Notably, with the welfare of milk producers in mind, he revealed that the milk procurement price is being increased to ₹44 per litre. The government anticipates

created to attract both domestic and international companies. The Chief Minister announced the establishment of a Digital Finance Center in Coimbatore to strengthen the financial services sector. He noted that this facility would evolve into a hub for fintech, digital banking, and financial technology services. He added that the center would play a pivotal role not only in creating new job opportunities for the youth but also in giving a fresh boost to the state's economy. CM Joseph Vijay announced the establishment of a multimodal cargo transport hub in the Tiruchirappalli region. He stated that this hub, which integrates road, rail, and other transport systems, would accelerate freight movement. He mentioned that it would provide a significant boost to the state's industrial and commercial sectors while enhancing export and import capabilities. These announcements clearly demonstrate the Tamil Nadu government's comprehensive focus on agriculture, industrial development, infrastructure, and the digital finance sector. Amidst this natural disaster, the collapse of houses and buildings left several people trapped under the rubble. The plight of a six-year-old girl trapped beneath the debris deeply moved the locals. While many have already lost their lives in the floods, others remain unaccounted for. Rescue teams worked tirelessly to save the trapped girl. Despite the operation becoming complicated



due to adverse conditions and the weight of the debris, the teams persevered. Their round-the-clock efforts eventually led to locating the spot where the girl was trapped.After an arduous rescue operation lasting approximately 55 to 60 hours, personnel successfully brought the girl out safely. Onlookers rejoiced the moment she was rescued. Medical

teams immediately administered first aid and transported her to the hospital. Doctors are closely monitoring her health condition. Rescue personnel described her survival—despite being trapped under the debris for such a long time—as nothing short of a miracle. This incident has become a topic of discussion across Nepal. However, officials stated that no information regarding the girl's parents has been received so far. Efforts to determine their whereabouts during the floods are ongoing. Rescue teams are continuing the search for those reported missing. The floods in Nepal have caused massive loss of life and property; many families have lost their loved ones, and thousands have been left homeless. While relief operations are underway, the government and voluntary organizations have stepped forward to assist the victims. August 31 Trinet NEWS :A significant resolution has been reached regarding the long-standing dispute over the sharing of Son River waters in Eastern India. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) concerning the sharing of Son River waters was signed between the states of Bihar and Jharkhand in the presence of Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah. Amit Shah stated that this agreement puts an end to the long-standing water dispute between the two states. Speaking on the occasion, he noted that Bihar and Jharkhand came forward with mutual understanding to take this historic decision. He emphasized that the efficient use of water resources is crucial for the development of Eastern India and that this agree-



ment marks a significant step in that direction.The agreement on sharing Son River waters is set to improve irrigation facilities across vast rural areas in both Bihar and Jharkhand. Officials stated that crop productivity is likely to increase as lakhs of farmers gain access to the water needed for agriculture. The Union Home Minister also highlighted that the supply of drinking water to rural populations would improve as a result of this agreement. He expressed optimism that this agreement would make sustainable water resources available in regions facing water scarcity.The governments of both states will imple-

Harish Lashes Out at Revanth Over Krishna Water Issue

Former Minister and BRS Legislature Party Deputy Leader Harish Rao alleged that the Andhra Pradesh government is diverting Krishna waters out of the basin via the Veligonda project and that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's silence on this matter amounts to an unforgivable betrayal of Telangana. He criticized the AP government for indiscriminately utilizing Krishna waters despite the absence of specific allocations or floodwater conditions. Harish Rao expressed concern that the government, which ought to safeguard the state's interests, has failed to respond at a time when Telangana is facing severe irrigation water shortages due to the El Niño effect. He stated that diverting water to regions outside the basin violates regulations, especially while farmers are struggling due to a lack



of water for projects within the Krishna basin.He expressed anguish over the drying up of ayacuts under projects such as Bheema, Kalwakurthy, Nettempadu, and Koilsagar due to water scarcity. He alleged that following diversions

via Malyala, Muchumarri, Pothiredypadu, and the Nagarjuna Sagar Right Canal, water is now being diverted through the Veligonda project as well. Harish Rao criticized the state government for failing to safeguard Telangana's rightful share of water. He stated that the Congress government is ignoring the interests of farmers in the Palamuru, Nalgonda, and Ranga Reddy districts, appearing. Harish Rao demanded that Union Minister Kishan Reddy intervene immediately. On behalf of the BRS, he urged the Minister to pressure the KRMBS to take measures ensuring the filling of Krishna basin projects in Telangana and the supply of irrigation water to the command areas. party, discharge his assigned responsibilities with commitment, and strive to strengthen the party.



Centre Prioritizes Alampur's Development



August 31 Trinet News : Union Minister for Coal and Mines, Kishan Reddy, stated that the Central Government is placing special emphasis on the comprehensive development of the Alampur region, alongside the development of the Jogulamba Shakti Peetham. On Monday, he inspected the Jogulamba Railway Station, which is being upgraded at a cost of ₹6.07 crore under the Amrit Bharat scheme. During the visit, he examined the information boards installed on the station premises and visited the 'One Station - One Product' stall. He also interacted with passengers at the ticket counter to gather their feedback. Speaking to the media, Kishan Reddy mentioned that the Union Ministry of Tourism has already sanctioned ₹37 crore for the development of the Jogulamba temple. He noted that temple preservation and internal development works are being

carried out under the aegis of the Union Ministry of Culture and the Archaeological Survey of India. He affirmed the Centre's commitment to transforming Alampur—a place of great spiritual and historical significance—into a prominent pilgrimage destination of national importance. However, he pointed out that despite the release of funds by the Centre, work on certain key infrastructure projects—such as the bus stand, bridges, and roads—remains pending. He advised the concerned officials to coordinate with the state government and expedite the works. He urged the state government and the district administration to comprehensively review all pending development projects and complete them without delay. Kishan Reddy noted the need to provide enhanced facilities, given that devotees from various states across the country and abroad visit the Jogulamba temple.

He suggested improving infrastructure—such as roads, parking facilities, drinking water arrangements, sanitation, and public transport—keeping the volume of devotees in mind. He stated that the Centre is focusing on further developing Alampur as a spiritual tourism hub. The Minister mentioned that the Central Government is moving forward with a special plan to expand railway infrastructure in Telangana. He informed that 42 railway stations across the state are being modernized, with a target to complete the work by 2027. He revealed that 95 percent of the modernization work at the Jogulamba railway station is already complete, and steps are being taken to finish the remaining work quickly so it can be inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Kishan Reddy stated that the railway station is being specially designed to reflect the spiritual grandeur of the Jogulamba Shakti Peetham. He added that once the station becomes operational, travel to places like Hyderabad and Kurnool would become much easier for devotees and residents of the areas surrounding Alampur. It was announced that, as part of the railway network expansion in Telangana, single lines are being upgraded to double lines, double lines to triple lines, and—where necessary—to four lines. Mahabubnagar MP DK Aruna, Alampur MLA Vijayudu, South Central Railway (Hyderabad Division) DRM Santosh Kumar Varma, District Collector Rizwan Basha Shaik, SP Srinivas Rao, and others participated in the event.

A Success Story of 1,000 Days of People's Governance

The government is taking significant steps to transform Telangana into a leading state in the country through a combination of welfare schemes, massive investments, infrastructure creation, and the expansion of the technology sector. A milestone under Revanth Reddy's leadership The government revealed that, as a result of economic reforms and development initiatives, Telangana's per capita income is projected to reach ₹4,18,931 by 2025–26. This figure is approximately 91 percent higher than the national average. The state's economy has strengthened significantly due to growth in investments, industries, and employment opportunities. This development, achieved through active public participation, has positioned Telangana as one of the fastest-growing states in the country. It was revealed that investor-friendly policies, industrial development, and the expansion of the information technology sector have been the primary drivers of the state's economic growth. **Priority for Farmers, Women, and Youth** The government stated that it has accorded the highest priority to the agricultural sector. It noted that crop loan waivers of up to ₹2 lakh have provided relief to over 25 lakh farming families. In addition to providing investment support exceeding ₹36,000 crore under the 'Rythu

Bharosa' scheme, the government highlighted the effective implementation of initiatives such as bonuses for fine-variety paddy, free electricity, and farmer insurance. Schemes such as free bus travel for women, free electricity up to 200 units, and LPG cylinders at ₹500 were also implemented. Regarding the youth, the government mentioned providing over 72,000 government jobs and placing special emphasis on skill development through the 'Young India Skills University'. **Historic Decisions for Social Justice** The government stated that it has taken several key decisions to advance social justice. It noted that a state-wide caste census was conducted to gather comprehensive data on social, economic, and educational conditions. It highlighted that Telan-



gana became the first state to implement SC (Scheduled Caste) sub-categorization and that the Legislative Assembly approved a 42% reservation for BCs (Backward Classes). The government also explained the measures taken to improve the living standards of the poor through the issuance of new ration cards, the expansion of social security pensions, and

the implementation of the 'Indiramma Houses' scheme. It stated that special measures have been taken for the welfare of workers and gig workers. It noted that the initiatives undertaken by the government in the education and healthcare sectors have yielded significant results. It highlighted the establishment of 'Young India' Integrated Residential Schools, the implementation of the breakfast scheme in government schools, and teacher recruitment through the Mega DSC. It revealed that medical services have been expanded by raising the Arogyasri coverage limit to ₹10 lakh and establishing new medical colleges and super-specialty hospitals. It mentioned that financial assistance has been provided to lakhs of poor people through the Chief Minister's Relief Fund and explained that substantial funds have been allocated to provide better healthcare services to the public. - Moving Forward with the Goal of a World-Class Telangana The government stated that Telangana is advancing rapidly in creating world-class infrastructure, attracting investments, and expanding the technology sector. It noted that major projects—such as the Regional Ring Road, the second phase of the Metro expansion, the Musi River rejuvenation, and airport development—will serve as the foundation for the state's future growth. It reported that IT exports have reached ₹3.97 lakh crore and over 12 lakh direct jobs have been created. It highlighted Telangana's emergence as a national leader in attracting massive investments and fostering new industries, data centers, and the artificial intelligence sector. It affirmed that the government is moving forward with the goal of transforming Telangana into a one-trillion-dollar economy by 2034 and a three-trillion-dollar economy by 2047. would move forward in coordination to foster the state's agricultural development.



Special Action Plan for Katkuru's Development

August 31 Trinet News: State Minister Ponnamp Prabhakar stated that the goal of 'Praja Palana' (people-centric governance) is to directly under-



stand public issues and provide immediate solutions. He visited Katkuru village in Akkanapeta Mandal, Husnabad constituency, as part of the "Palle Palleku Ponnamp Anna – Palle Pallelo Praja Palana" (Ponnamp Anna to Every Village – People's Governance in Every Village) program. He personally listened to the villagers' concerns and held a review meeting with officials. He affirmed that the government is committed to village development by identifying and prioritizing the needs of the people. During the visit, the Minister inaugurated a new Gram Panchayat building constructed at a cost of ₹20 lakh. He also inaugurated and dedicated a new building for the Primary Agricultural Cooperative Society to the public. Additionally, he launched a free veterinary camp and 'National Nutrition Month' activities, interacting closely with the villagers. He explained that such tours are being conducted to bring government programs closer to the people. The Minister reviewed the welfare programs being implemented in Katkuru village. He inquired with officials about the implementation status of schemes such as Indiramma houses, free electricity, Rythu Bharosa, farm loan waivers, social security pensions, and the distribution of ration cards. He directed officials to take measures ensur-



ing that every eligible person receives the benefits of government welfare schemes. Officials were instructed to act responsibly to ensure the public faces no inconvenience. The Minister stated that priority would be given to development works in the village, such as the construction of CC roads, a building for women's groups, Anganwadi centers, additional classrooms for the school, and a compound wall. He revealed that measures are being taken to address road-related issues, including the widening of the Katkuru-Kannaram road. He noted that the government is moving forward with the aim of transforming the village into a model one across all sectors. The Minister announced that ₹250 crore has already been released for land acquisition regarding the Gauravelli project canals. He stated that the tender process for canal construction would begin soon and the project would be completed. He mentioned that the project's completion would ensure the availability of irrigation water for farmers. He added that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy would soon visit the Gauravelli project to review the progress of the works. The Minister revealed that the use of steel banks is being promoted to make Katkuru a plastic-free village. He stated that special priority would be given to the development of education, healthcare, agriculture, sports, and infrastructure. Ponnamp Prabhakar affirmed that he would remain constantly accessible to the public to address their grievances and that the government is committed to the comprehensive development of Katkuru village.

BRS Questions Revanth's Foreign Tours



August 31 Trinet News: BRS leader and former corporation chairman Manne Krishank demanded that the state government provide clarity regarding Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's foreign tours and the underlying motives behind them. Speaking at a press conference held at Telangana Bhavan, he stated that it was inappropriate for Revanth Reddy to link the Central Government's denial of permission for the US trip to the issue of Telangana's self-respect. He alleged that the Chief Minister had failed to disclose full details regarding the itinerary for the final two days of the US visit. Manne Krishank also raised questions about the 'Fourth City' plan announced by Revanth Reddy. He

noted that while the government claims it will bring world-renowned universities like Harvard and Oxford to Telangana, he expressed doubts about the feasibility of such announcements in light of ground realities. He criticized the government for making unrealistic promises merely to woo the public. Krishank further alleged that the Chief Minister's brothers were playing a key role in various international affairs; specifically, he demanded that the government reveal the official capacity in which Anumula Kondal Reddy met with Israeli officials. He urged the government to inform the public about how meetings with foreign representatives are taking place

without any involvement of the state administration. Krishank stated that the public harbors doubts regarding whether Revanth Reddy's foreign trips are intended to serve the state's interests or his own personal gain. He demanded that the government disclose details concerning the agreements and meetings associated with the visits to the United States and Israel, asserting that the government has a responsibility to provide full information to the people of the state. He also alleged that the Chief Minister's brothers are being accorded undue, unofficial prominence in government affairs. He called upon the government to clarify the role played by family members in key state projects and matters involving foreign investments. He remarked that senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi should also respond to these issues. Manne Krishank demanded a Central Government investigation into allegations concerning the foreign trips, financial transactions, and links to shell companies involving Revanth Reddy and his family members. He challenged the Chief Minister to directly respond to the allegations raised by BRS Working President KTR. He urged the government to maintain transparency in all matters affecting the state's interests and to address the public's concerns.

Unique Codes Must Be Assigned to Casts Before Census

August 27 Trinet News: Former Minister V. Srinivas Goud, former IAS officer and BC Intellectuals Forum Chairman Chiranjeevulu, BC Political Front President Balagoni Balraj Goud, and All India OBC Students Association President Kiran Kumar jointly submitted a representation to officials at the Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India in New Delhi. They urged that the ongoing census process be temporarily suspended and resumed only after assigning a specific unique code to every caste in the country. Speaking on the occasion, the representatives stated that assigning a unique identification number or code to each caste is essential to ensure accurate caste-wise statistics nationwide. They noted that discrepancies in data could arise because the same caste might be known by different names in different regions, and a unique code system could prevent such issues. They expressed the view that implementing a uniform identification system for all castes would make the census process more transparent and scientific. They explained that this approach would fa-



cilitate data collection regarding caste identity without any ambiguity. Representatives stated that accurate caste-wise statistics are essential for formulating social, educational, and economic policies. They urged the implementation of a 'unique code' system to ensure clarity in data collection regarding BC, SC, ST, and other communities. They emphasized that accurate data would play a pivotal role in future decisions concerning the implementation of welfare schemes, the formulation of

reservation policies, and the advancement of social justice. Consequently, they requested the Central Government to complete the caste coding process before conducting the census. The representatives noted that assigning a unique code to each caste during the nationwide census would yield comprehensive and precise data, thereby greatly facilitating policy-making. They appealed to the Central Government to consider their request favorably and take appropriate action.



BRS Launches 'Samarabheri' Against Congress Rule



August 31: Huzurabad MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy announced that the BRS party will conduct "Samarabheri" (Call to Battle) programs across the Huzurabad constituency from September 2 to 8 to expose the government's failures, marking the completion of 1,000 days of Congress rule in Telangana. He alleged that the government has completely failed to implement the "Six Guarantees" and the 420 promises made to the public during the elections. Kaushik Reddy spoke at a meeting held on Monday at his camp office in Huzurabad, attended by party leaders, public representatives, activists, and the press. He criticized the Congress government for failing to fulfill key



promises even after 1,000 days in power, despite having won the people's trust. He further alleged that the Congress government has disappointed all sections of society, including farmers, women, youth, students, workers, and employees. He stated that as part of the "Samarabheri" campaign, a massive protest (dharna), the distribution of "dues cards" (highlighting pending payments), and the display of a 420-foot-long flex banner would be organized in Huzurabad on September 2. It was announced that a protest regarding agriculture, irrigation, electricity, urea shortages, and farmer insurance issues would be held in Veenavanka on September 3rd. On September 4th, a 'Vanta-Varpu' (community cooking) program will be organized in Kamalapur to press for the fulfillment of promises made to women. A protest program is scheduled for September 5th in Jammikunta concerning fee reimbursement, the job calendar, the implementation of the Youth Declaration, and assurances given to unemployed youth. On September 6th, agitations will be held in the Huzurabad, Jammikunta, and Iilandakunta areas regarding the financial status of gram panchayats, pending bills, rural issues, and the demands of auto-rickshaw drivers. It was revealed that 'Praja Vani' (public grievance) programs would be conducted across the constituency's five mandals on September 7th to gather public issues and submit them to the government. On September 8th, the 'Samarabheri' (call to battle) programs will conclude with the submission of a memorandum at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar statue in the Karimnagar district headquarters. Padi Kaushik Reddy called upon farmers, women, youth, students, workers, public representatives, and party cadres to participate in large numbers and ensure the success of these programs, which demand the immediate implementation of every promise made to the people of Telangana by the Congress government. He expressed the hope that this 'Samarabheri,' undertaken to secure the rights of the people, would evolve into a statewide public movement.

Minister Reviews Public Issues in Chapagani Thanda



As part of the "Palle Palleku Ponnampalana Anna - Palle Pallelo Praja Palana" (Ponnampalana Anna to Every Village - People's Governance in Every Village) program, State Transport and BC Welfare Minister Ponnampalana visited Chapagani Thanda in Akkanna-pet Mandal to understand the issues faced by the public. He interacted directly with the villagers, inquired about local problems, and gave instructions to officials regarding their resolution. On this occasion, the

Minister laid the foundation stone for a BT (Black Top) road—costing ₹1 crore—connecting the R&B road to Sriram Colony and Telapagula Thanda. He also inaugurated internal CC (Cement Concrete) roads constructed at a cost of ₹10 lakhs and dedicated them to the public. Subsequently, the Minister toured the village and gathered information from locals regarding issues such as drinking water supply, drainage, electricity poles, streetlights, and the Mission Bhagiratha pipeline. He directed the concerned officials to resolve the problems faced by the people on a priority basis. The Minister stated that the benefits of welfare schemes implemented by the govern-

ment through the "Praja Palana" program are reaching rural areas. He noted that Chapagani Thanda has benefited from schemes such as Indiramma houses, pensions, free electricity, farm loan waivers, Rythu Bharosa, interest-free loans, and new ration cards. He emphasized that the government is according special priority to the development of villages and thandas. Assurances were given that all necessary roads for the *tandas* (tribal hamlets) would be sanctioned in a phased manner and the development works completed. Minister Ponnampalana stated that the goal of 'Praja Palana' (people-centric governance) is to directly understand the people's issues and provide permanent solutions. He emphasized that the government is committed to working towards village development and public welfare. Manohar Naidu and others participated in this program.

'Bhu-Bharathi' to Resolve Land Issues: Minister

♦ August 31: State Minister for Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, stated that the government is instilling confidence in farmers and landowners by resolving decades-old land issues through the 'Bhu-Bharathi' re-survey initiative. In Narayanapuram, Kesamudram Mandal, Mahabubabad district, the Minister resolved a long-standing issue regarding assigned lands—unresolved for nearly 60 years—by distributing 'Pattadar' passbooks linked with 'Bhu-Aadhaar' to 780 farmers, covering 1,378 acres. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister noted that no comprehensive land survey had been conducted in Telangana since the survey held 125 years ago. He criticized the lack of focus on a comprehensive land survey during the tenure of the previous government, both in the undivided Andhra Pradesh era and after the formation of Telangana. He stated that revolutionary reforms are being implemented under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy to provide permanent solutions to land-related problems. The Minister mentioned that the 'Bhu-Bharathi' Act has been introduced to support landowners—replacing the 'Dharani' system—and affirmed that



the government's goal is to transform the state into a land-dispute-free Telangana. He stated that every inch of land is being surveyed, and farmers are being provided with *Pattadar* passbooks that include QR codes and maps. He mentioned that while land titles for 3,400 acres were recently distributed to farmers from 13 villages in Tungaturthi, passbooks have now been distributed to 780 farmers in Narayanapuram. He also assured that the issue regarding approximately 150 acres of assigned land in Narayanapuram—cultivated by families since the time of their grandfathers—would soon be resolved to ensure justice for the farmers. He emphasized that public welfare is the government's primary objective and noted that welfare schemes are being extended even to remote areas. He stated that the gov-

ernment intends to ensure fairness for every eligible beneficiary under the 'Indiramma Houses' scheme. Subsequently, at the Mahabubabad Collectorate, he held a review meeting alongside Panchayat Raj Minister Seethakka regarding the functioning of the Revenue and Housing departments in the erstwhile Warangal district. During the meeting, he expressed dissatisfaction with the performance of revenue officials and warned those negligent in their duties to mend their ways. He made it clear that strict action would be taken if the public were subjected to any hardship. He instructed officials not to make decisions contrary to regulations regarding issues such as the '22-A' prohibited lands list and other land-related disputes. He advised officials not to confine themselves to their offices but to visit the field to understand and resolve the public's issues firsthand. Expressing displeasure with Tahsildars and MROs who have been absent from review meetings with public representatives, Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy emphasized the need for them to work efficiently to ensure that government reforms reach the people.

Demand for payment of five months' wage arrears and implementation of gratuity for retired workersCITU extends full support to the strike-Puttaparthi, August 31: Workers of the Sri Sathya Sai Drinking Water Scheme have announced an indefinite strike starting at midnight on August 31, demanding the immediate payment of five months' outstanding wages and the disbursement of gratuity due to retired and deceased workers. CITU State Vice-President Obulu stated that the union extends its full support to the workers' strike. Speaking on the occasion, he noted that uncertainty regarding project funding has persisted for the past five to six years. He highlighted that despite not receiving wages for five months, the workers have continued to supply drinking water to the public. He expressed regret that workers are repeatedly forced to resort to strikes just to receive their salaries. He demanded that the government allocate adequate annual funds in the state budget for the Sri Sathya Sai Water Supply Project and take measures to ensure its uninterrupted operation. He called for a permanent solution regarding workers' wages and job security, ensuring timely monthly salary payments. He also urged the government to immediately pay the gratuity due to workers who have retired or passed away while serving the project.



Issues Faced by KGBV Students Must Be Resolved Immediately

Government, Police Handling of Tukuguda Nurse Rape and Murder Case Outrageous BJP State General Secretary Veerender Goud



Hyderabad, trinet NEWS, August 31:: BJP Telangana State General Secretary Veerender Goud strongly criticised the Congress government, alleging that law and order in the state had completely deteriorated and that the safety of women had become extremely precarious. He described the alleged rape and murder of a tribal (ST) young woman working as a nurse at a private hospital under Tukuguda Municipality in Rangareddy district as a brutal crime and a horrific incident that should make civil society hang its head in shame.Speaking on the incident, he said the young woman had come from the Khammam/Kothagudem region in search of employment and was working as a nurse at the local Prime Care Hospital while staying at a nearby hostel. He alleged that a man identified as Sanaullah Khan, who worked at a nearby mechanic shop, forcibly en-

tered her hostel room and raped her. When she resisted, he allegedly murdered her brutally. Goud said reports also suggested that the accused poured petrol in an attempt to destroy evidence.He alleged that although the accused had been clearly identified through CCTV footage, the police had acted negligently by not registering a case until yesterday and by not officially confirming the arrest, raising several suspicions.Veerender Goud further alleged that attempts were made to intimidate the victim’s family members, persuade them in the name of compensation, hastily complete the post-mortem examination and shift the body to her native village. He claimed that these actions indicated an attempt to suppress the case.He accused the Revanth Reddy government in Telangana of acting in a manner similar to what he alleged was the Mamata Banerjee government’s handling of the RG Kar Medical College case in Kolkata, claiming that efforts were being made to protect the accused.Goud said it was shameful that the government remained indifferent despite a series of alleged crimes against women and minors within a single week.

Referring to a recent controversy involving MIM MLC Mirza Rahmat Baig and an alleged objectionable video involving a minor girl, he criticised the Congress and BRS, alleging that the parties had failed to issue even a statement because of vote-bank politics.He also expressed concern over what he described as the unchecked proliferation of hostels, drug use and the presence of people from other areas without proper identification in Tukuguda and Mankhal. He alleged that these factors had contributed to the deterioration of law and order, leaving local women and female students living in fear.On behalf of the BJP, Veerender Goud demanded that the government conduct an impartial and completely transparent investigation, ensure stringent punishment for the accused if found guilty, and provide full justice to the victim’s family.He further demanded that if the investigation was not conducted in a manner that restored public confidence in the state police machinery, the case should immediately be handed over to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).
