

Trinet news New Buenos Aires, August 31: A significant step has been taken to further strengthen the strategic and economic partnership between India and Argentina. During the fourth meeting of the India-Argentina Joint Trade Committee (JTC), led by Indian Commerce Secretary Rajesh Agrawal, both nations agreed to expand mutual cooperation. They decided to bolster partnerships in trade, investments, critical minerals, and technology. Lithium and energy sectors emerged as key topics of discussion during the meeting. India expressed keen interest in enhancing cooperation with Argentina regarding lithium reserves, which are crucial for electric vehicles and battery manufacturing.



Technological Revolution in Agrochemical Management



The comprehensive chemical management system implemented by the Central Government to make agrochemical management in the country more efficient and transparent has entered a new phase. By integrating this system with the registration of farmers' crop details, more accurate information regarding fertilizer distribution and usage will become available. The system is set to play a pivotal role in ensuring that farmers receive the necessary agrochemicals on time. Data concerning over 140 million (14 crore) Aadhaar-linked buyers, more than 250,000 retail outlets, and the annual sale of approximately 70 million (7 crore) metric tonnes of products is being recorded in this system. This enables officials to monitor and manage every stage of the supply chain. Officials state that distribution is being planned systematically to align with farmers' requirements. Specialized analyti-

cal platforms have been developed to consolidate and monitor details regarding production, imports, transportation, inventory, state- and district-wise distribution, and retail sales. These technological platforms allow for the early detection of potential supply disruptions, enabling immediate corrective action. Consequently, the likelihood of farmers facing difficulties during the agricultural season has significantly decreased. The system has also been integrated to allow farmers to pre-book products. Through mobile-based booking, farmers can register their requirements in advance. Officials have devised plans to ensure adequate stocks of inputs are positioned in specific regions based on

this data, thereby accelerating the supply process. The Central Government is undertaking these measures with the aim of expanding the use of digital technology in the agricultural sector. Officials have noted that this system not only enhances transparency in the supply chain but also helps curb issues such as illegal hoarding and artificial shortages. It is believed that this system will play a pivotal role in delivering quality services to farmers. The Central Government views these measures as a milestone in modernizing product



management to meet the needs of the nation's agricultural sector. Officials recognize that the system facilitates the timely availability of essential products for farmers, improves supply efficiency, and enhances decision-making accuracy. Moving forward, data-driven decision-making will be prioritized in the distribution process.

Skilled Workforce Essential for Future Industries

August 31 Trinet News: Karimnagar, August 30: State Transport and BC Welfare Minister Ponnamm Prabhakar announced that special measures are being taken for the comprehensive development of Gollapalli village in Bhimadevarapalli Mandal. Visiting the village on Sunday as part of the "Ponnamm Anna for Every Village – People's Governance in Every Village" program, the Minister personally listened to the residents' grievances and reviewed development and welfare activities with officials. He assured the villagers that all necessary steps for the village's development would be taken. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister stated that works on the Gauravelli project are being expedited. He mentioned that the project is moving forward with the disbursement of compensation for land acquisition required for canal construction. He affirmed that he considers it his responsibility to complete the Gauravelli project and release water soon, noting that the farming community would benefit significantly once the project is finished. The Minister revealed that an open gym and a water plant have been sanctioned for Gollapalli, keeping the villagers' needs in mind. He also announced that special funds would be allocated for developing infrastructure such as roads, drainage sys-



tems, drinking water facilities, and electricity supply. He promised that funds amounting to ₹20 lakh for the Gram Panchayat building and ₹10 lakh for the women's community center would be sanctioned as soon as land acquisition in the village is completed. Rs.6.10 crore for the development of Nagiligonda



Trinet News, August 31: Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka said that Rs.6.10 crore has been sanctioned for the development of Nagiligonda village in Chintakani mandal of Madhira constituency. He visited the village on Sunday and laid the foundation stone for various development works and started the work. Inspection of Hyderabad –Bijapur Highway Works

Officials briefed him on the progress of construction at Malkapur near Chevella, and the Minister reviewed the quality and pace of the work. Speaking on the occasion, Kishan Reddy stated that the Central Government, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, attaches great importance to developing road infrastructure across the country. He noted that improved roads not only enhance connectivity between regions but also create new opportunities for economic growth. Treatment in Kerala... Governance in AP

August 31 Trinet News :Although Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan is in Kerala for medical treatment, he continues to actively oversee government affairs. Since traveling to Kerala



on the 22nd of this month for treatment, he has been reviewing the functioning of various departments, holding video conferences with officials, and making key decisions. He is responding to public issues and issuing clear directives to officials wherever necessary. Pawan Kalyan reviewed the "Gudi Bata" (Path to Temples) program, an initiative aimed at developing spiritual sites across the state. A decision was made to develop 205 kilometers of roads connecting over 100 pilgrimage sites at a cost of ₹120 crore. He directed that these roads be opened to devotees only after the work is completed and quality standards have been verified. Additionally, he suggested sanctioning another ₹30 crore for the development of temple roads in the Puttaparthi region. He also reviewed the "Great Green Wall" program, an initiative undertaken by the state government for environmental conservation. He called for increased public participation in the project, which aims to plant 5.5 million (55 lakh) palm seeds across 5,499 hectares. He instructed officials to raise public awareness regarding the collection, planting, and maintenance of the seeds. Instructions were issued to accelerate the 'AP-Green' action plan designed to increase greenery across the state. Officials were directed to focus on GIS mapping, geo-tagging, agroforestry, avenue plantations, canal bund plantations, shelter belts, and nursery development, with the goal of achieving 50% green cover in the state by 2047. It was suggested that resources such as CSR, NABARD, and carbon finance be utilized, and that work progress be monitored against monthly and quarterly targets. Additionally, orders were given to further expand road connectivity in tribal areas through the "Adavi Thalli Bata" program. Special attention was also paid to developing spiritual and healthcare infrastructure in the Pithapuram constituency. Measures were taken to allocate funds for the renovation of 24 temples (Rs 17.06 crore), the construction of a TTD Kalyana Mandapam (Rs 2 crore), and the building of 48 Bhajana Mandirams (Rs 11.60 crore). Furthermore, the project to upgrade the 30-bed Community Health Centre in Pithapuram into a 100-bed Area Hospital at a cost of Rs 34 crore was reviewed. The progress of the cancer center being established at the Kakinada Government Hospital for Rs 36.6 crore was also inspected. Regarding complaints about pollution in Krishnampalem, Anakapalli district, the situation was examined, and inspections were conducted through the Pollution Control Board. Clear instructions were issued not to restart the industry until pollution control equipment is installed in compliance with regulations. Government sources state that, in light of these developments, it is evident that Pawan Kalyan is maintaining continuous oversight of the administration, even while away from the state for medical treatment. The state government is fully prepared to provide the necessary administrative support—including the organization of Gram Sabhas and the establishment of help centers—to ensure the voter list revision process is conducted smoothly and transparently.

Srinivas Goud Questions Centre on BC Census



August 31 Trinet News: Former BRS Minister Srinivas Goud sharply criticized the stance of the Central Government and national political parties regarding the BC census and reservations during a press conference in Delhi. He stated that since independence, the majority sections of the country have not received full justice in the political, educational, and employment sectors. He alleged that governments, which came to power with the votes of Backward Classes (BCs), have shown negligence in protecting their rights. Srinivas Goud noted that although political leaders frequently speak about providing reservations based on population, no concrete steps are visible in that direction. He demanded a nationwide BC census and the assignment of a unique identification number to every caste. He explained that determining reservation percentages without official caste-wise statistics is legally untenable, which is why many such decisions face hurdles in the courts. He observed that even though states like Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Telangana, and Punjab have advocated for population-based reservations, they face legal challenges due to the



lack of adequate legal evidence. He urged the Centre to record comprehensive details regarding Backward Classes (BCs) in the census and to provide robust legal backing for reservations through constitutional amendments. Srinivas Goud criticized both the Congress and BJP for lacking clarity on the issue of a BC census. He expressed suspicion that the matter is being neglected out of fear that revealing the actual number of BCs would alter political equations. He noted that despite an OBC population exceeding 800 million (80 crores) in the country, they lack adequate representation in legislative bodies. He suggested implementing an official numbering system for OBC castes, similar to the one used for SCs and STs. Pointing out that the same caste is referred to by different names across various

states, he advocated for preparing a comprehensive list before conducting the census. He opined that social justice can only be achieved when opportunities in education, employment, and politics are provided based on population share. Srinivas Goud warned that if the Central Government continues to neglect the issues of the BC census and reservations, OBC communities across the country might launch a nationwide agitation. He remarked that if the Prime Minister takes a historic decision on this matter, it would secure him a lasting place in the nation's history. Rajya Sabha member P. Wilson, Professor Yogendra Yadav, Professor Suraj Mandal, BC Political Front President Balagoni Balraju Goud, representatives of the All India OBC Students Association, and others participated in the meeting.

BJP's Journey Driven by Ideology

Why Has Quartz Revenue Dropped?

August 31 Trinet News: Former Minister and YSR Congress Party leader



Anil Kumar Yadav has alleged that mineral sector revenues in Andhra Pradesh have dropped significantly under the coalition government's administration. He criticized Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, noting that while the CM had promised to generate wealth and implement welfare schemes during the elections, he is currently failing to even safeguard existing wealth. He specifically raised questions regarding the sharp decline in government revenue from quartz mines in Nellore district. Anil Kumar Yadav stated that during the Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy government's tenure, specifically in the 2023-24 financial year, the government earned ₹55 crore in revenue from quartz in Nellore district. However, he pointed out that since the coalition government assumed power, revenue recorded was only ₹7 crore last year and just ₹12 crore so far this year. He demanded that the government explain to the public the reason for such a massive discrepancy in revenue. He remarked that the decline in government revenue—despite the ongoing quartz mining and exports in Nellore district, a region renowned for its mineral wealth—raises suspicions. He urged for a comprehensive review of mine management, lease implementation, royalty collections, and export operations to bring the facts to light. He warned that a lack of transparency in the management of mineral resources poses a risk of massive financial loss to the state exchequer. He observed that the prevailing conditions in the mining sector are affecting not only the government but also thousands of workers and small-scale traders. He noted that if mining operations are not conducted properly, employment opportunities would dwindle and allied industries would suffer. Against this backdrop, he urged the government to intervene immediately and rectify the situation. Anil Kumar Yadav alleged that while the coalition government boasts about the state's financial health, revenue sources are actually declining. He expressed concern over the simultaneous rise in debt and the drop in revenue generated from natural resources. He advised the government to focus on measures to strengthen revenue streams rather than merely engaging in publicity campaigns about development. He demanded that the government disclose full details regarding quartz revenues and, if necessary, order an independent inquiry. He called for clarity on any lapses that may have occurred in the management of mineral wealth, which belongs to the public. He urged the government to respond and reveal the facts, given that developments in the Nellore district's mining sector have become a topic of discussion across the state.
