Video of 'Lady Aghori' Goes Viral on Social Media

Ujjain, September 1: The 'Lady Aghori,' who previously caused a sensation and made headlines due to various controversies in the Telugu states, has once again become a topic of discussion. Although it was believed she was leading a normal life following her time in prison, allegations have surfaced that she is living in northern states and circulating controversial videos on social media. A recent video featuring her has gone viral, sparking widespread debate. Reports suggest the video was filmed at the Chakratirtha cremation ground in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh. The controversy intensified as the video shows her holding a knife near a burning funeral pyre and engaging in what appear to be objectionable acts. She reportedly posted the video on her own social media account. The comments made in the video have also sparked intense debate. She is heard stating that she spends most of her time in cremation grounds and performs rituals associated with spirits and ghosts. Netizens also note that she made remarks sounding like warnings. These comments have drawn widespread criticism on social media, with many netizens expressing strong outrage over the viral video. There are calls for the concerned authorities to look into these actions, which appear to run counter to human values.

Permanent Solution to 120-Year-Old Land Issue

Guntur, September 1: A permanent solution has been found for a land issue that had persisted for decades in the

villages of Vatticherukuru, Pullatagunta, and Etukuru within the Prathipadu constituency. The distribution of land title deeds to a total of 812 families has brought an end to a problem that had been ongoing for 120 years. The government took a crucial decision to grant ownership rights for 41.46 acres of land across these three villages. Union Minister of State Dr. Pemmasani Chandrasekhar participated in the event and handed over the title deeds to the beneficiaries. Title deeds were received by 515 families in Vatticherukuru, 206 families in Pullatagunta, and 91 families in Etukuru. He described this as a historic development for families who had been in possession of the land for a century but faced difficulties due to the lack of formal ownership rights. The Minister expressed happiness that such a permanent solution had been achieved for the first time in the state.

Mudigubba, September 1: Workers of the Sri Sathya Sai Drinking Water Supply Project (SSSWSP) in Mudigubba Mandal

have expressed deep concern over the non-payment of wages for the past five months. They demanded timely payment for the workers who ensure a continuous supply of drinking water to the public. They highlighted that despite not receiving their salaries, they have continued to supply water to villagers—working through scorching heat, rain, and strong winds, and even dur-

ing festival holidays. They expressed distress at having to resort to strikes repeatedly just to secure their wages. They demanded that adequate funds be allocated annually to ensure the project's uninterrupted operation and insisted on the immediate payment of the five months' outstanding wages. Furthermore, they called for a permanent solution regarding job security and the payment of gratuity dues to the families of deceased retired workers. The Sri Sathya Sai Drinking Water Supply Workers' Union (affiliated with CITU) announced that they would launch an indefinite strike starting in September if their demands were not met. CITU State Vice-President Obulu, Mudigubba Mandal Secretary Babjan, CITU District Secretary Gangadhar, and Water Supply Workers' Union leaders Madhu, Suresh, Raja Reddy, Venkateshu, Basha, and Venkata Reddy, among others, participated in the event.

YSRCP Extends Full Support to Kallur RS Sanitation Workers' Struggle

Garladinne, September 1: YSRCP has extended its full support to the strike undertaken by the sanitation workers of Kallur RS Gram Panchayat to press for their legitimate demands. This support was conveyed on behalf of the party, following the directives of Dr. Sake Sailajanath and the guidance of Anantapur District Farmers' Wing President Y. Narayana Reddy and Mandal President Yella Reddy. How are the workers' families expected to survive without receiving salaries for the past three months? How can they manage their households if essential commodities have not been supplied for 7-8 months? Is it even possible to sustain a family on a monthly salary of just ₹6,000-₹8,000? The government bears the responsibility of immediately clearing the sanitation workers' salary arrears, increasing their wages, and ensuring the timely



supply of essential commodities. "Swachh Bharat" should not be merely a slogan; the government must also bring light into the lives of the sanitation workers who are implementing cleanliness on the ground. We question how "Swachh Bharat" can be achieved when sanitation workers—who toil daily to keep villages clean—go without salaries for months. Furthermore, given that Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan oversees the Panchayat Raj Department, the government must take immediate action to

release the necessary funds to Gram Panchayats and ensure that sanitation workers receive their salaries on time. A village remains clean thanks to the sweat of the sanitation worker; if the hearth in such a worker's home remains unlit, it is a failure of the authorities—outstanding wages must be paid immediately. Essential commodities must be provided immediately! Sanitation workers' wages must be increased, and the necessary funds must be released to the panchayats immediately. MLA Daggupati Prasad Inaugurates CC Road Built at a Cost of ₹35 Lakhs



Anantapur, September 1: Anantapur Urban MLA Daggupati Prasad stated that they are moving forward by resolving issues that had persisted for over three decades within just two years. He distributed NTR social pensions in Maruti Nagar (34th Division) of the city, where local leaders accorded him a grand welcome. Accompanied by MP Ambika Lakshminarayana and leaders of the alliance, MLA Daggupati Prasad participated in the "Alliance Government at Your Doorstep" program and subsequently distributed pensions to the beneficiaries. He also distributed pensions in Vimala Farooq Nagar, located in the Rudrampeta Panchayat. While interacting with the beneficiaries, he inquired whether the pensions were being delivered to their doorsteps every month; the beneficiaries expressed their happiness regarding the pension distribution. He inaugurated a new CC road constructed at a cost of ₹35 lakhs near PVKK College on Alamuru Road. Speaking on the occasion, MLA Daggupati Prasad noted that the Rudrampeta Panchayat had faced numerous problems over the past five years, none of which had been addressed by the previous government. Furthermore, he stated that issues persisting for 30 to 35 years have been resolved within just these two years; specifically, roads, drainage systems, and other infrastructure facilities worth approximately ₹25 crore were provided in the Rudrampeta panchayat alone. He noted that several colonies in Rudrampeta frequently get inundated during the monsoon season due to the heavy accumulation of water in the 'Nadimi Vanka' stream, and steps are being taken to provide a permanent solution to this problem. Proposals worth ₹128 crore have been submitted for the construction of protection walls along the 'Nadimi Vanka' and 'Maruva Vanka' streams; he expressed confidence that the funds would be sanctioned soon and the works executed. He also highlighted that development activities worth ₹60 crore have been carried out across four panchayats during this two-year period, ensuring there are no issues regarding roads or drainage systems. On one hand, there is visible happiness among the public regarding the pension distribution, although some are also requesting new pensions; it was stated that three lakh new pensions would be sanctioned soon. It was emphasized that pensions are being distributed to all eligible individuals, irrespective of political affiliations. Criticism was raised regarding the previous government's actions of cancelling the pensions of many individuals simply because they were supporters of the Telugu Desam Party. Daggupati Prasad stated that Chief Minister Chandrababu has issued instructions to ensure welfare schemes reach everyone, transcending party lines. Meanwhile, MP Ambika Lakshminarayana noted that village development is progressing rapidly with the cooperation of Panchayat Raj Minister Pawan Kalyan. He highlighted that while Education Minister Nara Lokesh is creating employment opportunities for the youth, Chief Minister Chandrababu is steering the state towards comprehensive development. MLA Daggubati Focuses on Strengthening the Power System



MLA Meets Electricity Department CMD in Tirupati

Anantapur, September 1: MLA Daggubati has focused his attention on strengthening the power distribution system in Anantapur city to meet its growing electricity needs. As part of this initiative, he met L. Siva Shankar, the CMD of APSPDCL, at the corporation's office in Tirupati. He submitted a representation to the CMD detailing the issues and requirements of Anantapur. He brought several key proposals regarding the development of electrical infrastructure in the Ananta-

pur Urban constituency to the CMD's notice. He requested the sanctioning of new substations, citing the city's expansion and the rising demand for electricity across residential, commercial, and industrial sectors. He highlighted the need for new electrical substations in the Narayanapuram Panchayat, Rudrampeta, and Lakshmi Nagar areas. Furthermore, he emphasized the necessity of installing twenty 160 kVA distribution transformers and replacing old poles, cables, and lines with new ones to provide permanent solutions to issues such as power supply interruptions, overloading, and voltage fluctuations. He urged the authorities to grant approvals for creating this new infrastructure and requested the expedited issuance of administrative sanction for setting up a 33/11 kV indoor substation near the Anantapur RTC bus stand. They made a request to the CMD, urging

him to take all necessary measures to ensure an improved power supply for the residents of Anantapur city. MLA Daggupati Prasad asked that the proposals be examined with the utmost priority, keeping public interest in mind. The CMD responded positively, stating that all aspects would be reviewed and appropriate instructions issued to the Anantapur Superintending Engineer (SE). Speaking on the occasion, MLA Daggupati Prasad emphasized that the power infrastructure is crucial to Anantapur's development. He noted that the demand for electricity has risen significantly due to both population growth and industrial expansion; therefore, they had requested the CMD to sanction the necessary requirements to meet these growing needs. MLA Daggupati Prasad expressed confidence that the sanctions would be granted soon.

Ensure No Drinking Water Shortage Occurs

Anantapur, September 1: MLA Daggupati Prasad urged officials at the Irrigation Advisory Board (IAB) meeting to ensure there is no drinking water shortage in the Anantapur Urban constituency during the upcoming summer. He participated in the meeting—chaired by District Collector O. Anand at the Anantapur Collectorate—alongside Minister Payyavula Keshav, Gov-

ernment Whip Kaluva Srinivasulu, MLAs Paritala Sunitha, JC Asmith Reddy, and Bandaru Sravani Sri, as well as other officials. MLA Daggupati specifically highlighted the water-related issues in the urban constituency. He noted that the demand for drinking water is rising daily due to the city's growing population and called for water allocations to be made accordingly for the year. Furthermore, he pointed out that drinking water issues occasionally arise in col-

onies across four panchayats and requested that this problem also be resolved. He emphasized the need to formulate a clear plan regarding water storage and supply well in advance to prevent any drinking water difficulties during the coming summer. He also mentioned the public's deep anxiety regarding water availability amidst the El Niño phenomenon and stressed the need to alleviate these concerns. He sought clarity on the volume of water flowing from the HLC (High-Level Canal) and Handri-Neeva projects, the storage levels in various reservoirs, and the extent to which these reserves would meet future needs. He urged officials to inform the public about the priorities regarding drinking and irrigation water and to create appropriate awareness among farmers concerning water-related issues.

TDP Cadre Distributes NTR Pensions to the Elderly and Widows

with disabilities in the 16th Ward of Madakasira town—covering areas such as Maruti Nagar, CC Banda, and Naganna

The distribution was carried out in coordination with secretariat officials, following directives from Satya Sai District President, TTD Board Member, and MLA MS Raju, as well as State TDP Vice President and former MLC Gundumala Thippeswamy. TDP leader Kapu Ramanjaneyulu, accompanied by other leaders and party workers, visited households to interact with residents and inquire whether they were receiving their pensions on the 1st of every month. Secretariat official Vijay, along with TDP leaders, activists, beneficiaries, and others, participated in the event.



Relief for Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak Schemes in High Court



Hyderabad, September 1: The Telangana state government has received significant relief from the High Court regarding the Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak schemes. On Tuesday, a division bench led by the Chief Justice set aside the interim stay orders previously issued by a single judge, which had halted the implementation of these schemes. This move removes the legal hurdles preventing the continuation of these welfare schemes implemented by the state government. Advocate Vijay Gopal had filed a petition in the High Court challenging eight Government Orders (GOs) issued since 2014 concerning the Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak schemes. The single judge, having taken up the matter, had imposed an interim stay on the schemes' implementation be-



cause the state government had not filed a counter-affidavit. This decision had become a topic of widespread discussion across the state. The Telangana government approached the division bench to challenge the single judge's orders. Representing the government, Advocate General Sudarshan Reddy presented arguments, bringing to the court's attention the fact that these schemes have been implemented continuously since 2014. It was submitted that the petitioner suffered no loss, as he was not a beneficiary of these schemes. The Advocate General further argued that this was not a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) and that matters concerning government policy decisions should be heard only by a Division Bench. He also drew the court's attention to the fact that the Supreme Court had previously permitted the implementation of welfare schemes such as 'Shaadi Mubarak'. After considering the arguments presented on behalf of the government, the Division Bench delivered a verdict setting aside the interim stay order issued by the single judge. The court reportedly held that it was not appropriate to continue a stay order that had an immediate impact on the implementation of welfare schemes. With this latest decision by the High Court, the implementation of the 'Kalyana Lakshmi' and 'Shaadi Mubarak' schemes will continue as usual across the state. The government views this as a relief for the thousands of families benefiting from these schemes. The Division Bench's verdict has put an end to the uncertainty surrounding the implementation of the schemes.

Inspection of CM's Visit Arrangements CM's Principal Secretary Sridhar Visits Maddur



Narayanpet, September 1: With State Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy scheduled to visit Maddur Mandal in Narayanpet district on September 4, CM's Principal Secretary Sridhar (IAS) inspected the arrangements on Tuesday. Accompanied by District Collector Priyanka, SP Dr. Vineeth, and KAD Special Officer Venkat Reddy, he toured the areas surrounding Maddur to review the progress of devel-

opment works and the arrangements for the visit. During the visit, Sridhar inspected the Government Degree College building currently under construction near Maddur and inquired about the progress of the work from officials. Subsequently, he inspected the construction of the Social Welfare Residential School and College buildings on the Chintaldinne route and gathered details regarding the con-

struction process. He directed the concerned officials to install information boards displaying the building layout map and the work timeline at the residential school and college construction site. He emphasized the need to accelerate construction activities and ensure completion by March of next year. He also advised that the work be completed swiftly while strictly adhering to quality standards. As part of the Chief Minister's visit, officials inspected potential sites for setting up a helipad. They examined the grounds near the degree college building in Madduru and another location near Chintaldinne, providing instructions regarding the necessary technical and safety standards for the helipad's construction. Accompanied by District Collector Priyanka and SP Dr. Vineeth, they reviewed security arrangements, transport logistics, and public participation for the visit. Officials were directed to take proactive measures to ensure the visit proceeds without any hitches. Chief Minister's Principal Secretary Sridhar instructed officials from all departments to work in coordination to ensure the visit's success. He also directed them to complete all necessary preparations in advance and take steps to effectively showcase the progress of development works during the visit.

Major Relief for HYDRA Commissioner AV Ranganath in High Court

Hyderabad, September 1: HYDRA Commissioner AV Ranganath has received significant relief from the Telangana High Court. On Tuesday, a Division Bench of the High Court set aside the order issued by a Single Judge directing Ranganath's removal from his duties as HYDRA Commissioner. The Court issued orders adjourning the next hearing on the matter to November 3, thereby temporarily putting an end to the uncertainty regarding Ranganath's continuation in the role. Officials had carried out demolition activities on August 17 across approximately 40 acres of land falling under Survey Numbers 1 and 2 in Lothukunta village, Medchal-Malkajgiri district. Challenging these actions, Shanta Sriram Constructions Private Limited filed a contempt of court petition in the High Court. During the hearing of this petition, the conduct of HYDRA officials was extensively discussed in court. While hearing the petition, the Single Judge remarked that officials who repeatedly violate court orders pose a threat to the rule of law. It was observed that officials holding responsible positions must respect court



orders; otherwise, the democratic system would be adversely affected. In this context, the conduct of HYDRA Commissioner AV Ranganath was also highlighted. The single judge noted that while 9,290 contempt of court cases were pending across the state over the last five years, 63 such cases had been registered against AV Ranganath in just a year and a half. Describing this situation as extraordinary, the judge opined that it was inappropriate for him to continue as the HYDRA Commissioner and consequently directed the State Chief Secretary to remove Ranganath from the post. However, AV Ranganath

challenged the single judge's order by approaching the Division Bench. He filed an appeal objecting to the allegations against him, the court's remarks, and the directives issued. The Division Bench heard the appeal and examined all aspects of the case. Following the hearing, the Division Bench set aside the single judge's order, thereby paving the way for AV Ranganath to continue as the HYDRA Commissioner. Nevertheless, as the hearing on the main petition is still pending, the court adjourned the case to November 3rd. This verdict has assumed significance within state administrative circles.



Minister Konda Surekha Heads to Delhi; Suspense Within Congress



- Travels to the capital following an urgent summons from the high command
- Preparations underway for meetings with KC Venugopal and Kharge
- Key developments unfold amidst the backdrop of show-cause notices- Political circles keenly await the high command's decision

Hyderabad, September 1: The issue surrounding Minister Konda Surekha has once again become a focal point of political discussion within the Telangana Congress party. Amidst recent developments, Konda Surekha has hurriedly departed for Delhi. Party sources indicated that she traveled to the capital in response to an urgent call from the Congress high command. It is reported that she will hold crucial meetings with the party's national leadership during this visit. She is expected to meet specifically with AICC General Secretary KC Venugopal and has reportedly sought an appointment with Congress National President Mallikarjun Kharge. Party sources anticipate that these meetings will address recent political developments in Telangana and internal party affairs. Comments made recently by Minister Konda Surekha's daughter, Sushmita, during an event in Geesukonda, Warangal district, sparked intense debate within the Congress party. The party's disciplinary committee took a serious view of her remarks concerning Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Parkal MLA Revuri Prakash Reddy. These comments have fueled discussions regarding internal rifts within the state Congress unit. Against this backdrop, the TPCC Disciplinary Committee issued a show-cause notice to Minister Konda Surekha. While she was asked to explain her comments regarding Sushmita, reports indicate that Konda Surekha has already submitted her explanation to Committee Chairman Mallu Ravi, and the party leadership is currently reviewing it. Simultaneously, a comprehensive report concerning the Vana-parthi issue—prepared against State Planning Board Vice-Chairman Chinna Reddy—was also forwarded to the TPCC leadership. It is understood that both this report and Konda Surekha's explanation have been sent to the Congress central leadership for review. The fact that Surekha received a summons to Delhi shortly after these reports were submitted has assumed political significance. There is considerable interest in political circles regarding the decision the Congress high command might take in light of her visit to Delhi. There is widespread anticipation regarding how the high command will view the alleged breach of party discipline and what action it might take in this matter. Party sources believe that greater clarity on the issue is likely to emerge following the meetings in Delhi.

Minister Distributes Smart Ration Cards



Mulugu, September 1: Minister Anasuya Seethakka distributed new smart ration cards—symbolizing social dignity for the poor—at the Mulugu District RDO office conference hall. Accompanied by District Collector Borkhade Hemant Sahadevrao, she handed over modern ration cards equipped with QR codes to beneficiaries from Mulugu and Mallampalli mandals. A total of 2,430 new ration cards were distributed, comprising 1,809 for Mulugu mandal and 621 for Mallampalli mandal. Speaking on the occasion, Minister Seethakka stated that the people's government is sanctioning these new cards to ensure that eligible poor families do not miss out on the fine rice scheme due to the lack of a ration card. She noted that this year, 36,405 family members across the district are benefiting from the fine rice scheme through 12,802 new ration cards. Review Meeting on Ganesh Festival Arrangements



Hyderabad, September 1 (Tuesday): The Telangana government held a high-level review meeting to ensure the successful conduct of Ganesh festival celebrations and immersion proceedings across the state. Presided over by Minister for Transport and BC Welfare Ponnabrahma Prabhakar, the meeting was attended by Telangana DGP CV Anand, senior officials from various departments, Police Commissioners, municipal officials, Ganesh festival committees, and representatives of the Khairatabad Ganesh Utsav Committee. Comprehensive discussions were held regarding the organization of the festivities, security measures, and amenities to be provided to the public. Speaking on the occasion, Minister Ponnabrahma Prabhakar remarked that the Ganesh festival symbolizes the faith of the state's people and directed all

departments to work in coordination to ensure devotees face no inconvenience. He stated that the government would extend full cooperation for the conduct of the festivities. He instructed officials to pay special attention to security, sanitation, electricity supply, and drinking water facilities at every *pandal*. Telangana DGP CV Anand spoke about the police department's experience in managing Ganesh immersions. Drawing upon past experience in handling security arrangements for immersions in the city, he offered key suggestions. He emphasized the need for special supervision at every stage of the phased immersion process. It was advised that festival committees coordinate with the police department and adhere to all regulations. The meeting covered issues such as managing crowds at

the *pandals* (temporary shrines), ensuring electrical safety, preventing fire accidents, and making emergency services readily available. Hyderabad as a World-Class Education Hub: CM Revanth Reddy

The CM revealed that the UK-based University of London and the US-based Northeastern University (Boston) will set up offshore campuses in Hyderabad. He described this as a key outcome of the government's efforts to make world-class education accessible to Telangana's youth, noting that young people will now have the opportunity to pursue education of international standards right here in Hyderabad without having to go abroad. The CM also disclosed that the world-renowned Harvard University and its affiliated academic divisions have shown interest in conducting specialized courses and select academic programs in Telangana. He also stated that discussions held with prominent educational institutions—such as Oxford University, Cambridge University, the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), Imperial College London, London Business School, and the London School of Economics—have yielded positive results. The Chief Minister noted that meet-



ings with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in the US and several Ivy League universities were also promising. He remarked that through these partnerships, the youth of Telangana would gain access to world-class education and research opportunities right within their home state. He added that efforts are underway to elevate Telangana's standing in the education sector to greater international heights. The Chief Minister revealed plans to collaborate with international organizations on initiatives such as academic courses, certification programs, joint research, the establishment

of Centers of Excellence, and specialized training programs for professionals across various sectors. He expressed the view that these measures would further strengthen the state's education and research sectors. Revanth Reddy emphasized that his government's primary objective is to equip Telangana's youth to tackle global challenges. He stated that the government is committed to transforming Hyderabad into a global educational hub by prioritizing skills, sports, and quality education. He further noted that these partnerships would play a pivotal role in achieving the goals of 'Telangana Rising.

Hyderabad, September 1: A photo exhibition titled 'Lies vs. Facts' was held at Gandhi Bhavan to present the public with details regarding the promises made during the ten-year rule of the BRS and the reality of their implementation. Organized under the leadership of Mettu Saikumar, Chairman of the Telangana Fisheries Cooperative Society, the exhibition generated significant interest in political circles. Through photographs and posters, the event illustrated the promises made during the BRS regime alongside the welfare programs currently being implemented by the Congress government. Centered on the theme 'A Decade of Deception' versus 'People's Governance,' the exhibition displayed the status of the previous government's promises on one side and the initiatives undertaken by the current Congress government on the other. Organizers stated that the exhibition was specially designed to allow the public to examine the details firsthand and understand the differences between the two administrations. Speaking on the occasion, Mettu Saikumar alleged that many promises made to the people during the ten-year BRS rule remained unfulfilled. He noted that since assuming power, the Congress government has

Theft of Weapons at Hyderabad Cantonment Sparks Alarm



Hyderabad, September 1: An incident involving the theft of weapons from the Madras Regiment, located within the Secunderabad Cantonment near Hyderabad, has caused a major stir. Officials discovered that unidentified individuals broke into the high-security armory by smashing the locks and stole the weapons. Army officials believe the incident occurred on Sunday night; following a complaint lodged with the Bollaram police on Monday, a case was registered and an investigation is underway. Preliminary information indicates that the stolen weapons include four AK-47 rifles, six pistols, and one INSAS rifle. Officials also noted that ammunition went missing along with the weapons. As this incident involves a highly sensitive matter regarding national security, both Army and police authorities have been placed on high alert. - Concerns over security lapse at the Madras Regiment The Madras Regiment is known for having an extremely stringent security system. Access is restricted solely to authorized military personnel and officers. The occurrence of a weapons theft in such a secure area raises serious questions about the security infrastructure. Given the minimal possibility of outsiders gaining entry, the investigation is proceeding with the suspicion that a staff member might be involved in the incident. Police suspect the involvement of more than one person, considering the number and weight of the stolen weapons. It is believed that those who accessed the armory likely possessed intimate knowledge of the area. Investigators are currently examining available entry and exit records. Immediately after the incident came to light, Army officials sealed the arms storage area and began questioning security personnel, guards, and other staff. Senior officers from the Malkajgiri Police Commissionerate are also overseeing the investigation. CCTV footage from the regiment's vicinity is being collected to scrutinize any suspicious movements. As the matter concerns a defense establishment, the police are keeping the details of the case confidential. The primary challenge facing the investigating agencies is to swiftly locate and recover the stolen weapons and apprehend the individuals responsible. An Army internal inquiry is running parallel to the police investigation into this incident, which has implications for national security.

Fee Reimbursement Arrears Must Be Released Immediately: Harish Rao



- Government accused of playing with students' future
- Concern expressed over financial crisis facing private degree and PG colleges
- Warning issued to fight the issue in the Assembly if arrears remain unpaid
- Former Minister receives representation from college managements

Hyderabad, September 1: Former Minister and senior BRS leader Harish Rao criticized the Congress government for jeopardizing students' futures by failing to release fee reimbursement arrears for months. He termed it shameful that a government which boasts of a world-class education system has failed to release these funds on time. He made these remarks after receiving a representation from representatives of the Telangana Private Degree & PG Colleges Management Association, who explained their grievances. Harish Rao noted that private degree and PG colleges across the state are facing severe financial distress due to the failure to release fee reimbursement funds on schedule over the past two and a half years. He highlighted the inability to pay salaries to teaching and non-teaching staff for months and stated that managements are under immense pressure, unable to cover rents, electricity bills, university fees, and other operational expenses. Harish Rao alleged that due to the government's negligent attitude, the number of private degree colleges in the state has dropped from around 960 to approximately 650. He noted that about 310 colleges have already closed down and warned that if this situation persists, more educational institutions face the risk of closure. He expressed concern that students from rural areas would be the ones to suffer the most. He pointed out that since government colleges are limited in small towns, mandals, and rural areas, private colleges serve as the primary providers of higher education for students from poor and middle-class backgrounds. He remarked that the closure of a single college effectively deprives hundreds of students of access to higher education. He also highlighted that fee reimbursement is a crucial lifeline for students belonging to SC, ST, BC, and minority communities, as well as those from economically backward sections. Harish Rao stated that when the BRS government assumed office, there were outstanding fee reimbursement arrears amounting to ₹2,500 crore; the government cleared these dues and continued the scheme. He noted that even during challenging times under KCR's tenure—such as demonetization and the COVID-19 pandemic—fee reimbursement payments were never halted. He mentioned that approximately ₹19,500 crore was paid over a nine-and-a-half-year period, including the arrears inherited from the previous Congress government. Harish Rao alleged that, despite three budget cycles having passed, fee reimbursement arrears amounting to nearly ₹10,000 crore remain pending. They demanded the immediate and full release of pending funds. They urged the government to implement a permanent mechanism to release fee reimbursements for each academic year within a stipulated timeframe, thereby preventing the accumulation of arrears in the future. They warned that if the government failed to respond regarding the release of arrears, they would wage a vigorous fight in the Assembly and bring the proceedings to a standstill.

Congress High Command Focuses on Konda Surekha Issue



New Delhi, September 1: Amidst recent developments within the Telangana Congress, the party high command appears to be focusing its attention on state politics. Chief Minister Revanth Reddy reportedly met with AICC General Secretary KC Venugopal on Tuesday to discuss the current political situation in the state. Party sources revealed that the meeting lasted for over an hour. The discussion reportedly covered the programs undertaken and welfare schemes implemented as the Congress government in the state approaches the milestone of 1,000 days in office, alongside a review of the political climate. Issues concerning Minister Konda Surekha and Planning Commission Vice-

Chairman Chinna Reddy—both of whom have recently been at the center of controversies—were also reportedly discussed. Meanwhile, Minister Konda Surekha has arrived in Delhi following a summons from the Congress high command. She is scheduled to meet AICC General Secretary KC Venugopal. It is also reported that she has sought an appointment with Congress National President Mallikarjun Kharge. Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud are already in Delhi, joined by Ministers Uttam Kumar Reddy and Tumala Nageswara Rao, as well as Assembly Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar. Comments made by Sushmita—daughter of Minister Konda Surekha—

regarding Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Parkal MLA Revuri Prakash Reddy during a recent event in Geesukonda, Warangal district, have sparked political debate. The TPCC Disciplinary Committee issued a show-cause notice to Konda Surekha seeking an explanation regarding this matter, and she subsequently submitted her response to the committee. Additionally, reports indicate that a dossier concerning Planning Commission Vice-Chairman Chinna Reddy—related to affairs in Wanaparthy—has been submitted to the TPCC high command. Party sources state that the central leadership is currently reviewing the Disciplinary Committee's reports on both these issues. Amidst these developments, political discussions within the Telangana Congress have intensified, with keen interest surrounding the decision the high command might take regarding the Konda Surekha episode. Meanwhile, political circles believe that discussions on key matters such as a cabinet reshuffle and the filling of nominated posts are also underway during the meetings in Delhi.

Tripartite Partnership Strengthened for Research in the Critical Minerals Sector



Hyderabad, September 1: Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu called for strengthening the tripartite partnership to position Telangana at the forefront of critical minerals research, mineral exploration, and advanced technology development. He made these key suggestions during a meeting held on Tuesday at Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Praja Bhavan with representatives from Monash University, IIT Hyderabad, and Singareni Collieries Company Limited. Discussions during the meeting covered critical minerals research, mineral resource exploration, and the development of modern extraction and refining technologies. It was decided to formulate an action plan enabling research organizations,

academic institutions, and public sector undertakings to collaborate effectively, keeping future industrial needs in mind. The Deputy Chief Minister expressed his vision for Telangana to emerge not merely as a consumer of critical minerals but as a pivotal hub for research, innovation, technological advancement, and the manufacturing of value-added products. He suggested taking measures to ensure the state achieves distinct recognition in this sector by meeting world-class standards. Bhatti Vikramarka emphasized the need to further strengthen the Centre of Excellence established at IIT Hyderabad and to develop commercial-grade technologies beneficial to industries. He assured that the government would provide full

support and the necessary encouragement for research activities in this direction. It was observed during the meeting that critical minerals are vital for sectors such as renewable energy, electric vehicles, battery storage systems, and electronics manufacturing. The need for scientific research and technological innovations to meet future demands in these fields was highlighted. A decision was taken to strive towards making Telangana a national leader in the critical minerals sector through international partnerships, research-driven development, and technology transfer. Representatives from Monash University, IIT Hyderabad, and Singareni, along with concerned officials, participated in the meeting.



Rs 1 Crore Accident Insurance Cheque for



Hyderabad, September 1: The people's government has extended its support to the family of an electricity employee who lost his life while performing his duties. The government provided Rs 1 crore in accident insurance assistance to the family of Shankar Reddy, a Grade-2 employee under Transco (Huzurabad division), who died in an accident on



October 1, 2025. Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu handed over the Rs 1 crore insurance cheque to Shankar Reddy's wife, Boda Swathi, at Praja Bhavan on Tuesday. On this occasion, Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka spoke with the bereaved family members and inquired about their situation. He asked about the family's current circumstances, the children's education, and future needs, assuring them that the government would always stand by the families of its employees. Bhatti Vikramarka noted that the insurance assistance provided to Shankar Reddy's family would offer some measure of financial security for their future. He advised them to utilize the insurance amount wisely for family needs, the children's education, and future plans. He also recalled the services rendered by the employee. The Deputy CM stated that employees in the electricity department face numerous challenges while providing uninterrupted services to the public. gress. The Collector reviewed the targets and current progress of constructing farm ponds, soak pits, and borewell recharge pits across all mandals and villages in the district. He inquired about the status of works that had not yet commenced and those currently under construction, expressing dissatisfaction that the work was not proceeding in line with the set targets. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector stated that the primary objective of the "Telangana Jalasiri" program is to enhance groundwater levels in rural areas by effectively utilizing the VBG Ramji scheme. He instructed officials to ensure the construction of

farm ponds, soak pits, and borewell recharge pits in every mandal and village according to the prescribed targets. He further ordered them to accelerate the pace of work and ensure completion within the stipulated deadline. The Collector directed officials to identify suitable locations in every village by actively involving the public and farmers. He instructed them to formulate plans for constructing soak pits at every household, farm ponds in agricultural fields, and recharge pits near borewells. He ordered the immediate issuance of necessary administrative sanctions to commence construction work. He advised

accelerating the excavation of farm ponds with the cooperation of farmers and ensuring continuous field-level monitoring to meet village-wise targets. He stated that a specific action plan should be prepared for each mandal and that the progress of works should be reviewed regularly. He emphasized the need to immediately start pending projects and expedite those currently in various stages of execution. Collector Koya Sriharsha remarked that the "Telangana Jalasiri" program is crucial for groundwater augmentation and rainwater conservation. He instructed officials to ensure high-quality completion of all works aimed at increasing water availability in rural areas. ZP CEO Narendar, District Rural Development Officer Kalindini, District Panchayat Officer Srimala, MPDOs, Mandal Panchayat Officers, and officials from relevant departments participated in the meeting.

Collector Conducts Surprise Inspection at Ekalavya School

Land Survey Work Must Be Completed Expeditiously: Collector Sandeep Kumar Jha



Jangaon, September 1: District Collector Sandeep Kumar Jha stated that Jangaon district is at the forefront of implementing the land survey program within the erstwhile Warangal district. He directed officials to complete the survey work with the same momentum, ensuring greater efficiency and quality. He issued several key instructions during a review meeting held on Tuesday at the District Integrated Collectorate. Accompanied by Additional Collector (Revenue) Benshalom, the Collector met with land and survey officials to review

the progress of the survey in the district. He made it clear that the government-mandated land survey targets must be achieved by November 30. He advised officials to execute every phase systematically and not to compromise on the quality of the work. To further accelerate the survey operations, the Collector ordered the immediate initiation of the procurement process for five additional rover devices. He instructed officials to expedite the tendering process and make the equipment available for use. He also directed that an action

plan be formulated to ensure that 20 to 25 acres are surveyed daily. Instructions were issued to extensively utilize the services of licensed surveyors for the land survey and to assign two surveyors to each village. It was directed that notices be issued and appropriate action taken against surveyors who fail to report for duty or do not carry out their assigned tasks. Officials were instructed to provide special training to additional staff and to organize the survey process by dividing the workforce into 12 teams to ensure coordinated execution. The Collector ordered the preparation of a clear action plan to complete priority survey tasks within 20 days. Emphasis was placed on ensuring accuracy, transparency, and quality throughout the survey process. Instructions were given to take all necessary measures to maintain clear land records in the district. Officials were directed to prepare and submit a map for the 123 acres of land under the SC Corporation across six mandals. It was specified that the process of subdividing this land into 72-square-yard plots must be carried out in accordance with the regulations. Survey and Lands AD Manyamkonda, SC Corporation AD Madhavilatha, surveyors, and other officials participated in the meeting.
