New Delhi, September 7 : Significant strides are being made to further expand bilateral relations between India and Luxembourg. Lex Delles, Luxembourg's Minister for the Economy, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises,

Energy, and Tourism, met with Dr. Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of State for Science and Technology and Earth Sciences, to hold extensive discussions on cooperation opportunities between the two nations. The Luxembourgish Minister proposed moving forward by identifying specific partnership opportunities, particularly in the space sector. Speaking on the occasion, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh noted that the friendly ties between India and Luxembourg create a conducive environment for strengthening cooperation in new sectors. He expressed the view that both nations could benefit from fostering mutual partnerships in the fields of

science and technology. He highlighted that India's achievements in the space sector have garnered global attention and noted the significant potential for joint initiatives in this area. During the meeting, new opportunities in artificial intelligence, quantum technologies, life sciences, and the commercial space sector were explored. Both sides agreed on the importance of sharing experiences and expertise, given the pivotal role these sectors play in the development of future technologies. They also discussed opportunities for undertaking collaborative projects that foster economic growth through research and innovation. Jitendra Singh emphasized the need for constructive cooperation between Indian research institutions, startups, and industries and their counterparts in Luxembourg. He noted that joint research programs, skill exchanges, and scientific partnerships would create more opportunities for young scientists from both nations.

Collector inspects EVM Godown



Special focus on security of EVMs
- Instructions to officers on enforcement of regulations
- Review on the performance of CC cameras

Bhadradi Kothagudem, September 7, Bhadradi Kothagudem District Collector Ankit IAS inspected the EVM godown near Kothagudem RDO office on Monday as part of quarterly inspections. In this inspection conducted to check the security of EVMs and VVPATs, which are very important in the election process, the godown seal was checked first. Later, in the presence of representatives of political parties and election officials, the godown was opened and the rooms where the machines were stored were thoroughly inspected. On this occasion, the Collector examined whether the security standards were properly implemented in the rooms where the EVMs and VVPATs were kept. The officials have been advised to take action without any negligence regarding the safety of the machines. After the inspection was completed, the godown was re-sealed and the relevant procedures were followed. The collector also inspected the condition of the godown building. They inquired whether there were any leakages in the building and



whether there were adequate arrangements to prevent any damage to the machines during monsoons. The officials were directed to examine whether the fire fighting equipments installed for the prevention of fire are available and whether they are working properly and to take early measures to face emergency situations. Later, the Collector visited the control room of the CCTV cameras and reviewed the performance of the surveillance system installed in the vicinity of the godown. Check whether the cameras are working continuously and monitoring is being done so that every area is clearly visible. Strict security measures are advised to prevent unauthorized persons from entering the godown. The Collector made it clear that all the rules laid down by the Election Commission regarding the security of EVMs and VVPATs must be followed. The security personnel are advised to perform their duties constantly and keep the godown surroundings clean. He said that there is no need to compromise on the security of election equipment. After the inspection, Collector Ankit entered the inspection details in the register and signed. Kottagudem RDO Madhu, Election Superintendent Ranga Prasad, Congress Party representative Laxman Aggarwal, representatives of various political parties, election personnel Naveen, security personnel and others participated in the programme. The authorities have decided to continue strengthening all security measures to increase public confidence in the election process.

Approval for Major Defense Force Acquisitions



New Delhi, September 7: The Defence Acquisition Council has taken a crucial decision to further strengthen the country's defense capabilities. The Council approved capital acquisition proposals worth over Rs 1.10 lakh crore for the defense forces. This decision paves the way for the Army, Navy, and Air Force to acquire state-of-the-art equipment and weapon systems. The proposals were cleared during a meeting of the Defence Acquisition Council chaired by De-

fence Minister Rajnath Singh. Discussions focused on key aspects of modernizing the respective forces, keeping national security requirements in mind. Officials stated that these decisions were taken with the aim of bolstering the defense system to effectively tackle future challenges. Reports indicate that priority will be given to these acquisitions to enhance the operational capabilities of the Indian Armed Forces while simultaneously boosting the

indigenous defense manufacturing sector. Developing defense products in partnership with domestic industries will also contribute to achieving the goal of 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-Reliant India). Experts note that the need for defense equipment featuring cutting-edge technology is rising, given the current geopolitical and strategic landscape. It is believed that the decisions taken in this context will significantly strengthen the country's defense system. These acquisitions are set to enhance capabilities regarding border security, maritime defense, and aerial surveillance. Defense sources indicated that the proposals approved by the Defence Acquisition Council include various weapon systems, modern equipment, and technological resources. It is anticipated that these measures will not only improve the operational capabilities of the armed forces but also enhance their ability to respond swiftly during emergencies.

Delhi High Court Concerned Over Building Collapse

New Delhi, September 7 : The Delhi High Court has expressed deep concern over the building collapse incident in the Satya Niketan area of the national capital. The Court remarked that it was extremely unfortunate that several people lost their lives and others were injured in this accident. It urged the concerned authorities to act responsibly to prevent the recurrence of such incidents. The High Court clarified that building owners alone are not responsible for such accidents; the Delhi Municipal Corporation and Delhi University also bear responsibility. It observed that negligence by officials regarding building safety and the en-



forcement of construction standards contributes to such incidents. The Court specifically highlighted the accommodation issues faced by students coming to Delhi from other regions for their studies. It noted that Delhi University

has failed to provide adequate student hostel facilities. Con-



sequently, it expressed concern that thousands of students are forced to rely on private paying-guest (PG) accommodations. The Court opined that the lack of proper oversight regarding safety standards in private hostels and rented buildings is also a contributing factor to such accidents.

Foundation Stone Laid for ₹110 Crore Development Works at Gauhati University



Guwahati, September 7 : Vice President C.P. Radhakrishnan laid the foundation stone for infrastructure development projects worth ₹110 crore at Gauhati University. Officials stated that these projects were designed with the aim of further strengthening the higher education sector and providing modern facilities to students. University officials, faculty members, and students participated in the event. Among the projects launched, a new academic building serving multiple academic

departments will be a major highlight. The building will be constructed with state-of-the-art facilities, keeping in mind the needs of students and faculty from various departments. Plans have been prepared to ensure the building is conducive to research, teaching, and training activities. To address student accommodation needs, a new boys' hostel as well as a dedicated hostel for international students will be constructed. The initiative aims to enhance the academic environment by providing superior accommodation facilities for students arriving at Gauhati University from within the country and abroad. Development works concerning the university auditorium and the library are also being undertaken as part of this project. Measures are being taken to expand facilities for students and researchers while also

making modern technology accessible to them. The library is set to be modernized and tailored to better serve the needs of the students. Speaking on the occasion, the Vice President emphasized that the development of educational institutions is crucial to the nation's progress. He stated that students can compete at a global level only when they have access to excellent infrastructure alongside quality education. He expressed the view that such projects would help India advance further in the higher education sector. Once the ongoing development works at Gauhati University are completed, students, faculty, and researchers will have access to significantly improved facilities. Officials expressed optimism that these projects would enable the university to reach greater heights in the fields of education and research.



YouTuber Nandana Arrested

♦ Hyderabad, September 7 : Popular YouTuber Nandana was detained by the police at Rajiv Gandhi International Airport in Shamshabad. As a lookout notice had already been issued against her, immigration officials identified her and alerted the airport police. She was subsequently handed over to the Ibrahimpatnam police, who are investigating the case. This incident has become a topic of discussion across the state. According to police details, there are allegations that Nandana and her husband collected large sums of money from several people by promising to secure jobs for them in London. The Ibrahimpatnam police registered a case based on complaints from victims who claimed they were defrauded under the pretext of overseas employment. An investigation into this matter has been ongoing for some time. It is reported that a lookout notice was issued against Nandana as part of the investigation. Suspecting she might attempt to travel abroad, the police had been monitoring her movements. Against this backdrop, when she arrived at Shamshabad Airport on Monday, immigration officials identified her and immediately informed the police. Upon receiving the infor-

mation, the airport police detained Nandana and completed the nec-



essary verification procedures. Subsequently, the matter was handed over to the Ibrahimpatnam police, who have registered a case and initiated an investigation. It is understood that the police are preparing to gather further details from her. The police are also focusing on the number of victims and the total amount of money collected in this case. The investigation is also examining whether others have been

defrauded under the pretext of overseas employment. Reports in-



dicating that officials are conducting a thorough probe into the roles played by both Nandana and her husband. Full details regarding the incident are yet to emerge. The police are continuing the investigation by examining complaints from victims, evidence of financial transactions, and other proofs. Officials stated that further action would be taken based on the facts revealed during the investigation.

Massive Road Blockade in Mahabubnagar Protesting Congress Rule

- **Former Minister V. Srinivas Goud condemns the arrest of BRS MLAs**
- **Allegation that the government is preventing discussion on public issues**

Mahabubnagar, September 7 : BRS party leaders, led by former Minister V. Srinivas Goud, staged a massive road blockade in Mahabubnagar district headquarters, alleging that the Congress government failed to fulfill promises made to the public during its tenure. The protest was organized to condemn the police action of intercepting and arresting BRS MLAs

on the occasion, V. Srinivas Goud criticized the Congress government for stifling the opposition's voice and preventing discussions on public issues. He stated that the illegal arrest of public representatives—who were heading to the Assembly to question the implementation of promises and speak on behalf of the people—was undemocratic. He alleged that the government is misusing official machinery to prevent the exposure of its failures. Srinivas Goud lashed out at the police for their conduct, noting that they disregarded the fact that some of the legislators were women; he described actions such as forcibly

pensions, fee reimbursement, and issues concerning farmers, employees, and teachers. He criticized the government for attempting to conceal its failures by obstructing BRS members from discussing these matters in the Assembly, alleging that the right to question the government on public issues is being trampled upon. BRS leaders remarked that while the opposition fights for public welfare, the government is acting in an autocratic manner. They asserted that it is inappropriate for the government—which ought to be resolving public grievances—to instead file cases against and arrest those who raise these issues. They reminded the government of its responsibility



and MLAs who were on their way to attend Assembly sessions. A large number of party leaders and activists participated, raising slogans against the government. Speaking

The BRS leaders demanded the immediate implementation of promises made to the people and called for an opportunity to discuss public issues in the Assembly. They warned that obstructing public representatives who voice the people's concerns would not solve problems and declared that they would intensify their struggle on behalf of the public. They made it clear that they would organize widespread public movements in the coming days, and Malingappa (SA/B.Ed Association)—along with teachers such as Narasimhamurthy and Surendra.



AI poses a threat to human intellect: Ram Gopal Varma

- Risk of thought-based jobs disappearing
- A difficult future awaits those who fail to embrace AI
- Director draws parallels with the Industrial Revolution
- Varma's post goes viral on social media



Hyderabad, September 7 : Maverick director Ram Gopal Varma has once again made sensational remarks in his signature style. Responding to the global discourse surrounding Artificial Intelligence (AI), he opined that human intellect and creativity could face severe challenges in the future. He warned that just as the Industrial Revolution once impacted jobs reliant on physical labor, AI is now poised to affect jobs based on intellectual thought. Varma shared a detailed post regarding this on the social media platform 'X'. He stated that the jobs of those who fail to understand and utilize AI in time would be the first to be at risk. He explained that technology is designed to simplify human life, with its primary goals being the reduction of physical labor and the saving of time. Varma observed that humans always desire more leisure time, and AI is moving towards providing that freedom on a much larger scale. However, he also pointed out that this development would simultaneously give rise to new challenges. He stated that as technological progress accelerates, humans must adapt their skills accordingly. In his post, Varma highlighted that a human being's two primary assets are physical strength and the thinking brain. He remarked that while the Industrial Revolution significantly reduced the need for physical strength, AI is now impacting tasks that rely on cognitive ability, describing this as another pivotal turning point in technological evolution.

Varma expressed concern, touching upon the idea that "getting what one desires can sometimes turn into a danger." He noted that humans have long sought more leisure and less work; while AI is steering the world in that direction, he suggested that the implications of this shift require careful consideration. These comments have sparked widespread discussion on social media. Varma's remarks have gone viral, prompting netizens to express diverse opinions on topics such as the future of AI, its impact on jobs, and the role of human intellect. While some believe technology should be embraced as an opportunity, others suggest proactively assessing the challenges it presents.



Tata Madhu Clarifies His Remarks

- Clarifies that comments were not directed at the Speaker- Accuses Congress of deliberate malicious propaganda
- MLC states his anger was directed at the police's conduct
- Political heat continues within the Assembly premises

Hyderabad, September 7: Congress leaders have leveled severe criticism against BRS MLC Tata Madhu, alleging that he made inappropriate remarks regarding Assembly Speaker Gaddam Prasad. Dalit MLAs from the Congress party have demanded his removal from the MLC post. Ruling party leaders opined that speaking in a manner that insults the Speaker's office undermines the dignity of the legislature. Responding to these allegations, Tata Madhu clarified that he had not made any inappropriate comments directed at Speaker Gaddam Prasad or Legislative Council Chairman Gutta Sukhender Reddy. He stated that he holds the Speaker's office in high regard. He remarked that his comments were being misinterpreted and turned into a political controversy. Tata Madhu alleged that the police had behaved rudely towards BRS women MLAs and other public representatives during an incident at the Assembly gate. He explained that his anger was directed at the police officers who had pulled his trousers and attempted to choke him during that confrontation. He criticized the Congress party for attempting to gain political mileage by attributing remarks made during a highly tense situation to the Speaker. Tata Madhu lashed out at the Congress party, accusing it of deliberately spreading malicious propaganda against him. He alleged that instead of addressing the core issues, the party was twisting his remarks in an attempt to mislead the public. He maintained

Outrage Among Women MLAs at the Assembly



- BRS terms the incident a 'Black Day' in Assembly history
- Sunitha Laxma Reddy alleges her saree was pulled
- Demand for an apology from CM Revanth Reddy
- Criticism that the incident insults the dignity of the state's women

Hyderabad, September 7 : BRS women MLAs expressed severe outrage over an incident that occurred at the Assembly entrance. Speaking to the media, Narsapur MLA Sunitha Laxma Reddy and former Minister Sabitha Indra Reddy alleged that women public representatives were humiliated within the precincts of the Assembly. They stated that such an incident had never been witnessed in the history of the Legislative Assembly and declared that they consider this day a 'Black Day.' They criticized the police for behaving atrociously, disregarding the fact that they were women. Sunitha

Laxma Reddy alleged that the police obstructed them while they were trying to enter the Assembly and that her saree was pulled during the ensuing scuffle. She remarked that this was not merely a

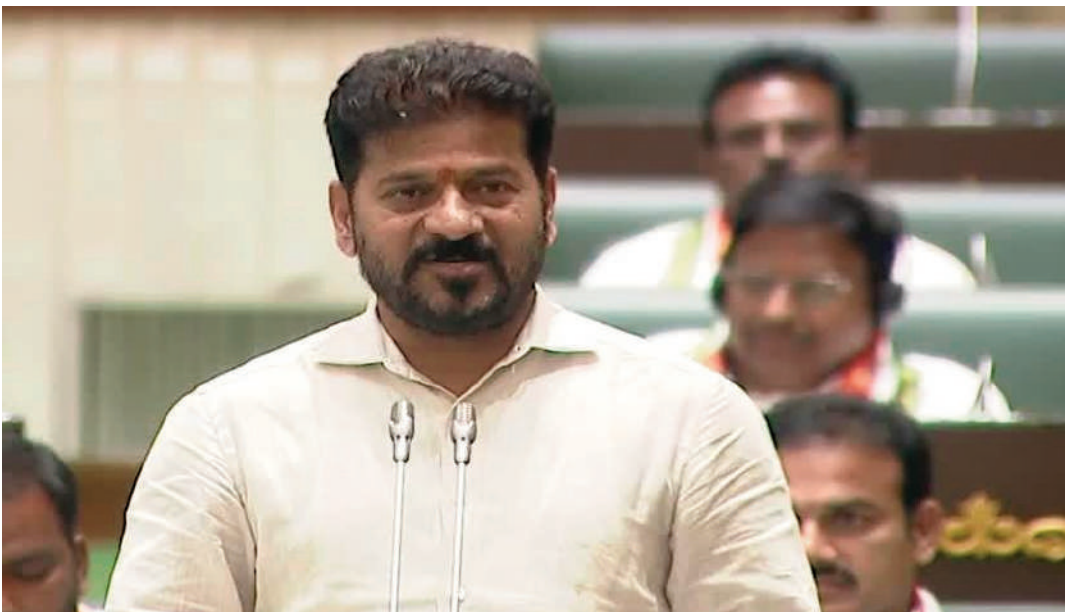
personal insult but an issue concerning the self-respect of women across the state. Expressing her anguish, she noted that facing such a situation was painful for a woman leader who has been active in public life for many years. She stated that obstructing them when they had come to speak about public issues was contrary to democratic values. BRS leaders alleged that the government is attempting to suppress the opposition because it is unable to answer questions regarding the implementation of promises made to the public. They criticized the government for deliberately creating obstacles to prevent them from questioning its failures within the Assembly. Sabitha Indra Reddy stated that their MLAs were prevented from even reaching the Assembly gates due to the slogans printed on the black T-shirts they were wearing. She remarked that trampling upon the rights of the opposition is inappropriate in a

democracy. BRS women MLAs demanded that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy take responsibility for the incident at the Assembly, expressing suspicion that it occurred under his direct orders. They called upon the Chief Minister to offer a public apology to all the women of the state and asserted that the voice of the people cannot be suppressed by humiliating public representatives. Sabitha Indra Reddy questioned whether a "police raj" (police rule) is prevailing in the state. She strongly condemned incidents such as the pulling of women MLAs by their hair and sarees, warning that the tendency to stifle dissenting voices poses a threat to democracy. She noted that if such an attitude towards women public representatives persists, it raises concerns regarding the safety of ordinary women as well. BRS leaders questioned how the state could ensure the safety of its women when even female members visiting the Assembly lack protection. They demanded respect for the rights of the opposition within the democratic system and called for measures to prevent the recurrence of such incidents. They affirmed that this incident would remain a blot on the history of the Assembly and declared that their struggle on behalf of the people would continue. Yadav, Tahsildar Maruti, Jaipal Yadav, Suresh, Naveen, Pavan, and others participated in the event, which saw enthusiastic participation from hundreds of students.

CM Outraged Over Insult to Speaker

- Revanth demands dismissal of the member
- CM emphasizes the need to uphold the dignity of legislative bodies
- Allegation that comments against the Speaker were premeditated
- Insists KCR must take responsibility

Hyderabad, September 7 : Chief Minister Revanth Reddy expressed strong indignation over the remarks made by BRS MLC Tata Madhu within the Assembly premises. He remarked that the office of the Speaker had never before faced such an insult in the history of independent India. He stated that such incidents must be treated seriously to safeguard the dignity of legislative bodies. The CM voiced these views during a special discussion on the matter in the House. Revanth Reddy mentioned that while he had observed the proceedings of various legislative assemblies, he had never witnessed such objectionable language being used against a Speaker. He made it clear that the Speaker's office holds a special place of respect in a democracy and that actions insulting



this office are intolerable. He warned that tolerating such behavior would damage the prestige of legislative bodies. The CM demanded strict action against the member who used the offensive language and called for his dismissal from the House. Furthermore, he demanded that former Chief Minister KCR ensure the member's resignation. He emphasized the need for public representatives to conduct themselves responsibly. The Chief Minister stated that the government had decided to hold a discussion regarding the insult faced by the Speaker after the Legislative Assembly reconvened following the adjournment. However, he noted that BJP members insisted on discussing the '22A' issue first. He criticized the stance taken by the BJP members in this regard, remarking that it was inappropriate for them to sup-

port the actions of BRS leaders. Revanth Reddy remarked that the day the Speaker was insulted would go down in history as a dark day for Telangana. He described the incident as an affront to the self-respect of the four crore people of Telangana. He reminded everyone that every member bears the responsibility of upholding the dignity of the legislature and stated that making personal attacks against the Speaker goes against democratic traditions. The Chief Minister alleged that the incident was not spontaneous but was the result of a premeditated plan; he criticized KCR for gathering his party MLAs and inciting them against the Speaker. He asserted that the public is observing these attempts to disrespect the legislature and affirmed the government's commitment to upholding democratic values.



that he had done nothing wrong in this matter and asserted that the people were observing the facts. Tata Madhu criticized the government for sidelining public issues in the Assembly and limiting itself to political allegations. He stated that the Congress government had manufactured this controversy because it lacked the courage and capability to discuss the problems faced by the people. He alleged that the issue was being blown out of proportion solely to divert attention from public grievances. Tata Madhu remarked that it was inappropriate to portray the questioning of police misconduct as an insult to the Speaker. He criticized Congress leaders for engaging in "politics over dead bodies" for the sake of political gain. He made it clear that there was no question of being intimidated by the demands being raised against them. The ongoing exchange of allegations and counter-allegations between the ruling and opposition parties has further intensified the political atmosphere within the Assembly premises.

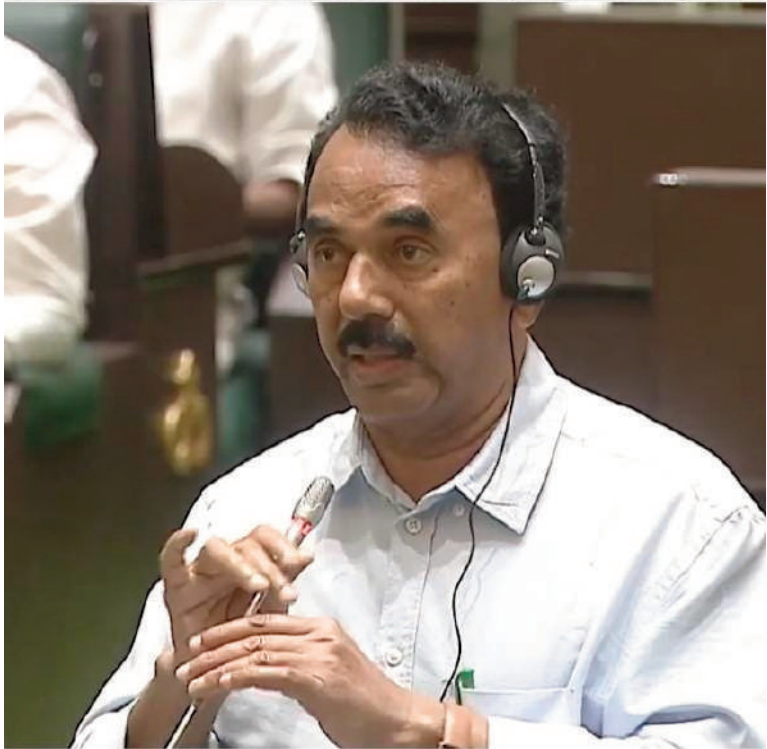

BRS leaders raised strong objections when the police, deployed in large numbers at the main gate, made it clear that members wearing black T-shirts would not be allowed inside. 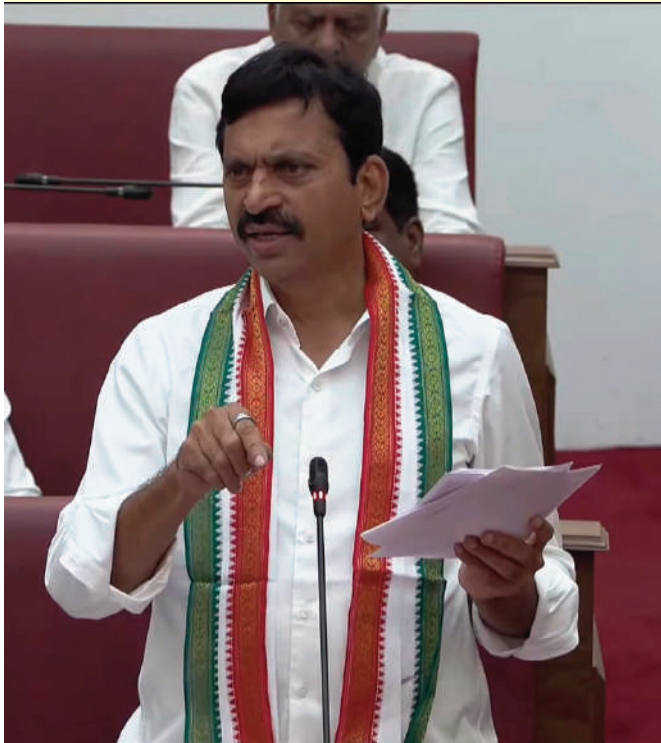

Bhadradri Kothagudem, September 7 : A significant step forward has been taken towards establishing a greenfield airport in Bhadradri Kothagudem district. A multi-disciplinary technical team from the Airports Authority of India (AAI) arrived in the district to assess the technical feasibility of the proposed sites

and has commenced a field-level study. As part of a two-day visit, the team is evaluating land suitability, geographical conditions, and infrastructure potential across various locations. Led by Bharat Reddy, the team visited areas including Seetampet, Sujatanagar, Dummugudem, Chaparalapalli, Palvancha, Dammapeta, and Penagadapa to study land availability, extent, survey boundaries, suitability for runway construction, and conditions required for flight operations. They also examined the scope for future airport expansion. The team focused on the creation of infrastructure capable of accommodating both small aircraft and large passenger planes. A technical study is currently underway regarding the land, geographical conditions, safety standards, and facilities required for night-time flight operations

necessary to construct a long runway. All aspects essential for the airport's future development are being comprehensively examined. The team is also assessing the potential impact of the nearby electrified coal transport railway line on airport operations. In addition to exploring technical solutions to overcome any obstacles, the team will look into the requirements for obtaining necessary clearances from relevant departments. In this context, the technical team met with Khammam Member of Parliament Ramasahayam Raghurami Reddy and District Collector Ankit at the Singareni Guest House. Public representatives expressed the view that the airport's construction would create new opportunities in the industrial, commercial, and tourism sectors while providing the public with improved transportation facilities. The district administration made the necessary land records, survey details, revenue maps, road connectivity data, and technical information available to the team for their field assessment. Officials stated that a comprehensive technical report would be prepared and submitted to the government following the two-day inspection. Subsequent decisions regarding the establishment of the airport will be based on this report.

Construction of 'Indiramma Towers' in Municipal Corporations Too



Hyderabad, September 07 : State Minister for Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, stated that the government is committed to providing housing for the urban poor, just as it is fulfilling the dream of home ownership for the poor in rural areas. Responding to questions raised by members in the Legislative Council regarding 'Indiramma Houses,' the Minister announced that, in view of land scarcity, multi-storied housing complexes—modeled after the 'Indiramma Towers' being built within the GHMC limits—would also be constructed in municipal corporations such as Nalgonda, Nizamabad, Karimnagar, and Warangal. The Minister clarified that the government's primary objective is to build a 'slum-free' Telangana by identifying every family currently living in huts and providing them with permanent housing. He stated that, in addition to providing Indiramma houses to every eligible family, measures are being taken to facilitate advance loans of up to one lakh rupees through women's self-help groups to ensure the smooth progress of house construction. He added that the government is moving forward with a comprehensive action plan to improve the living standards of the poor. The Minister expressed disappointment over the lack of expected support from the Central Government for the construction of 'Indiramma' houses. He criticized the Centre for failing to sanction even a single house for Telangana so far, despite allocating lakhs of rural houses to other states. He noted that although he and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy had met the Union Minister for Rural Development multiple times to make requests, the expected response was not received. The Minister stated that approvals had been granted for the construction of 4.50 lakh Indiramma houses in the first phase at a cost of ₹22,500 crore. He revealed that sanction letters were handed over to 3,75,750 beneficiaries, and construction work had commenced on 3,28,070 houses. He mentioned that 1,97,537 houses have been completed to date, and the government aims to finish the construction of two lakh houses by the upcoming Dasara festival. The Minister announced that a total of 2.50 lakh Indiramma houses—allocated at a rate of 2,000 per constituency—have been sanctioned in the second phase. He stated that priority is being given in this phase to houses that were sanctioned by previous Congress governments but remained incomplete due to various reasons. He clarified that the process of sanctioning houses for the second phase would be completed by the 20th of this month and handed over to eligible beneficiaries. The Minister stated that the government is providing special concessions for Indiramma houses, which are being built as a symbol of self-respect for the poor. He revealed that cement bags are being supplied at ₹230 each, and measures are being taken to provide steel at subsidized rates soon. Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy stated that two-bedroom houses, which had remained incomplete during the previous government's tenure, are being finished and handed over to beneficiaries, and that necessary basic amenities are also being provided in these colonies. He emphasized that for the poor, a house is not merely a place to live but a symbol of their self-respect.

Hyderabad, September 07 : The Telangana High Court has issued key directives to the state police department not to obstruct MLAs from performing their duties during Assembly sessions. Hearing a petition filed in the wake of incidents that occurred at the main gate of the Assembly on Monday, the Court clarified that there should be no impediments to public representatives

discharging their constitutional responsibilities. It issued notices to the state Home Department seeking a comprehensive report on the incident. The BRS party had approached the High Court alleging that police obstructed its MLAs and MLCs at the Assembly. After examining the issues raised in the petition, the Court observed that elected legislators must be given the opportunity to attend the House and discharge their duties. It noted that participating in legislative proceedings is not only a right of the members but also a responsibility. In this context, the Court issued clear instructions to the state police, stating that they should not obstruct MLAs heading to the Assembly or engage in actions that disrupt the performance of their duties. Acknowledging the significance of the Legislative Assembly within a democratic framework, the court

advised that care be taken to ensure the rights of public representatives are not infringed upon in the name of maintaining law and order. The High Court observed that the Speaker possesses the authority to take legal action in instances where rules are violated. It noted that the Assembly holds independent powers regarding its proceedings and that the responsibility for making decisions concerning members' conduct rests with the Speaker; therefore, police actions must not overstep the boundaries of constitutional institutions. The court directed the Home Department to submit a report detailing the full facts and circumstances surrounding the incident that occurred within the Assembly premises. It sought comprehensive information regarding the day's events, police actions, and the objections raised by public representatives, stating that it would examine the actual situation before making a further decision. After hearing the arguments, the court adjourned the case for two weeks. While ordering the submission of the Home Department's report by that time, the court urged all parties to act responsibly to ensure the protection of democratic values and constitutional rights. This matter has become a subject of discussion within the state's political circles.

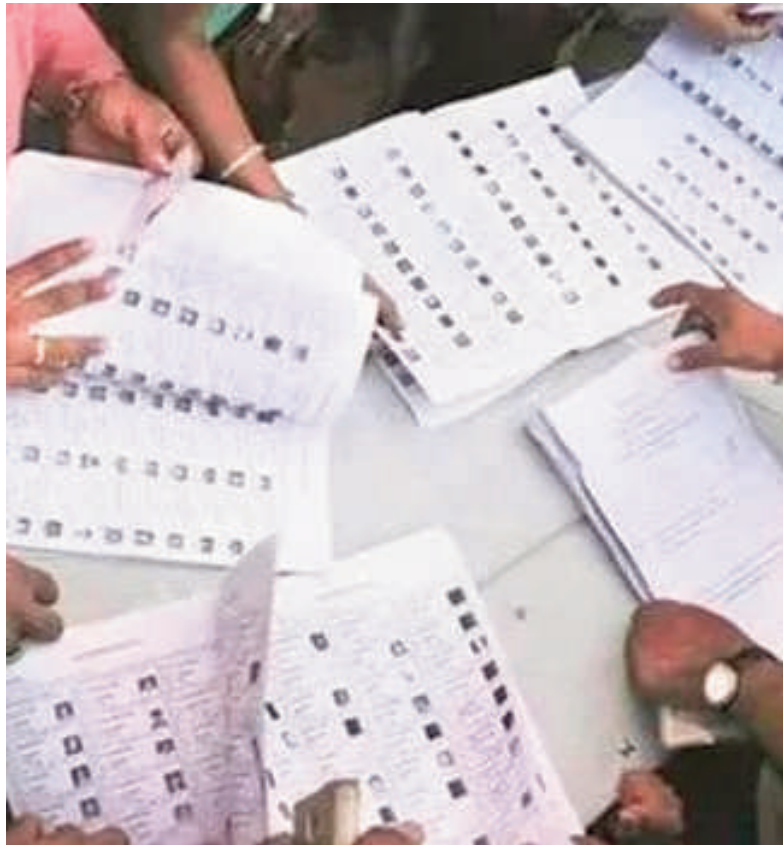

Deadline Extended for Special Voter List Revision in Telangana



- Window for claims and objections open until October 7
- Election Commission of India releases revised schedule
- Final voter list to be published on November 9

Hyderabad, September 07: The Election Commission of India (ECI) has once again extended the deadline for the ongoing Special Summary Revision (SSR) of the voter list in Telangana. A revised schedule has been released, allowing applications for claims, objections, and corrections to the voter list to be submitted until October 7. This provides additional time for the voter registration and revision process across the state. Under the previously announced extended schedule, the deadline for filing claims and objections was set to expire on September 16. However, the state government requested an extension, noting that many voters were still showing interest in correcting their details or registering anew as part of the ongoing special revision program. Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and State Chief Electoral Officer C. Sudarshan Reddy had separately written to the Election Commission of India, urging for an extension of the deadline. After considering the requests from the state government and election officials, the Election Commission of India took a favorable decision. A fresh schedule has been announced extending the deadline for receiving claims and objections until October 7, with the aim of providing greater opportunity to the public. Election officials stated that this decision was taken to ensure that every eligible citizen's name is registered in the electoral roll. Under the new schedule, applications, objections, and requests for corrections will be accepted until October 7. Subsequently, election officials will scrutinize these submissions and conduct inquiries. Final decisions will be made and the electoral roll finalized after verifying eligibility and supporting documents. The Election Commission has already issued instructions to officials to complete this process transparently and in accordance with regulations. This decision provides additional time for youth wishing to register as new voters, individuals whose names are missing from the list, and those seeking to update addresses or correct other details. Election officials are urging political parties, booth-level agents, and election staff to utilize this opportunity to verify the details of eligible voters. The Election Commission of India is set to release the final electoral roll for Telangana state on November 9, following the completion of the process for resolving all claims and objections. Officials note that this special revision program is crucial for preparing a highly accurate electoral roll ahead of the upcoming elections. This move paves the way for a more transparent and comprehensive electoral process across the state.

- Call for cooperation with the police department
- Advice to conduct celebrations in a peaceful atmosphere

Hyderabad, September 07 : Telangana State Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) C. Sudarshan Reddy (IAS) held a video conference on Monday regarding the implementation of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR)-2026 program. Additional Chief Electoral Officer Dr. Vasam Venkateswar Reddy (IAS) and Deputy CEO G.S. Chari participated in the meeting. The Hyderabad District Election Officer (DEO) and GHMC Commissioner, along with DEOs and Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) from all districts across the state, attended the meeting to review the progress of the SIR-2026 implementation. During the session, the CEO focused

specifically on aspects such as the distribution of notices, the conduct of inquiries, and the resolution of pending applications. He directed that every notice be personally delivered to the concerned voter by the Booth Level Officer (BLO). He suggested enlisting the cooperation of Booth Level Agents (BLAs), particularly in urban areas, to help identify voter addresses. He emphasized the need to take measures to ensure there are no lapses in communicating information to voters. The CEO directed officials to effectively utilize the additional login facilities allocated to the districts and resolve pending cases within the stipulated timeframe. He instructed that lists regarding unmapped and anomalous cases be made available to political parties during their meetings. He asked officials to encourage Booth Level Agents (BLAs) to actively participate during the period for examining claims and objections. He ordered BLOs, BLO Supervisors, and Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs) to properly upload documents in accordance with Election Commission guidelines. He warned that the concerned EROs and AEROs would be held account-



able for any errors committed by computer operators. He emphasized the need for accuracy during the data entry and document uploading processes. He directed supervisors to visit the residences of elderly and differently-abled individuals—specifically those living in areas not covered by inquiry centers—to provide necessary services. He also instructed that help desks established at the ERO and DEO levels be made fully operational to assist voters. He stated that the goal should be to facilitate every eligible voter throughout the election process. Subsequently, the CEO held a review meeting with DEOs from all districts regarding the distribution of notices, the inquiry schedule, and the progress in resolving pending cases within ERO and DEO logins. He reviewed the district-wise progress and issued necessary instructions. Nodal officers, the Project Manager (IT), and other election department officials participated in this video conference.

Prompt Resolution Needed for 'Praja Vani' Grievances: Collector Ankit

Bhadradri Kothagudem, September 7: District Collector Ankit (IAS) directed officials to examine every grievance received through the 'Praja Vani' program with utmost priority and resolve them within the prescribed timeframe. Stating that resolving public issues is the government's primary objective, he emphasized that there should be no room for negligence or delay in addressing complaints. He urged officials to act responsibly to uphold the public's trust. During the 'Praja Vani' program held on Monday at the IDOC in the district headquarters, Collector Ankit personally received petitions and complaints from citizens arriving from various areas. People brought issues to his attention regarding land disputes, revenue matters, the implementation of welfare schemes, pension sanctions, housing allotments, employment opportunities, and the provision of basic amenities. He examined each application and forwarded them to the concerned departments for immediate action. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector instructed officials to conduct an in-depth review of every petition received from the public. He advised them to understand the nature of the issues and explore avenues for immediate resolution. He directed that trans-



parency and accountability be maintained in the grievance redressal process and that measures be taken to ensure justice for the public. The Collector emphasized that public grievances should not remain pending due to a lack of coordination between departments. He advised all departments to work collaboratively and regularly review the status of grievance resolutions. Officials were instructed to strictly adhere to the prescribed timelines for resolution and to take steps to avoid causing inconvenience to the public. The Collector stated that the 'Praja Vani' (public grievance) program is being conducted not only at the district headquarters

but also at the mandal level. He informed the public that they could submit representations regarding their issues at the MPDO offices in their respective mandals. He noted that enabling grievance resolution at the local level would save the public both time and money. The Collector advised people to attach relevant supporting documents when submitting their applications, noting that the submission of proper documentation would expedite the resolution process. Collector Ankit (IAS) assured that the district administration is committed to resolving public grievances and will take steps to ensure justice for every petition.



Protests Flare Up in Siddipet

Siddipet, September 7: Political tension has gripped Siddipet following developments at the Assembly. Condemning the arrest of former Minister and MLA Harish Rao, BRS leaders and activists staged a massive road blockade at Ponnala in Siddipet on Monday. A large number of party cadres participated, raising slogans against the government. This caused a temporary disruption to traffic in the area. Party leaders strongly condemned the police for obstructing BRS MLAs and MLCs who were on their way to attend the Assembly session. They alleged that the government's intention was to prevent them from raising public issues in the House. The protesters stated that stifling the voice of the opposition is inappropriate in a democratic system. BRS leaders alleged that the police behaved rudely towards public representatives during the incidents at the main entrance of the Assembly. They expressed outrage over the inappropriate behavior shown towards several members, including women MLAs. They noted that this incident has become a major topic of discussion in state politics. BRS leaders described the arrest of former Minister Harish Rao as an act of political vendetta. They alleged that the government is using the police machinery to intimidate the opposition. They made it clear that attempts to suppress leaders who



question the government on behalf of the people would not be tolerated under any circumstances. Speaking during the road blockade, several leaders termed it unfortunate that political harassment was taking place in the Assembly—a forum meant for discussing public issues. They criticized the obstruction of efforts to raise concerns faced by farmers, the unemployed, and women in the House, describing it as contrary to democratic values. They affirmed that their struggle on behalf of the people would continue. Although a tense atmosphere prevailed for a while during the protest at Ponnala, the police brought the situation under control. Condemning the government's stance, BRS leaders and activists warned that they would intensify their protests. This road blockade in Siddipet has become a topic of discussion within political circles.

Road Inspection in Raghavendra Nagar, Nacharam

Hyderabad, September 7 : With the aim of providing safe and comfortable transportation for city residents, the Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation Commissioner conducted field inspections in the Raghavendra Nagar area of Nacharam. Accompanied by engineering department officials, the Commissioner examined the condition of the roads, the issue of potholes, and the need for repairs. After understanding the difficulties faced by local residents, the Commissioner directed officials to take immediate action to resolve them. During the inspection, the Commissioner identified potholes on the roads and ordered their immediate filling. It was noted that motorists and pedestrians are facing hardships due to road damage caused by the monsoon season. Engineering officials were instructed to focus specifically on all main and internal roads to prevent accidents. The Commissioner emphasized that road repair works must be completed within the stipulated timeframe. He directed that there should be no compromise on the quality of work and that appropriate measures be taken to ensure repaired areas do not deteriorate again. Officials were informed of the



need for continuous monitoring of road maintenance. The Commissioner also stated that complaints received from the public should be addressed on a priority basis. Instructions were issued to gather details regarding potholes and damaged sections of roads and to formulate a com-

prehensive action plan. It was emphasized that road quality is crucial for urban development and directly linked to public safety. Officials revealed that a special plan is being implemented to develop road infrastructure within the Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation limits. Measures are underway to restore roads damaged by rains in a phased manner and to provide better commuting facilities for the public. Officials from the engineering department and relevant staff participated in the inspection. The municipal administration stated that it is working towards the goals of ensuring safe roads, comfortable travel, and the improved development of colonies. They added that urban infrastructure would be further enhanced with the co-operation of the public.

Vinayaka Chavithi Celebrations Must Be Conducted with Devotion and Reverence: Collector

Mulugu, September 7 : District Collector Borkhade Hemant Sahadevrao advised that the Vinayaka Chavithi celebrations be conducted with devotion and in a peaceful atmosphere. He spoke at a co-ordination meeting regarding the arrangements for the festival, held at the conference hall of the Integrated District Offices Complex. He directed officials from relevant departments to accord top priority to law and order, public convenience, and environmental protection during the festivities. The Collector instructed organizers of Ganesh pandals to mandatorily register their details on the Police Department's website and obtain the necessary permissions. He stated that those unable to register online should apply at their respective police stations. He clarified that the setup of pandals should commence only after securing official authorization and urged organizers to cooperate in ensuring the celebrations proceed in a lawful and disciplined manner. The Collector warned against allowing gambling, objectionable speeches, or other undesirable activities at the pandals. He advised that priority be given to devotional and spiritual programs. He also directed that arrangements near sensitive areas—such as mosques, hospitals, and educational institutions—be made in a way that causes no inconvenience to the public. The organizers of pandals lo-



cated near mosques were requested to extend full cooperation during prayer times. The Collector advised that only clay idols of Lord Vinayaka be installed, in the interest of environmental protection. He clarified that DJ sound systems are not permitted and that only devotional songs should be played; this decision was taken to prevent noise pollution and safeguard public health. He appealed to the public to cooperate in conducting eco-friendly celebrations. The Collector ordered strict adherence to electrical safety measures at the pandals. He advised that electrical wiring, switchboards, and lights be installed safely and that only high-quality electrical equipment be used. He stated that the concerned offi-

cials must be informed in advance regarding electrical connections. Additionally, he directed local body officials to ensure proper sanitation, street lighting, and drinking water facilities. The Collector instructed that emergency medical services, ambulances, and fire tenders be kept available during the Vinayaka Chavithi celebrations. He ordered that meetings be held at the mandal level with Tahsildars, Panchayat Secretaries, and Ganesh Utsav committee members to formulate the necessary action plan. Collector Borkhade Hemant Sahadevrao emphasized that officials from all departments must work in coordination to ensure the successful conduct of the Vinayaka Chavithi celebrations.
