Health Officer (DMHO) before seeking treatment. It was also stated that the doctor's name, educational qualifications, and Telangana State Medical Council (TSMC) registration number must be clearly displayed on the signage. It was noted that if there are doubts regarding a doctor's qualifications, one can verify the details by entering the doctor's

name or registration number on the official TSMC website; if the details do not appear there, the individual should be considered an unqualified practitioner. People were advised to seek a second opinion from another qualified doctor if they have concerns about the treatment method or the staff's conduct. Sajjanar urged the public to immediately report any information regarding the activities of quacks (fake doctors) by dialing 112 or contacting the nearest police station. He emphasized that the Hyderabad Police would continue to take stringent measures to safeguard public health and lives, noting that such fraudsters can be completely curbed only with the cooperation of the public.

Mass Protest for BC Rights



Hyderabad, August 27 Trinet News: Former Minister V. Srinivas Goud attended the mass protest (Maha Dharna) organized for the rights of Backward Classes (BCs) at Indira Park in Hyderabad as the chief guest. Addressing the gathering, he raised several key issues regarding BC rights and welfare, presenting specific demands to both the Central and State governments. He expressed the view that a specialized mechanism is required to implement welfare programs for BCs and urged governments to work with a commitment to the upliftment of BC communities. Telangana BC Welfare Association President Erra Satyanarayana, BC association leaders Gujja Krishna, Gopi, and Mahipal, along with representatives from various BC organizations, participated in this massive protest. The leaders made it clear that they would intensify the struggle to secure the rights of BCs.

Government Prioritizes Education and Healthcare Sectors: Minister



Trinet News : State Minister for Revenue, Housing, and Information, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, stated that the people's government in Telangana, led by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, is placing special emphasis on strengthening the education and healthcare sectors. On Thursday, he laid the foundation stone for the construction of primary school classrooms in Gopalapuram (under the Erragadda Gram Panchayat limits in Tirumalayapalem Mandal) at a cost of ₹30 lakh. During the 'Haritha Haram' (green drive) program held on this occasion, the Minister planted saplings alongside District Collector Diwakar TS, officials, teachers, and students. Speaking at the subsequent meeting, he noted that the government is prioritizing the creation of infrastructure in educational institutions. He stated that the goal is to strengthen government schools and provide better educational opportunities

for students. Criticizing the previous administration for neglecting development and welfare, the Minister said that the Congress government—formed with the people's mandate—has been implementing numerous welfare and development programs over the past two and a half years. He highlighted that, compared to the past, funds allocated to the education and healthcare sectors have been increased two to three-fold. He explained that the government is constructing hospitals and recruiting doctors and staff to reduce the financial burden on the public. The Minister stated that a Skill Development University has been established to strengthen technical education. He noted that the government is working to boost employment and livelihood opportunities for the youth by prioritizing technical education and providing skill training. He emphasized that the youth are

the primary driving force behind the state's development. He mentioned that substantial loans have been sanctioned to self-help groups over the past two and a half years to foster women's economic empowerment. Reaffirming the government's commitment to farmers' welfare, he stated that the 'Indiramma Houses' scheme is being implemented in a phased manner. He advised all eligible individuals to apply for pensions by the 31st of this month. On this occasion, Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy extended advance Rakhi festival greetings to the women present at the event, as well as to all the women and girls of the Palair constituency and the entire state. Local public representatives, Congress party leaders and activists, officials, and a large number of villagers participated in the program.

Comprehensive Action Plan for Traffic Management

Hyderabad, August 27 Trinet News: State Chief Secretary Sanjay Jaju directed officials to prepare a comprehensive action plan to control traffic congestion and prevent road accidents in Hyderabad city and along the Outer Ring Road. Following instructions from Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, a high-level meeting was held at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Telangana State Secretariat on Thursday to extensively review traffic management and road safety. Discussions covered topics such as road safety, traffic signal maintenance, identification of accident-prone areas, and the creation of rapid routes for emergency services. The Chief Secretary advised strengthening traffic signaling systems across all cities, district headquarters, municipalities, urban areas, and along the Outer Ring Road. He ordered departments—including Municipal, Police, and Transport—to work in coordination and implement measures to prevent road accidents. Sanjay Jaju stated that traffic management and road safety do not fall under the purview of a single department; rather, the Police, Transport, Roads & Buildings, Municipal Administration,

and Urban Development departments need to work in coordination. He suggested conducting a study on establishing a comprehensive traffic data platform to consolidate and analyze traffic information from various areas. He also directed officials to prepare proposals for setting up a dedicated "TG-TMARS" system for traffic management and road safety. He advised modernizing traffic signaling systems across the state, strengthening electronic enforcement mechanisms, and implementing road safety measures in accordance with Supreme Court guidelines. He ordered strict action to curb footpath encroachments. Officials explained that there are currently 429 traffic signaling systems within the GHMC limits and that modern signal control technology is being utilized. The Chief Secretary suggested formulating a comprehensive plan to use Artificial Intelligence-based technology to make traffic management more efficient and road travel safer. He emphasized that technology should be utilized not only to detect traffic violations but also to provide the public with a faster, safer, and more comfort-



able travel experience. He directed that permanent solutions to traffic problems be found through data-driven and technology-based approaches. It was decided at the meeting to study modern technologies related to AI-based traffic management and road safety and to implement pilot projects in suitable areas across the state. Officials stated that the results of these pilot projects would be evaluated, and the initiatives would subsequently be expanded statewide in a phased manner. Senior officials, including DGP C.V. Anand, Special Chief Secretary (Transport, Roads & Buildings) Vikas Raj, Transport Commissioner Ilambarithi, Malkajgiri Municipal Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy, and Hyderabad City Police Commissioner V.C. Sajjanar, participated in the meeting.



Pension application deadline should be extended by 30 days

Hyderabad,Chikkadapally, trinet NEWS, August 27 : TDP National Publicity Secretary J. Dasharath has demanded that the government extend the application deadline for the new pensions to be provided to the poor under the Cheyutha scheme in Telangana by another month. Speaking at a press conference held in Nallakunta on Thursday, he said that there is a delay in issuing the necessary certificates to the differently-abled, handloom weavers, geetha workers, widows and single women, and they have to go around the offices. The Congress government, which had promised to provide social security to every eligible person during the elections, has now suggested that the applications of the poor should be accepted at the field level and new pensions should be provided to the eligible ones. He demanded that the authorities take note of this and extend the application deadline and also sanction new old age pensions.

Kavitha Makes Sensational Allegations Against BRS



Kadiri, August 26, Trinet News: Kalvakuntla Kavitha, President of the Telangana Rakshana Sena (TRS), launched a scathing attack on the BRS, the Congress government, and certain prominent leaders during a press conference held at the party office in Banjara Hills. Responding to current political developments in Telangana, she alleged that some leaders are conspiring internally to seize control of the BRS party. She revealed receiving information about attempts to sideline a leader like KCR and gain absolute control over the party. She further alleged that discussions concerning party succession and future strategies had occurred during recent meetings with MLAs from Medak district.Levelling various financial and political allegations against Harish Rao, Kavitha remarked that he had maintained extensive business ties with certain private entities during his tenure as a minister. She demanded a government inquiry into business dealings involving educational institutions and corporate hospitals. She also raised suspicions regarding certain meetings said to have taken place in London, stating that her party would gradually bring the details behind them to

the public's attention. She urged the Chief Minister to conduct an inquiry and reveal the facts if, indeed, no political or financial agreements had been made. She emphasized that the public deserves to know the reasons why those who would normally engage in mutual political criticism are remaining silent.Kavitha also leveled strong criticism against Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. She alleged that the administration is not aligned with the aspirations of the people of Telangana and that the government has failed to respond to several key issues concerning the state's interests. She stated that the government is not fighting adequately for matters such as the allocation of Krishna river waters, job opportunities, appointments in various state institutions, and the rights due to Telangana. She criticized the government for making decisions that run counter to the spirit of the Telangana movement and noted a growing public perception that other issues are being prioritized over the interests of the state's people. She urged the Chief Minister to take a firmer stand regarding Telangana's rights.Kavitha also expressed deep dissatisfaction with the BRS party. She remarked that the public rejected the BRS due to corruption, family rule, and dynastic politics.Kavitha also raised several issues concerning social justice, the rights of Backward Classes (BCs), and the interests of locals in Telangana. She criticized major political parties for failing to accord adequate political prominence to the BCs. She demanded that priority be given to locals in the state's various boards and corporations. She emphasized that governance should align with the aspirations of the people who fought for the Telangana movement. She suggested that the primary objectives of governments should be providing employment opportunities for the youth, assurance to farmers, safety for women, and equitable opportunities for backward sections. She called upon the people to support politics that uphold Telangana's self-respect.Kalvakuntla Kavitha clarified that their goal is to strengthen the 'Telangana Rakshana Sena' as an alternative political force. She stated that their party would work towards corruption-free governance, accountability, and a transparent political system. Governments Should Focus on the Rights of BCs

Retired DGP Purnachandra Rao, Jana Sena State spokesperson Mulikuntla Sagar, former MLA and senior Congress leader Eeravathri Anil, Handloom Corporation Chairman Guduri Srinivas, Handicrafts Corporation Chairman Venkatraman, BC Times President Surya Rao, Jana Adhikara Samithi President Chirala Narayana, General Secretary Krishnamurthy, Treasurer Keerthi Nagarjuna, and members Parikipandla Sumanth, Parikipandla Ram, Titla Ramesh Babu, Mittapalli Rajendra Kumar, Jagiri Srikanth, Guna Sagar Netha and Mugala Mahesh Patel, among others, participated in the book launch. Speaking on the occasion, Narahari called upon members of the Padmashali community, particularly BCs, to enter politics. In view of the ongoing delimitation process, he suggested that governments be urged to provide one-third reservation for BCs in legislative bodies, or alternatively restore the earlier system of dual-member constituencies. He called upon Padmashali sarpanches to work with the ambition of emerging as strong political leaders and entering legislative bodies in the future. He also expressed confidence that Telangana would



have a BC Chief Minister. Narahari said he was happy to felicitate Padmashali sarpanches who had emerged victorious despite intense competition. Jana Adhikara Samithi President Chirala Narayana said IAS officer Parikipandla Narahari had been working for the advancement of BC communities for the past decade and that the organisation was working towards social awareness under his guidance. Former DGP Purnachandra Rao called for a grass-roots movement demanding that the Modi government halt the Census until a separate caste code is provided for BCs. He suggested using social media as a platform for the campaign and urged BCs to question governments with the fighting spirit demonstrated by Konda Laxman Babuji. Chiranjeevulu said that of India's population of 140 crore, around 80 crore belonged to OBC communities. He appreciated Narahari for writing “OBCila Porubata-2”, which, he said, provides a comprehensive understanding of the conditions, aspirations and rights of OBCs. He said the book discusses several issues, including reservations for OBCs in legislative bodies, increasing reservations in local body elections to 67 per cent, providing representation in higher education and employment in proportion to population, and implementing EWS reservations through a scientific approach. The book also focuses on achieving the goals of BC communities, securing their participation in political power, strengthening leadership and moving forward in unity. Former MLA Eeravathri Anil said the Congress government had conducted a caste survey by assigning codes to BC communities, providing greater clarity about the population of different social groups. He said the Congress government had fulfilled its promise to the people and urged the Central government to conduct a caste census and fulfil its commitments to BCs. Later, 165 Padmashali sarpanches were felicitated with garlands and shawls and presented with mementos. BC Welfare Association National Vice-President Gujja Satyam, Telangana Vittal, Tholi Velugu Raghu, BC Samaj Honorary President Vijay Kumar, State Secretary Manikar Vijay and several others participated in the programme.
