

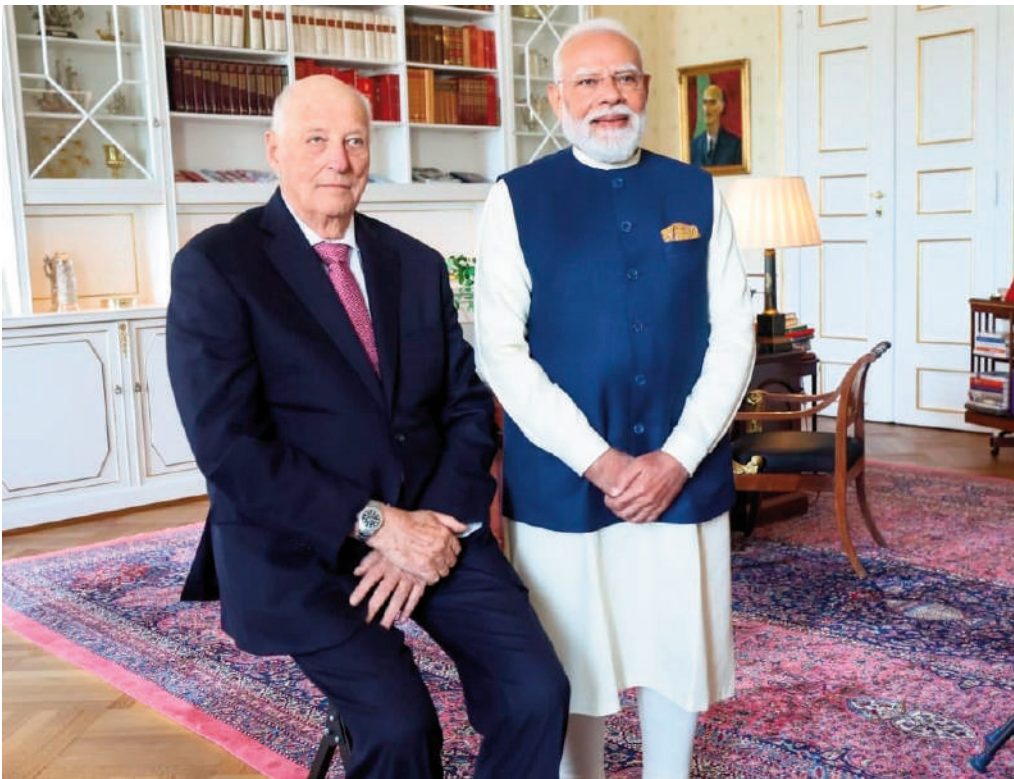

IMS Buildings for Women's Empowerment



August 28 Tri net: Construction work on the Indira Mahila Shakti (IMS) buildings—a prestigious initiative by the Telangana government aimed at the economic development of rural women, expanding self-employment opportunities, and strengthening women's groups—has reached its final stage. Designed to provide permanent infrastructure for women's self-help groups across the state, this project will soon be accessible to the public. Under the directives of Minister Smt. Danasari Seethakka, the Telangana Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department is expediting arrangements for the inauguration. The government is preparing to have these buildings inaugurated by Chief Minister Sri A. Revanth Reddy. These buildings have been specially designed to facilitate the operations of women's self-help groups more effectively. Comprehensive facilities are being provided to ensure that essential training programs, meetings, business development activities, product exhibitions, and

marketing opportunities are available at a single location. The government states that the primary objective of these centers is to create markets for products made by women, enhance business skills, and enable them to seize new opportunities. The buildings currently being constructed under the aegis of SERP are set to become major hubs for the economic activities of women's groups. One building, spanning approximately 15,000 square feet, is being constructed in each of the state's 22 districts. The total project cost is estimated at around ₹110 crore. With construction—supervised by the Panchayat Raj Engineering Department—nearing completion, the government is now focusing on inauguration plans. Officials stated that these buildings are being developed as assets belonging to the women's groups, rather than merely as government offices. A special mechanism is being devised to entrust the responsibility of managing these facilities to the respective District Federations. This will enable women's groups

to utilize the buildings according to their specific needs. The government is also preparing a comprehensive action plan covering aspects such as maintenance, usage, and the generation of revenue streams. Minister Seethakka emphasized that the development of women's groups is a key priority for the Telangana government. She noted that the economic empowerment of women leads to the progress of families, villages, and society at large. She stated that the 'Indira Mahila Shakti' buildings would serve as platforms to unlock women's potential and open up new opportunities for rural women. She expressed confidence that these centers would play a pivotal role in accelerating women's empowerment. These IMS buildings, constructed at the district level, will serve as permanent bases for the activities of women's groups. By providing facilities to conduct training, production, marketing, and financial activities under one roof, they will give a significant boost to the economic self-reliance of women. The government has announced that, immediately upon the completion of construction work, these facilities will be inaugurated by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and made available to women's groups. Officials express optimism that this marks the beginning of a new chapter for women's empowerment in Telangana.

The Medical Department was advised to properly record details of road accident victims at hospitals. The Collector and SP emphasized that the Police, Transport, Roads and Buildings, National Highways, Medical, and Education departments must work in coordination.

Drug Trafficking Must Be Completely Curbed

District-level officials from the Police, Transport, NHAI, R&B, and Medical & Health departments, along with DTO Karuna Sagar, participated in the meeting.

We Will Provide Drinking Water to Every Household: MLA Paritala Sunitha



Anantapur, August 28, Trinet News : Raptadu MLA Paritala Sunitha stated that measures are being taken to supply drinking water to every household in every colony of the Anantapur Rural Mandal. On Friday, she inaugurated two health centers—built at a cost of ₹80 lakh—in Kakkalapalli Colony and Papampet Basavataraka Nagar. Accompanied by officials and local leaders, she inaugurated the 'Ayushman

Arogya Mandir' in Kakkalapalli (built with ₹38.15 lakh from 15th Finance Commission funds) and a hospital in Papampet (built with ₹42 lakh from Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat funds). Locals accorded a grand welcome to MLA Sunitha on the occasion. Afterward, she underwent blood pressure and blood sugar tests at the hospital. Sunitha explained that these health centers were estab-



lished with the aim of providing medical services to the public locally. She noted that, under the directives of Chief Minister Chandrababu, they are completing projects that had been left unfinished by the previous government. She detailed that development works worth ₹6 crore were undertaken in the two panchayats over the past two years, and works worth approximately ₹100 crore were carried out across the rural mandal. She mentioned that projects to supply drinking water to every colony at a cost of ₹40 crore under the 'Jal Jeevan Mission' have been initiated, and action was taken to release pending bills after bringing the matter to the attention of Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan. The MLA affirmed that efforts are underway to ensure drinking water reaches every household by the coming summer. She emphasized that they are demonstrating development through actions rather than mere

Public Distribution System Should Continue Under the Old Method



Puttaparthi/Kothacheruvu, August 28 Trinet News: Under the aegis of the Sri Sathya Sai District Ration Shop Dealers' Association, a representation was submitted to the Puttaparthi RDO on Friday, requesting that the Public Distribution System (PDS) continue using the old method. They stated that the QR code system introduced by the Civil Supplies Department within the ePOS (Electronic Point of Sale) framework causes significant difficulties for dealers; therefore, they urged for its cancellation and a return to the previous procedure. A formal representation to this effect was handed over to Puttaparthi RDO Suvarna at her office. They explained that assigning the QR code process—which should ideally be completed at MLS (Mandal Level Stock) points—to dealers via ePOS increases their workload. Furthermore, the lack of clear guidelines regarding this process creates difficulties for dealers who are unfamiliar with it. They also noted that continuing the QR code process during the actual distribution phase would slow down operations, leading to beneficiary dissatisfaction; hence, they requested the RDO to reconsider this system. They urged the authorities to issue orders ensuring the QR code process (specifically the 'gate-out' or weight verification) is completed at the MLS points and to take measures to ensure PDS operations proceed using the old method starting September 1st. A similar representation was also submitted to Puttaparthi Tahsildar Samhita. Ration shop dealers from the mandal participated in these events.

IMS Buildings for Women's Empowerment



Tri Net News, August 28: Hyderabad, August 28: Construction work on the Indira Mahila Shakti (IMS) buildings—a prestigious initiative by the Telangana government aimed at the economic development of rural women, expanding self-employment opportunities, and strengthening women's groups—has reached its final stage. Designed to provide permanent infrastructure for women's self-help groups across the state, this project will soon be accessible to the public. Under the directives of Minister Smt. One building, spanning approximately 15,000 square feet, is being constructed in each of the state's 22 districts. The total project cost is estimated at around ₹110 crore. With construction—supervised by the Panchayat Raj Engineering Department—nearing completion, the government is now focusing on inauguration plans. Officials stated that these buildings are being developed as assets belonging to the women's groups, rather than merely as government offices. A special mechanism is being devised to entrust the responsibility of managing these facilities to the respective District Federations. This will enable women's groups to utilize the buildings according to their specific needs. The government is also preparing a comprehensive action plan covering aspects such as maintenance, usage, and the generation of revenue streams. Minister Seethakka emphasized that the development of women's groups is a key priority for the Telangana government. She noted that the economic empowerment of women leads to the progress of families, villages, and society at large. She stated that the 'Indira Mahila Shakti' buildings would serve as platforms to unlock women's potential and open up new opportunities for rural women. She expressed confidence that these centers would play a pivotal role in accelerating women's empowerment. These IMS buildings, constructed at the district level, will serve as permanent bases for the activities of women's groups. By providing facilities to conduct training, production, marketing, and financial activities under one roof, they will give a significant boost to the economic self-reliance of women. The government has announced that, immediately upon the completion of construction work, these facilities will be inaugurated by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and made available to women's groups. Officials express optimism that this marks the beginning of a new chapter for women's empowerment in Telangana.

Minister Vivek Venkataswamy stated that the objective is to further strengthen the existing friendly ties between Hyderabad and Miyoshi and to forge partnerships that yield tangible results in areas such as skills, technology, education, agriculture, and international employment opportunities. Several senior officials and representatives from both regions participated in the meeting.

Transparent Conduct of 'Indiramma Towers' Lucky Draw

TRI NET NEWS : State Minister for Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, stated that the beneficiary selection process for the 'Indiramma Towers' scheme—launched by the state government to fulfill the homeownership dreams of impoverished families in Hyderabad—is being conducted with utmost transparency. He clarified that the selection process for this scheme, which stands as a symbol of dignity for the poor, is based solely on eligibility, transcending caste, religion, or political affiliations. He revealed that the lucky draw is being conducted in the presence of the media and the public, with the entire process broadcast live via social media. On Friday, lucky draws were held to allocate 'Indiramma Towers' flats for the Nampally, Quthbullapur, Secunderabad, and Rajendranagar constituencies. The Minister personally participated in the events held at Red Hills (Nampally) and Lakshmiguda (Rajendranagar) and conducted the draws. He announced that lucky draws for approximately 8,000 flats across 16 Assembly constituencies would be held from the 28th to the 31st of this month, explaining that the process would proceed at a rate of four constituencies per day. The Minister stated that 600 beneficiaries would be selected for 480 flats in each constituency. He mentioned that officials would conduct a final field-level verifi-



cation following the lucky draw. He revealed that if any selected individuals are found ineligible, the opportunity would be extended to eligible candidates from the additional 120 selected. He noted that the government is taking measures through this process to ensure fairness for truly deserving individuals. The Minister announced a target to construct one lakh houses under the 'Indiramma Towers' initiative in the first phase. He disclosed that site identification has already been completed in four constituencies, with applications being accepted there until September 3rd. He stated that within the first year of the Congress government's tenure, 4.50 lakh Indiramma houses were sanctioned across the state, with construction completed on over two lakh of them. He explained that financial assistance of ₹5 lakh per house is being provided in four installments. The Minister announced that the registration of Indiramma Towers flats for selected beneficiaries would be done at no cost to them. He mentioned that after ten years, ben-

eficiaries would have the option to sell the house, depending on their needs. He also explained that there would be a provision to mortgage the registration documents with a bank to obtain a loan in case of emergencies. He stated that each flat would be built with an area of approximately 525 square feet and would include an undivided land share of 17 to 20 square yards. Minister Ponguleti explained that special reservations are being implemented with a focus on social justice. He stated that reservations are being provided at the rates of 14% for SCs, 5% for STs, 16% for BCs, 5% for persons with disabilities, and 10% for sanitation workers, Class IV employees, and outsourcing staff. He also mentioned that an overall 30% reservation is being implemented for women. The Minister noted that the government is committed to providing homes to the poor in prime locations and that the 'Indiramma Towers' scheme will bring new hope to the lives of thousands of families.

Night shifts also impact dietary habits. Increased hunger at night and the consumption of fast food or high-calorie meals raise the risk of weight gain. Additionally, issues like slowed digestion, gas, and acidity may occur. Irregular meal times negatively affect the body's metabolism. Some studies suggest that night-shift employees may



face a higher risk of chronic conditions, such as heart disease and diabetes. Factors such as sleep deprivation, stress, lack of exercise, and an unbalanced diet increase this risk. Therefore, experts advise night-shift employees to pay special attention to their health. Those working night shifts should cultivate the habit of going to sleep at the same time every day. It is advisable to keep the sleeping area quiet and dark. One should consume a diet rich in fruits, vegetables, and proteins. Staying hydrated and exercising regularly are also essential. It is best to limit the intake of caffeinated beverages like coffee and tea. Overall, while night-shift jobs are a part of modern lifestyles, their impact on health should not be ignored. Health experts suggest that many health issues associated with night shifts can be mitigated by ensuring adequate sleep, a balanced diet, and a disciplined lifestyle.

Keep Ginger-Garlic Paste Fresh for Six Months

trinet NEWS, August 28 : Many people prepare ginger-garlic paste—a kitchen staple—in advance and store it. However, within a few days, issues like the paste turning black, losing its flavor, or diminishing in aroma often arise. Culinary experts state that the primary reasons for this are adding water during preparation and improper storage. Ginger and garlic should be washed thoroughly and allowed to dry completely before being ground. Do not add any water while making the paste; instead, adding a little cooking oil and grinding it into a smooth paste helps it stay fresh for a longer period. Adding a little salt further enhances its shelf life. Transfer the prepared paste into a completely dry glass jar. Sealing the lid tightly to prevent air and moisture from entering and storing it in the refrigerator helps maintain its quality over time. Experts advise using a dry spoon every time you scoop out the paste. By preparing and storing it this way, the ginger-garlic paste can remain fresh, retaining its taste and aroma for several months. However, experts suggest that the shelf life depends on hygiene, refrigerator temperature, and usage practices, and advise against consuming the product if changes in odor or color are observed.

name of national security. There is insufficient discussion regarding the environmental impact of conducting nuclear tests. Whether conducted underground, at sea, or in the atmosphere, nuclear testing causes severe damage to the natural world. Initiatives like the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty have offered a glimmer of hope; however, the expected results have not yet materialized, largely because not all nations have responded in a unified manner. Their efforts need to be further strengthened. A look at the current global political landscape reveals escalating wars, border disputes, and geopolitical tensions in various regions.
