

Boost to India-Argentina Trade Ties

Trinet news New Buenos Aires, August 29: A significant step has been taken to further strengthen the strategic and economic partnership between India and Argentina. During the fourth meeting of the India-Argentina Joint Trade Committee (JTC), led by Indian Commerce Secretary Rajesh Agrawal, both nations agreed to expand mutual cooperation. They decided to bolster partnerships in trade, investments, critical minerals, and technology. Lithium and energy sectors emerged as key topics of discussion during the meeting. India expressed keen interest in enhancing cooperation with Argentina regarding lithium reserves, which are crucial for electric vehicles and battery manufacturing.



Centre Clarifies CBG Price Revision

- Clarification: No heavy burden on consumers- Stable price support for producers
- New pricing mechanism under the GOBAR-Dhan scheme
- Consumer protection through government subsidy

New Delhi, August 29, Trinet news : New Delhi, August 29: The Central Government has issued a clarification regarding news reports suggesting that the revision of Compressed Biogas (CBG) prices under the GOBAR-Dhan scheme would impose a heavy burden on CNG and PNG consumers. It stated that the revised pricing mechanism was designed to support producers while simultaneously safeguarding consumer interests. Under the existing system, the price paid to CBG producers is determined based on 85% of the CNG retail price; based on current calculations, this stands at approximately ₹1,478 per MMBTU. With the price under the GOBAR-Dhan scheme now set at ₹2,110 per MMBTU, CBG producers receive a price increase of approximately 43%.However, the Centre clarified that this entire cost would not be passed on directly to CNG or domestic PNG consumers. The government will provide financial support of ₹10 per kilogram as part of the price paid to CBG producers. It explained that this

amount is equivalent to approximately ₹215 per MMBTU for CBG with 95% methane content. After deducting the government support, the effective cost of CBG passed on to consumers would be approximately ₹1,895 per MMBTU. It stated that this represents an increase of only about 28 percent compared to the current ₹1,478, and clarified that the full extent of the price hike—as speculated in the media—would not be passed on to consumers.The Centre expressed the view that stable pricing is essential for the financial viability of the CBG production sector. It noted that this price revision is crucial for incentivizing farmers,

waste management systems, and biogas plants, adding that it would boost renewable energy production and benefit the rural economy. The Central Government clarified that while the revised pricing policy ensures stable income for CBG producers, measures have been taken—through government financial support and an extensive gas distribution network—to prevent a significant price burden on consumers. It further stated that this policy would play a pivotal role in promoting the use of clean energy across the country.

Call to Youth: Embrace Sports and Fitness

Glacial Outburst Threatens Nepal

August 29 Trinet News: China has once again alerted Nepal regarding the situation of an artificial lake (barrier lake) formed by a glacial collapse along the Nepal-Tibet border. While warning that the natural dam holding back the lake could breach at any moment, China also revealed that, according to the latest assessments, the immediate flood threat has somewhat subsided. Officials stated that although high



alert remains in effect for border areas, the situation is relatively more stable compared to earlier. On Wednesday, a glacial outburst in the high-altitude mountain region caused a massive surge of ice, rocks, and mud to rush downstream. This flow blocked the river's path, creating a natural dam and causing water to accumulate behind it. This development necessitated the issuance of danger warnings for the Gyirong border crossing as well as the Bhote Koshi and Trishuli river basins. The sudden alteration in the river's flow caused significant anxiety among local residents.Chinese officials have conveyed specific information regarding the severity of the situation to Nepal's Ministry of Foreign Affairs. It was reported that the color of the lake water was gradually darkening, a sign interpreted as increasing pressure on the natural dam. By Friday, the estimated volume of water stored in the lake was around 2.5 million cubic meters. Officials explained that if the dam were to partially breach, water could flow at a rate of 500 cubic meters per second, though the flow would likely remain largely within the riverbanks. However, subsequent observations revealed a slight reduction in the lake's surface area. Chinese officials stated in a recent report that this has lowered the immediate risk of flooding. Following this development, some relief operations that had been temporarily suspended for safety reasons were resumed. Nevertheless, experts caution that the situation has not yet fully returned to normal and that continuous monitoring is required.Currently, the lake's condition is being closely monitored using drones, satellite imagery, and land survey equipment. Officials also revealed the identification of another large water storage area upstream of the lake; they are specifically monitoring water movement, the state of ice layers, and changes in the terrain there. Emergency response teams have been kept on standby in border areas to take immediate action should any crisis arise. Meanwhile, this natural disaster has caused immense tragedy in the border regions of Nepal and Tibet. Reports indicate that hundreds of people have lost their lives on both sides due to floods and landslides, with over a thousand people estimated to be missing. Officials revealed that the deceased include foreign tourists and workers. Amidst adverse weather conditions and the risk of further flooding, rescue teams are continuing search and relief operations to assist the victims.

Shocking Incident

Tutor Impregnates Student

- Incident revealed during medical examinations
- 9th-grade girl found to be five months pregnant
- Tutor arrested on charges of sexual assault
- Incident causes a stir in Odisha

August 29, Trinet News: Mayurbhanj, August 29: A shocking incident has come to light in the Mayurbhanj district of Odisha, causing widespread alarm. School authorities and local residents were left stunned when medical examinations revealed that a 9th-grade girl was five months pregnant. Police have arrested the girl's private tutor following allegations of sexual assault. Given the girl's age and the gravity of the incident, the case is considered highly sensitive. Routine health check-ups were conducted this week for female students at the residential school she attends. Dur-

ing these examinations, doctors assessed the girl's health and discovered she was five months pregnant. Upon learning this, the school management immediately alerted the relevant authorities and the girl's parents. The family was deeply distressed upon hearing the unexpected news.When the parents took the girl home and questioned her about the matter, she reportedly revealed the traumatic experience she had endured. She stated that her private tutor had sexually assaulted her by taking advantage of a time when she was alone at home during the summer holidays. It is reported that the girl explained she had not disclosed the incident earlier due to fear, as the accused had threatened her with severe consequences if she revealed what had happened. Upon hearing the girl's account, her family members were outraged. They decided to take immediate action regarding this heinous incident involving the minor girl and lodged a formal complaint with the police on Thursday. The police registered a case upon receiving the complaint and initiated a preliminary investigation, fast-tracking the inquiry based on the girl's health condition, her statement, and the family's complaint.As part of the in-



vestigation, the police detained and arrested the accused—a private tutor—on Friday. They are currently interrogating him to gather full details regarding the incident. Officials stated that they are conducting a thorough investigation by examining the girl's allegations, medical reports, and other evidence. There is a possibility that action will also be taken against the accused under child protection laws. Such incidents heighten concerns regarding the safety of girls in society and trust in the educational environment. Experts emphasize the need for parents, teachers, and school managements to remain vigilant in order to uncover sexual crimes against children. While officials are taking steps to provide the necessary medical and psychological support to the victim, the police have made it clear that strict legal action will be taken against the accused.



Government Committed to Suraram's Development



August 29 Tri net: State Transport and BC Welfare Minister Ponnam Prabhakar stated that the development of villages and the resolution of public grievances are the state government's primary objectives. Participating in the 'Palle Palleku Ponnam Anna – Palle Pallelo Praja Palana' (Ponnam Anna visits every village – People's Governance in every village) program held in Suraram village, Elka-thurthy Mandal, Hanamkonda district, the Minister personally inquired about the villagers' issues. He received representations from the public and directed officials to resolve the grievances immediately. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister highlighted that welfare schemes are being extended to every eligible individual through the 'Praja Palana' initiative. He noted that 26 'Indiramma' houses have been sanctioned for Suraram village and that 475 beneficiaries

are receiving pensions. He further revealed that free electricity up to 200 units has been provided to 665 families and that 158 new ration cards have been sanctioned. He explained that villagers are benefiting from schemes such as the farm loan waiver, 'Rythu Bhara-rosa', and 'Kalyana Lakshmi'. The Minister stated that, in response to requests from the villagers, he has directed officials to examine the feasibility of operating an RTC bus service between Huzurabad and Hanamkonda via Suraram and to take appropriate action. He also assured that priority would be given to infrastructure projects such as the construction of a bridge between Suraram and Poladpalli, the development of village roads, and the improvement of the drainage system. He stated that development programs would be implemented in a phased manner, keeping the village's needs in

mind. The Minister revealed that various development works worth approximately ₹60 lakh have already been undertaken in Suraram village. He added that efforts are underway to complete the remaining works systematically and transform the village into a model one across all sectors. He emphasized that public participation is crucial for rural development and noted that works are being executed in alignment with local requirements. Speaking about the agricultural sector, the Minister advised farmers to focus on cultivating oil palm and crops that require less water (such as *aruthadi* or semi-dry crops). He urged every family to construct rainwater harvesting pits to help conserve groundwater. He mentioned that 1,200 'steel bank kits' were distributed to villagers to reduce plastic usage as part of environmental conservation efforts. He also announced the establishment of an open gym in the village to encourage the youth to adopt a healthy lifestyle. The Minister clarified that the government is taking steps to ensure every eligible person receives a ration card and emphasized that no lobbying or recommendations are required for this process. Furthermore, he advised the public to remain vigilant to ensure that no eligible voter's name is omitted from the electoral roll and urged them to rectify any errors in the list immediately. Minister Ponnam Prabhakar stated that he would always be available to address people's issues and that public welfare is his priority.

Call to Action for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities



Trinet News, August 29: Uppal MLA Bandari Laxma Reddy participated in the "Samara Shankharavam" (Call to Action) meeting organized to advocate for the rights of persons with disabilities and address their grievances. The event was held at the GSR Convention Center in LB Nagar under the leadership of LB Nagar MLA D. Sudheer Reddy, as a protest against the attitude of the Congress government. Bandari Laxma Reddy joined former Minister T. Harish Rao at the meeting and shared his views on the issues faced by persons with disabilities. Speaking on the occasion, the leaders held extensive discussions regarding welfare, rights, employment opportunities, and the government-provided amenities for this community. They emphasized the need for governments to act more responsibly in identifying and resolving the challenges faced by persons with disabilities in society. They also demanded the effective implementation of welfare schemes designed for them. Bandari Laxma Reddy stated clearly that the fight to secure rights for persons with disabilities would continue unabated. He affirmed that their goal is to ensure equal opportunities for everyone in society and highlighted the need to focus specifically on issues related to the education, employment, health, and social security of persons with disabilities. He urged the government to adopt a more positive attitude towards them and implement measures tailored to their specific needs, emphasizing that policy-level decisions are essential to bring about meaningful change in their lives. He addressed party leaders and activists while participating in the BJP Telangana Minority Morcha executive committee meeting held in Mahabubnagar. On this occasion, he explained the schemes and programs being implemented by the Central Government for the development of minorities. Ramchander Rao noted that the Central Government's administration is guided by the principle of "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas" (Together with all, Development for all, Trust of all, Effort of all) advocated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He stated that the government is working towards providing equal opportunities and the fruits of development to every

section of society in the country. He mentioned that numerous programs are being implemented to foster education, employment, and economic progress among minority communities. Criticizing the Congress and certain other parties, he alleged that minorities had previously been used merely as a vote bank. He remarked that decades of appeasement politics failed to bring about the desired changes in the lives of minorities. In contrast, he highlighted that the Modi government is working with a focus on three key areas: welfare, development, and empowerment. Ramachander Rao explained that the Central Government is implementing special schemes to provide education, skill development, and self-employment opportunities to minority youth. He noted that various initiatives have also been undertaken in the areas of women's empowerment, educational support, and social security. He expressed the view that these

measures have boosted confidence among minority communities. He called upon the Minority Morcha to play a pivotal role in further strengthening the BJP in Telangana. He advised them to create public awareness about the Central Government's welfare schemes and to take the party's ideology to the grassroots level. He urged party workers to strive for the party's expansion while maintaining continuous contact with the people. State and district-level leaders, Minority Morcha representatives, and party workers participated in the meeting. Leaders stated that there were extensive discussions regarding future action plans, organizational strengthening, and expanding the party's reach among minority communities. N. Ramachander Rao emphasized that the BJP's goal is to ensure justice for every section of society through comprehensive development.

BRS Criticizes CI's Suspension

Kumar alleged that Jubilee Hills Police Station CI Muthu Yadav was made a scapegoat in the matter concerning Minister Konda Surekha's OSD, Sumanth. Responding to the issue, he stated that the FIR against OSD Su-



manth was not registered precisely because of instructions from senior officials. Speaking to the media in Hyderabad, RS Praveen Kumar demanded that the government clarify the reasons behind suspending only CI Muthu Yadav. He criticized the move, stating it is improper to take action against an officer who merely acted upon the directives of senior officials. He urged for a comprehensive inquiry to bring the facts to light. He alleged that action was taken against the CI only after Chief Minister Revanth Reddy questioned the matter. He demanded an explanation to the public regarding the administrative process that led to this decision. He criticized the move as an attempt to shield the truly responsible parties by penalizing only a single officer. RS Praveen Kumar also called for clarity regarding the roles of the concerned ACP, Venkat Reddy, and other senior officials in this case. He suggested that if there was any negligence in the discharge of duties, action should be taken equally against all officials responsible, not just the CI; he questioned why no action was taken against the ACP and DCP. He opined that transparent decision-making is essential for responsible administration within the police force and stated that consistent standards must be applied when taking action against officials. He warned that failure to do so could lead to uncertainty among the police personnel. The BRS party demanded that the government disclose full details regarding the developments involving Konda Surekha's OSD, Sumanth, and take impartial action against those responsible. RS Praveen Kumar asserted that the government bears the responsibility of addressing the public's doubts regarding this issue.



Harish Rao Questions Congress on Promises Made to Persons with Disabilities

August 29 Trinet News :Former Minister and Siddipet MLA T. Harish Rao criticized the Congress government for its negligence regarding the welfare of persons with disabilities in the state. He alleged that the Revanth Reddy government has failed to implement even a single promise made to this community during the elections. He demanded that the government respond immediately to the issues faced by persons with disabilities and fulfill the assurances given to them. Speaking on the occasion, Harish Rao highlighted the significant priority given to the welfare of persons with disabilities during the BRS government's tenure. He recalled that former Chief Minister KCR had raised the pension for persons with disabilities from Rs. 500 to Rs. 4,016. He also noted that special measures were taken to protect their rights, alongside increasing reservation quotas for them. Harish Rao mentioned that the BRS government had even received a national-level award for the effective implementation of laws concerning persons with disabilities. He criticized the current government for failing to maintain the same level of commitment shown by the previous administration toward their welfare. He urged the government to clarify its stance on the implementation of welfare schemes. Harish Rao alleged that while the Congress had promised to raise the pension for persons with disabilities to Rs. 6,000 during the elections, that promise remained unfulfilled after the party came to power. Stating that the government owes dues to lakhs of differently-abled people in the state, a demand was raised for clarity regarding the pension hike. It was emphasized that the welfare of the differently-abled should not be reduced to mere political promises. Pointing out that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy frequently refers to Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu as his political mentor, the question was raised as to why the Rs. 6,000 pension provided to the differently-abled in Andhra Pradesh is not being implemented in Telangana. A call was made for the government to take an immediate decision regarding the welfare of the differently-abled. Harish Rao alleged that the Congress government has failed to fulfill its promises concerning the Kalyana Lakshmi scheme as well. He recalled that during the BRS regime, the Kalyana Lakshmi assistance for the differently-abled had been increased to Rs. 2 lakh. He criticized the current government for announcing a provision of 'tulam' gold but failing to implement it. Harish Rao demanded that the government announce a clear action plan for the welfare of the differently-abled.



CM's Key Letter Regarding Voter List Revision

August 29 Trinet News: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has made it clear that during the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the 2026 voter list in Telangana, not a single eligible voter's name should be deleted, nor should any ineligible person be included. In a letter addressed to Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar of the Election Commission of India, the Chief Minister urged that measures be taken to ensure transparency, fairness, and public participation in the revision process. Citing Election Commission statistics, the Chief Minister noted that while the state had 3.38 crore voters as of June 10, 2026, approximately 73.39 lakh individuals were identified under categories such as absent, shifted residence, deceased, or having multiple registrations. He expressed concern that 45.19 lakh of these individuals were classified as having permanently shifted residence. He further pointed out significant errors in the digitized enumeration records. The Chief Minister opined that there are critical flaws in the current revision procedure, noting that individuals who happened to be away from home when enumeration staff visited were being classified as having permanently shifted residence. He pointed out that there are instances where voters' names are being removed from the rolls in their old areas without providing adequate assistance for them to register in their new locations. He noted that the official notification process is not being fully adhered to. Consequently, the Chief Minister expressed concern that many voters might discover their names are missing from the list only on polling day, describing this as a violation of the principles of natural justice. He explained that there is a high incidence of cases involving absent, relocated, deceased, or duplicate voters, particularly in the Hyderabad, Medchal-Malkajgiri, and Ranga Reddy districts. He highlighted that voters in urban areas are likely to face difficulties due to factors such as employment, marriage, and temporary changes in residence. Since there are no elections scheduled in the state in the immediate future, the Chief Minister suggested allocating more time to conduct a comprehensive revision of the voter list. He requested a four-week extension to the current deadline for filing objections and complaints, which is set to expire on September 16. He also advised conducting extensive publicity campaigns in villages and municipal wards and making draft lists accessible to the public through Gram Sabhas and ward committee meetings. The Chief Minister urged that the current timeframe is insufficient for daily wage earners, migrant workers, and the elderly to submit their documents, requesting an extension of at least three to four weeks. He further suggested establishing special assistance centers in urban areas to raise awareness regarding the necessary documentation. In his letter, the Chief Minister clarified that the state government is fully prepared to provide the necessary administrative support—including the organization of Gram Sabhas and the establishment of help centers—to ensure the voter list revision process is conducted smoothly and transparently.

Telangana's Grand Plan for Golf Tourism

August 29 Trinet News: Minister for Tourism, Culture, and Archaeology Jupally Krishna Rao stated that the state government is taking key measures to transform Telangana into a world-class golf tourism hub. He announced plans to establish an international-standard golf course spanning 130 acres in Jawahar-nagar, near Shameerpet. Additionally, he mentioned that plans are being prepared to develop another world-class golf course at Somasila, located along the banks of the Krishna River. He noted that these projects aim to attract both professional and amateur golfers from within the country and abroad. The Minister explained that the proposed golf course at Somasila would be developed along the Krishna River, amidst the Nallamala forest region and near the Amrabad Tiger Reserve. He remarked that the area has the potential to emerge as a unique golf tourism destination that blends natural beauty, sports, and tourism. He stated that the project would be developed under a public-private partnership model and expressed optimism that Somasila would gain distinct recognition in the realm of golf tourism, backed by world-class infrastructure. The Minister revealed these details at a press conference regarding the 12th Telangana Golconda Masters tournament, held at the Hyderabad Golf Club. He stated that the tournament is being jointly organized by the DP World Professional Golf Tour of India and the Hyderabad Golf Association, in partnership with Telangana Tourism. He noted that the tournament serves as a platform to showcase not only the sport of golf but also Telangana's cultural heritage and tourism attractions to the world. Jupally Krishna Rao emphasized that Telangana's tourism highlights are not limited to Hyderabad alone; the state boasts a wealth of tourism assets, including lakes, forest areas, rivers, forts, and palaces. He explained that the Golconda Fort, which provides the backdrop for the tournament, stands as a symbol of Telangana's historical grandeur. He added that the participation of international golfers offers an opportunity to showcase Telangana's tourism



and sporting potential on a global stage. The Minister also revealed the government's intention to leverage the services of Indian cricket legend Kapil Dev to promote the state's tourism and sports sectors. He noted that Kapil Dev's experience and renown would help further promote Telangana's tourism attractions at both national and international levels. Speaking on the occasion, Kapil Dev appreciated the government's continued support for the Telangana Golconda Masters. He expressed confidence that the tournament would further promote Telangana and Hyderabad as premier golf tourism destinations. A total of 132 golfers will compete for a prize purse of ₹1 crore at the Telangana Golconda Masters tournament, scheduled from September 1 to 4. The event features both Indian professional golfers and international players.

This tournament carries Official World Golf Ranking points and will play a crucial role in selecting players for the DP World India Championship. The event was attended by DP World PGTI CEO Amandeep Johl, international golfer Stepan Danek from the Czech Republic, representatives from the Hyderabad Golf Association, sponsors, and players. Dispute Over Neem Tree Claims Two Lives

August 29 Trinet NEWS : A dispute over a neem tree claimed two lives on Saturday in Erragadda Thanda, Mellacheruvu Mandal, Suryapet district. A minor disagreement regarding a neem tree located next to a house escalated into a clash between two groups, resulting in a tragedy. Tensions gripped the village as members of both groups attacked each other with axes. According to locals, a dispute had been ongoing for some time between two families regarding the ownership of the neem tree and the issue of its removal. The conflict reignited on Saturday morning; what began as a verbal argument quickly escalated into a violent clash. It appears that, in a fit of rage, members of both groups attacked one another with axes. Venkateswarlu Yadav sustained severe injuries and died at the scene. Another individual, Saidha, also suffered critical injuries and passed away while being transported to the hospital for treatment. A pall of gloom descended



upon the village, and the wailing of family members was heart-wrenching. Upon receiving information about the incident, the Mellacheruvu police rushed to the village and attempted to bring the situation under control. However, reports indicate that an agitated group attempted to obstruct the police's actions. Tensions escalated further as the police tried to disperse the two groups. During the incident, Mellacheruvu Sub-Inspector (SI) Naveen was also attacked; he sustained head injuries after being struck with an axe by the agitated individuals. Fellow officers immediately rushed him to

the hospital for treatment, and his condition is currently reported to be stable. Following the incident, heavy police security was deployed in the village to prevent any further untoward occurrences. A case has been registered, and the police have launched an investigation into the causes of the clash. The bodies have been shifted to the hospital for post-mortem examinations, and authorities have assured that strict action will be taken against the accused. Although tension persists in the village, the police are closely monitoring the situation.

Nallari Kiran Kumar Reddy Appointed as Governor of Tamil Nadu



August 29 Trinet News :Nallari Kiran Kumar Reddy, the former Chief Minister of the undivided Andhra Pradesh, has been appointed as the Governor of Tamil Nadu. An official announcement regarding this appointment was issued following the approval of President Droupadi Murmu. The decision to entrust the governorship of Tamil Nadu—one of the country's key states—to Kiran Kumar Reddy, a leader with extensive political experience, has drawn significant attention in political circles. Kiran Kumar Reddy served as the last Chief Minister of the undivided Andhra Pradesh. No Permission for Ganesh Immersion in Kapra Lake



August 29 Trinet News: HYDRAA Commissioner A.V. Ranganath clarified that the immersion of Ganesh idols will not be permitted in Kapra Lake, which is recognized as a prominent biodiversity hub in the city. He visited the lake on Saturday to inspect development works and explained this decision during a meeting with representatives of the Bhagyanagar Utsav Committee. He suggested using the 'baby pond' located near the lake for the immersion of smaller idols. Speaking on the occasion, the Commissioner noted that Kapra Lake is not merely a water body but a crucial urban wetland vital for the city's ecological balance. He mentioned that the Central Government has already recognized the lake as a designated wetland. He urged everyone to act responsibly, as immersion activities in such areas pose a risk of damaging biodiversity and bird habitats. The Commissioner highlighted that Kapra Lake serves as a habitat for over 470 species of migratory birds arriving from various countries across the globe, including Australia and Europe. It was explained that Kapra Lake holds a prominent place in the list of urban wetlands announced by the Central Government, alongside the Manjira Wildlife Sanctuary and Pakhal Lake Wildlife Sanctuary. The Commissioner noted that, in accordance with the Wetland (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017, there are obligations to protect the lake's boundaries, curb encroachments, and safeguard it from



pollution. Against this backdrop, he stated that the 113-acre Kapra Lake is being developed under the supervision of HYDRAA, adhering to eco-friendly standards. He emphasized that priority is being given to floodwater retention, groundwater recharge, and biodiversity conservation. Representatives from the Kapra Lake Revival Group also met the Commissioner to discuss matters related to the lake's conservation and development. The Commissioner viewed a photo exhibition featuring migratory birds that visit the lake. While local representatives urged that the lake be fully developed into an ecological asset, the Commissioner assured them that HYDRAA is committed to working towards that goal. He appreciated the fact that, although approximately 70 per cent of the land within the Kapra Lake area belongs to private patta holders, they are cooperating with the lake's development. He also advised festival committee representatives to prioritize environmental protection during Ganesh idol immersions and to make alternative arrangements for large idols. Uppal Zonal Commissioner Radhika Gupta, HYDRA ACP Uma Maheswar Rao, Vimos Technocrats Director Yunus, and others participated in this visit.

Key Report on Minor Irrigation System

August 29 Trinet News:A report prepared by the Telangana Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Commission, aimed at strengthening the minor irrigation system and enhancing water use efficiency in the state, was submitted to Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Saturday. A delegation led by Commission Chairman M. Kodanda Reddy met the Chief Minister at his Jubilee Hills residence to present the report. The report emphasized that the restoration of the minor irrigation system is crucial for agricultural development, water security, and the improvement of rural livelihoods in the state. Commission members Ramulu Naik, Ramreddy Gopal Reddy, Gangadhar, and Bhavani Reddy were part of the delegation. The Chief Minister held extensive discussions with them regarding the Commission's recommendations. He suggested taking measures to promote crop diversification and increase the cultivation of horticultural crops in line with the changing dynamics of the agricultural sector. He also emphasized the need to focus on establishing Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) to boost farmers' income. In its report, the Commission suggested establishing command area-based management systems to ensure the more efficient



operation of the minor irrigation system. It emphasized the need to implement strategies for the integrated management of water usage by linking small and large irrigation sources. It opined that these measures would improve irrigation efficiency and boost agricultural productivity. The Commission recommended that the government enact a dedicated 'Small Irrigation Act' to protect the state's tanks. It suggested immediately identifying the Full Tank Level (FTL) boundaries of tanks, removing encroachments, and ensuring their preservation. The report explained that tank restoration would not only replenish groundwater levels but also improve water availability in rural

areas. The Commission noted that tanks play a pivotal role in ensuring water security, stabilizing agriculture, and enhancing rural livelihoods in Telangana. It expressed the view that strengthening tank-based agriculture could increase farmers' incomes while also mitigating the impact of climate change to some extent. It suggested that the conservation of water resources be viewed as an integral part of the long-term development strategy. A delegation briefed the Chief Minister on the initiatives undertaken by the Farmers' Commission over the past two years and the recommendations submitted to the government. The Chief Minister appreciated the suggestions offered by the Commission for farmers' welfare and the development of the agricultural sector. Expressing satisfaction with the Commission's performance, the Chief Minister urged them to provide further practical recommendations in the interest of farmers. It was revealed during the meeting that the government and the Commission would move forward in coordination to foster the state's agricultural development.



Efforts Accelerated to Enact Seed Law for Farmers' Benefit



August 29 Trinet News:Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao has directed officials to ensure there is no further delay in introducing a comprehensive Seed Law aimed at protecting the interests of Telangana's farmers. He emphasized the need for the law to be implemented swiftly, ensuring not only the availability of quality seeds to farmers but also the protection of the rights and interests of seed-producing farmers. To this end, he held a review meeting at the Secretariat with senior officials from the Agriculture Department regarding the 'Seed Law-2025'. The meeting covered various aspects, including seed production, quality control, sales, price regulation, the responsibilities of seed companies, and the protection of farmers' rights. The Minister stated that the seed sector needs to be further streamlined to prevent losses for farmers. He instructed officials to draft the law in a way that enhances transparency in the seed sector and provides better protection for farmers. The Minister recalled that the Telangana government had previously constituted a special committee to draft the Seed Bill for this comprehensive



legislation. He stated that the committee conducted a comprehensive study after consulting with various stakeholders, including farmers, seed companies, seed organizers, dealers, distributors, agricultural experts, and officials. He noted that just as the state government was preparing to enact legislation based on the committee's report, the central government also drafted the Seed Act-2025. The Minister revealed that the Telangana government has already submitted its views, suggestions, and objections regarding the draft bill prepared by the Centre. He mentioned that several key suggestions were conveyed to the Centre, keeping the state's interests and farmers' welfare in mind. However, he expressed concern over the lack of an adequate response from the Centre despite the passage of several months.Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao criticized the central government for delaying its decision regarding the Seed Act. He stated that although the state government had written multiple letters urging the enactment of the law for the welfare of farmers, no progress has been observed. He emphasized that one crop season has already passed and further delay would not be justified, given the farmers' interests. The Minister stated that the government is moving forward with the aim of bringing a comprehensive Seed Act into effect by the next crop season to benefit farmers. He directed officials to finalize the legislation by taking into account the recommendations of the state seed bill draft committee, the needs of farmers, and the current conditions in the seed sector. Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao stated that a robust legal framework for the seed sector is essential in Telangana, a state recognized as a leading seed producer and the "Seed Bowl of India."

New Momentum for Telangana-Mauritius Cooperation

Emphasis on Transparency in SIR-2026 Process

Tri Net News, August 29 : Telangana Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) C. Sudarshan Reddy (IAS) held a video conference on Saturday with District Election Officers, Electoral Registration Officers (EROs), and Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs) to review the progress of the Special Intensive Revision of Electoral Rolls (SIR-2026) process. Additional Chief Electoral Officer Dr. Vasam Venkateswar Reddy and Deputy CEO G.S. Chari also participated in the meeting. The review covered aspects such as objections, applications, notice distribution, and the conduct of inquiries under SIR-2026. The CEO directed that every notice issued to a voter must be personally handed over by the Booth Level Officer (BLO) to the concerned voter and that an acknowledgment must be obtained. He emphasized the mandatory requirement of allowing a minimum period of seven days after the issuance of a notice. Officials were instructed to ensure that BLOs remind voters about the date, time, and venue of the inquiry at least two days in advance. He also suggested raising public awareness through extensive publicity regarding the documents voters need to submit and directed that measures be taken to ensure information about the required documents reaches every voter. The CEO directed that a comprehensive inquiry schedule be prepared in consultation with Assistant Electoral Registration Officers and Additional Assistant Electoral Registration Officers, taking into account the volume of inquiries. He ordered that measures be taken to ensure effective supervision over the distribution of notices and the conduct of inquiries. It was suggested during the meeting that lists pertaining to 'no mapping' and 'anomaly' cases be shared with recognized political parties. Additionally, he stated that lists regarding objections and applications should be made available during weekly meetings with political parties, noting that this would enhance transparency in the process. The CEO emphasized that every stage of SIR-2026 must be conducted in accordance with the Election Commission's prescribed procedures and that all actions must be properly documented and recorded. After reviewing the progress across all districts regarding notice distribution, inquiry scheduling, and case allocation, he remarked that the objective of SIR could only be achieved through the strict implementation of regulations. Nodal officers, the PM (IT), and various other election officials participated in the meeting.

Cannabis-Laced Chocolate Racket Under the Guise of a Pan Shop



Trinet News : Hyderabad, August 29: Police have arrested an individual in the Shameerpet area of Hyderabad for selling cannabis-laced chocolates under the guise of running a pan shop. Investigations revealed that the accused, identified as Baidnath from Bihar, was operating this illicit business. Acting on special surveillance regarding drug sales, the police conducted raids and took the accused into custody. A large quantity of cannabis-laced chocolates was seized from him; officials reported the recovery of

5,298 packets weighing a total of 25 kilograms. It was noted that the products were packaged to resemble ordinary chocolates sold in the market. Police investigations disclosed that the cannabis-laced chocolates were being sold with the specific aim of targeting youth and children. It is suspected that the accused attempted to lure young people into drug habits by offering the products at low prices. Authorities warned that consuming these chocolates could have severe health consequences. Police

are continuing their investigation to determine the source of the supply and identify other individuals involved in the network. An investigation is underway to determine if these substances were supplied to other areas as well, and authorities are examining the possibility of others being involved in the matter. Police stated that they are implementing special measures to curb drug abuse and warned that strict action would be taken against such illegal activities targeting students and the youth. They urged the public to inform the police immediately if they notice any suspicious drug-related sales. Officials emphasized the need for public cooperation to protect society from the menace of drugs. In particular, they advised parents to keep a close watch on their children and remain vigilant regarding unfamiliar food items or chocolates. Further details regarding the case are likely to be revealed once the investigation concludes.

TRI NET NEWS August 29: International Whale Shark Day is observed annually on August 30 to remind the world of the need to conserve the whale shark, recognized as the largest fish inhabiting the oceans. The primary objective of this day is to raise public awareness about the importance of whale sharks and to highlight the need for governments, scientists, environmental organizations, and the general public to collaborate on their conservation. Although these creatures play a pivotal role in maintaining the balance of the marine ecosystem, they face numerous threats. The whale shark is renowned as the world's largest fish; typically, they grow to lengths of 12 to 18 meters, though even larger specimens have been recorded. Despite their massive size, they pose no threat to humans. They feed by filtering small marine organisms, microscopic food particles, and small fish. Consequently, they are often referred to as the "gentle giants" of the ocean. Their docile nature also makes them a major attraction in marine tourism. Whale sharks play a crucial role in the marine ecosystem, helping to maintain the balance of the ocean's food chain. They also play an indirect role in regulating marine populations. Whale sharks are considered indicators of a healthy marine ecosystem; their presence in an area signifies rich marine biodiversity. Consequently, environmental experts state that conserving them is tantamount to protecting the entire marine ecosystem. However, whale sharks currently face numerous threats. Their numbers are steadily declining due to factors such as illegal hunting, marine pollution, climate change, entanglement in fishing nets, and ship strikes. Rising plastic waste in the oceans has become a particularly significant threat; the creatures ingest plastic materials, mistaking them for food, which harms their health. These conditions are causing concern among environmentalists worldwide. India is also placing special emphasis on whale shark conservation. While whale sharks were previously hunted along the country's coasts, the government implemented strict laws after recognizing their importance. Hunting whale sharks is now prohibited, and various programs are being conducted to raise awareness among coastal fishermen. Initiatives to release whale sharks back into the sea after they become entangled in fishing nets off the Gujarat coast are yielding positive results. Scientists are continuously conducting research on whale shark migration patterns, lifestyles, and reproductive processes. Their movements are being studied with the help of satellite-based devices. This research contributes to formulating more effective conservation strategies for the future. The exchange of information among nations also plays a crucial role in this regard. Experts suggest that measures such as reducing marine pollution, curbing illegal hunting, and expanding marine protected areas are essential for the conservation of whale sharks. Tourism activities must also be conducted in an eco-friendly manner. Tourists visiting to see whale sharks should take care not to disrupt their natural behavior. Environmental organizations state that conservation goals cannot be fully achieved without public participation. Schools, colleges, and environmental organizations worldwide conduct special programs to mark this occasion. They highlight the importance of marine life through exhibitions, awareness seminars, discussions on marine conservation, and student competitions. Fostering a sense of responsibility towards environmental protection among the youth is also a key objective of these programs. Oceans are vital to Earth's ecosystem. It is the responsibility of human society to protect rare creatures like whale sharks that inhabit these waters. The extinction of these species could have a severe impact on the marine environment. Therefore, it is essential to protect their habitats, control pollution, and encourage scientific research. International Whale Shark Day conveys a significant message: preserving our natural heritage means ensuring a safe world for future generations. Moosarambagh Musi Bridge Ready for Inauguration



TRI NET NEWS : The new bridge constructed over the Musi River at Moosarambagh—a key project aimed at easing traffic congestion and improving transportation facilities in Hyderabad—is ready for inauguration. In preparation for this, GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan visited the site on Saturday to inspect the construction work and associated amenities. Built at a cost of approximately ₹52 crore, the bridge features modern design standards. Spanning 400 meters in length and 14.5 meters in width, it is set to facilitate smoother vehicular movement. Additionally, dedicated footpaths with a width of 3.5 meters have been provided to

ensure pedestrian safety. During the inspection, the Commissioner reviewed various aspects, including the bridge structure, approach roads, lighting systems, safety arrangements, and pedestrian facilities. He directed the concerned officials to complete all remaining works in strict adherence to quality standards before the inauguration. The opening of this bridge is set to significantly improve transport connectivity between the Amberpet and Moosarambagh areas. Officials anticipate a reduction in traffic congestion on existing routes as well as shorter travel times. It is poised to become a key piece of infrastructure in the city's transport

network. GHMC officials stated that the bridge's inauguration would greatly enhance travel convenience for local residents, employees, and students. The establishment of rapid connectivity between areas on both sides of the Musi River is also expected to boost economic and social activities. Commissioner R.V. Karnan directed all departments to work in coordination to ensure the bridge is made accessible to the public safely and smoothly. Officials revealed that the remaining works are being completed on an urgent basis to open the bridge to the public soon.

Another Low-Pressure Area Forms in the Bay of Bengal



Hyderabad, August 27 Trinet News: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has announced that conditions are favorable for the formation of another low-pressure area in the Bay of Bengal. Officials stated that rainfall activity is likely to pick up again in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh over the coming days due to this system. Warnings have been issued urging the public—especially farmers and residents of low-lying areas—to remain vigilant as weather conditions in the Bay of Bengal shift rapidly. Weather experts predict thunderstorms accompanied by lightning in the North Andhra districts of Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, and Parvathipuram Manyam. This weather pattern is expected to persist until September 2. Officials also indicated that mod-

erate to heavy rains are likely in parts of Rayalaseema, in addition to North Andhra. The Meteorological Centre has forecast light to moderate rainfall across several districts of Telangana. For Hyderabad city, the forecast indicates cloudy skies with a possibility of scattered showers over the next 24 hours. Officials anticipate that the fresh rainfall could have a significant impact, given that local tanks and ponds are already filled following the rains of the past week. These rains are also expected to influence the agricultural sector. While the rains are likely to be beneficial during the Kharif crop cultivation season, agricultural experts warn that excessive rainfall in certain areas could damage crops. They have advised farmers to follow the guidance of local agricultural

officials and implement crop protection measures. The Disaster Management Department has urged the public to take special precautions due to the likelihood of rain, gusty winds, and lightning. People have been warned against staying in open areas during thunderstorms and advised to avoid seeking shelter under trees, electric poles, or dilapidated buildings. They have been advised to step out only in case of emergencies. Officials have also urged motorists to remain vigilant; since roads may become slippery during the rain, drivers are advised to travel cautiously and control their speed. The public is encouraged to stay updated on official weather alerts and take necessary precautionary measures.



A Global Call to Trace the Disappeared

Yet, in certain parts of the world, incidents still occur where individuals suddenly vanish; their families remain unaware of their whereabouts, and no information regarding them surfaces. 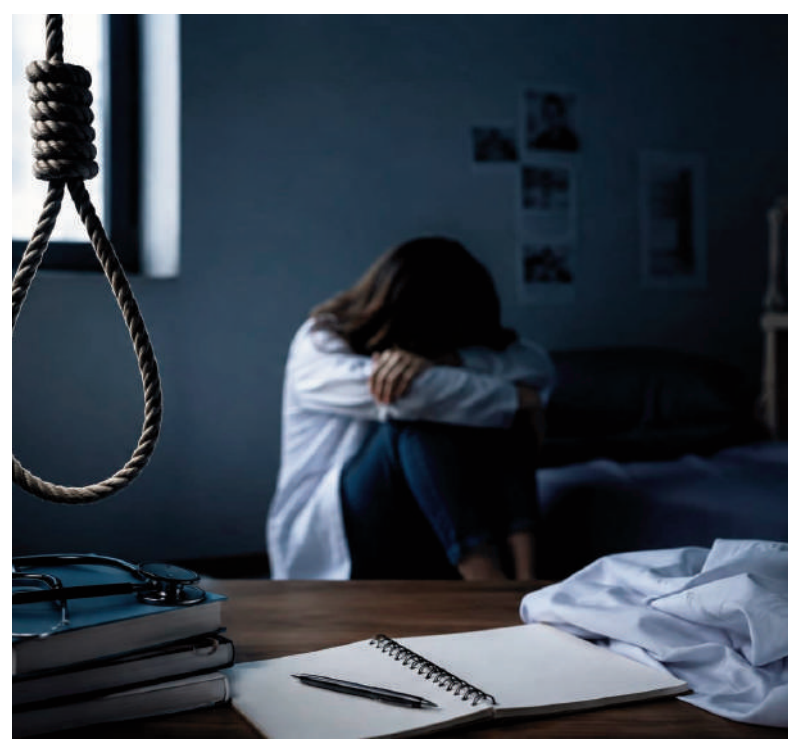
National Sports Day Celebrated with Great Enthusiasm in Halia

strive for their protection to achieve the goal of a Green Andhra Pradesh. Nagababu, accompanied by his wife Padmaja, participated in a program to plant Peepal and Neem saplings at the Aranyaramam park in Mangalagiri. Following traditional rituals, they planted the saplings and pledged their support for environmental conservation. Speaking to the media on this occasion, Nagababu stated that protecting Mother Earth is not merely a responsibility but a fundamental duty for every individual. He reminded everyone that essential resources for life—such as food, water, air, and shelter—are derived from Mother Earth. He expressed concern over the severe

damage being inflicted on nature through activities like deforestation, indiscriminate mining, and pollution. He emphasized that everyone bears the responsibility of preserving nature to ensure a healthy environment for future generations. Nagababu also noted that the "Ashwattha Narayana wedding" ritual—which holds special significance in Indian tradition—represents a wonderful blend of nature and spirituality. He stated that the tradition of planting the Peepal tree (symbolizing Lord Vishnu) and the Neem tree (symbolizing Goddess Lakshmi) together in a single pit conveys a powerful message regarding environmental conservation. He ex-

plained that the co-growth of these trees enhances biodiversity while fostering greenery and a clean atmosphere. Nagababu noted that his views on nature conservation align with those of Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan. He emphasized that these green initiatives are being driven by a shared resolve to provide a better environment for future generations. Criticizing the previous government, he alleged that they focused solely on felling trees and neglected the importance of planting new ones. Nagababu expressed the view that India should serve as a global role model for environmental conservation. Pointing out that countries like Kenya prioritize the protection of forests and wildlife, he asserted that India—the cradle of knowledge—must also lead the way in nature conservation. He called for increased public participation in tree plantation, biodiversity conservation, and environmental awareness programs. Subsequently, Nagababu inspected the designs for 'Aranyaramam,' a facility to be constructed at a cost of ₹24 crore to support the research and training activities of the State Forest and Environment Departments. Officials explained that plans have been finalized to complete the building's construction within ten months. Pattas to Be Issued for Dispute-Free Lands Within a Year



Trinet News, August 28: Telangana Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy said that all dispute-free lands across the State would be surveyed, every inch of them, and pattas would be issued to the rightful landholders within the coming year. On Saturday, at Nuthankal mandal headquarters in Thungathurthi constituency of Suryapet district, Pattadar Passbooks were distributed to 1,061 farmers covering 1,044 acres in 15 villages of Nuthankal and Maddirala mandals, resolving land issues that had remained pending for decades. Addressing the farmers on the occasion, the Minister said that farmers had been facing difficulties for years due to the absence of pattas for the lands they were cultivating. Keeping their problems in mind, the government introduced the Bhu Bharati Act soon after coming to power. Under the Act, Pattadar Passbooks are being issued for all dispute-free lands. He said the government was sincerely working towards a permanent solution to land-related problems by getting every inch of land surveyed by officials and ensuring that rightful landholders receive ownership documents. In the first phase, 70 villages in each district across the State were selected for surveys. The Minister said the government had received information that revenue, endowment and assigned lands were being encroached upon at several places in the State and that stringent measures were being taken to prevent such encroachments. As part of these efforts, he reiterated that every inch of land across the State would be surveyed over the next year and Pattadar Passbooks would be issued for all dispute-free lands. He said pattas would be issued for lands without disputes and to all eligible landholders. Criticising the previous government, he alleged that it had failed to issue pattas while in power and was now shedding "crocodile tears." He further said the Indiramma Housing Scheme introduced by the State government was receiving an overwhelming response from the people. He said 5,500 Indiramma houses had been allotted to each Assembly constituency in the State and announced that more houses would also be sanctioned in the third and fourth phases. Efforts to Resolve Farmers' Problems State Roads and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy said that issuing pattas was the solution to the decades-old problems faced by farmers. He said no other State in the country had provided ₹5 lakh for houses under a scheme like Indiramma Housing. He said roads under the HAM model were being constructed across the State at a cost of ₹36,000 crore. He said roads worth ₹100 crore had already been sanctioned for Thungathurthi constituency and proposals for another ₹200 crore were under consideration. He also announced that double roads would be laid to all villages in Suryapet constituency. He asserted that the Indiramma Housing Scheme would not be stopped under any circumstances and said the government's aim was to provide an Indiramma house to every eligible family living in a hut and transform Telangana into a State without huts. Sanction Additional Houses and Roads for Thungathurthi Constituency Thungathurthi MLA Mandula Samuel appealed to the government to sanction the pending road works in the constituency and allot additional houses. He said farmers cultivating their lands had suffered greatly because they did not possess legal ownership rights. He thanked the Revenue Minister and the Chief Minister for resolving a land issue that had persisted for nearly 60 years. "Land is a matter of self-respect for a farmer. Without land rights, there is no recognition," he said. Pattas Distributed for 1,044 Acres District Collector Tejas Nand Lal Pawar said pattas were being distributed to 1,060 farmers covering 1,044 acres in Nuthankal and Maddirala mandals. He said the State government had introduced the Bhu Bharati Act to resolve various land-related problems faced by farmers. As part of the initiative, more than 3,000 acres of land across 15 villages in Nuthankal and Maddirala mandals were surveyed and verified. Officials visited farmers' fields, served notices and subsequently published a draft list of eligible beneficiaries. Pattas are now being issued to farmers cultivating the lands. He added that Pattadar Passbooks were also being issued to farmers under Bhu Bharati and new land accounts were being created for those who previously did not have them. Bhongir MP Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy, State Revenue and CCLA Secretary Lokesh Kumar, Land Survey and Settlement Commissioner Rajiv Gandhi Hanumanthu, Additional Collector Hari Singh, Farmers' Commission member Cheviti Venkanna, market committee chairpersons, officials of various departments, public representatives from different mandals and others participated in the programme.

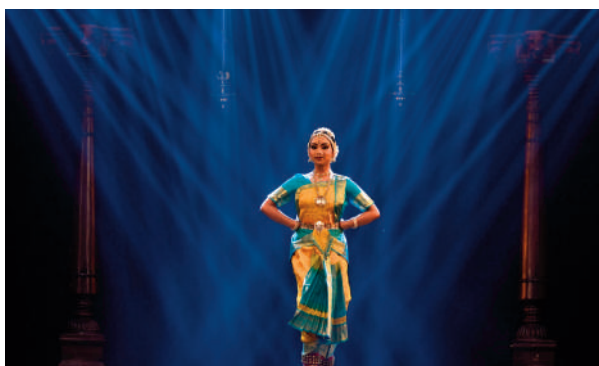

Kumari Akshitha's Bharatanatyam Arangetram

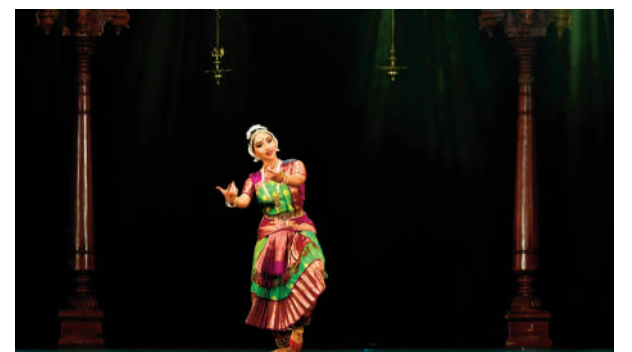
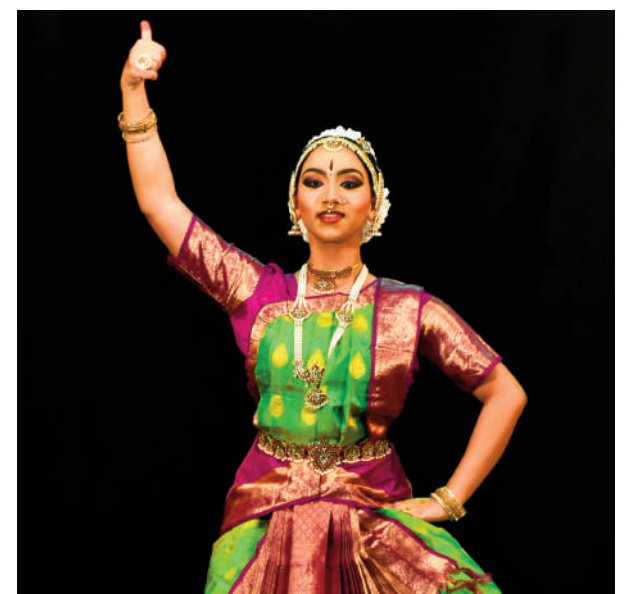
