



Proud of Vijay: S.A. Chandrasekhar

Review of Security Situation in Kashmir Valley

Srinagar, September 8: Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) Director General G.P. Singh conducted a high-level review meeting on Tuesday as part of his visit to the Kashmir Valley. Senior officials participated in the meeting, held at the Kashmir Operations Sector, to discuss security conditions and various matters related to internal security. During this meeting—held on the second day of the tour—the current security situation in the Valley, the progress of ongoing operations, and future courses of action were reviewed. The DG issued instructions to officials regarding measures to enhance the efficiency of the security apparatus. G.P. Singh emphasized the need for security systems to be technologi-



cally strengthened, keeping in mind the rapidly changing global landscape. He suggested the extensive use of modern technology to effectively tackle challenges in the internal security domain. He stated that maintaining technological superiority in security operations would enable the anticipation and effective handling of future challenges. He directed officials to further strengthen technology, data analysis, and coordi-

nation systems. The DG emphasized that the primary objective is to maintain sustained peace and security in the Kashmir Valley. He directed all security agencies to work in coordination, prioritizing the safety of the people, and stressed the need to remain vigilant in upholding law and order. Several senior officials from the Kashmir Operations Sector participated in the review meeting. Oil prices would plummet if Iran is defeated: Trump

- Trump makes sensational remarks on fuel prices
- Gasoline prices predicted to drop below two dollars
- Political discussion sparked by a post on Truth Social
- Iran issues a stern warning to the US

Washington, September 8 : Recent remarks by US President Donald Trump amidst ongoing tensions with Iran have sparked global discussion. He stated that if the US were to defeat Iran in a conflict, oil prices in the international market would drop drastically. He opined that a decline in fuel prices would provide a new boost to the US economy. These comments by Trump are

generating significant interest in both global energy markets and political circles. In a post on his social media platform, 'Truth Social,' Trump made several key observations. He stated that following a victory over Iran, oil prices would fall rapidly; specifically, he predicted that gasoline prices would drop from current levels to three dollars per gallon and subsequently fall below two dollars. Emphasizing that these changes would occur swiftly, he once again invoked the 'Make America Great Again' slogan. Currently, the average price of gasoline in the US hovers around \$4.15 per gallon. High fuel prices recorded recently around Labor Day have placed a financial burden on American consumers. Meanwhile, in the international market, Brent crude oil is trading



at \$97 per barrel, while West Texas Intermediate (WTI) is trading at \$92 per barrel. Against this backdrop, Trump's predictions have gained added significance. Iran has reacted strongly to Trump's remarks. Iranian Parliament Speaker Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf warned that any attacks targeting the country's energy resources would lead to severe consequences.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh Begins Official Visit to Sri Lanka



- Visit to Sri Lanka from September 8 to 10

Colombo, September 8: Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh arrived in Colombo, the capital of Sri Lanka, on Tuesday for a three-day official visit. This visit, scheduled from September 8 to 10, is expected to play a pivotal role in strengthening bilateral relations between India and Sri Lanka. Discussions regarding defence, security, and strategic cooperation are likely to take place during the visit. The Sri Lankan government accorded a grand welcome to Rajnath Singh upon his arrival at the Bandaranaike International Airport in Colombo. He was welcomed by Sri Lanka's State Minister of Defence, Major General Aruna Jayasekara (Retd.), and the Indian High Commissioner to Sri Lanka, Santosh Jha.

He received a warm welcome in accordance with Sri Lankan traditions. Officials stated that the welcome ceremony was organized to reflect the long-standing friendship and mutual respect



shared by the two nations. Defence cooperation between India and Sri Lanka has been strengthening over the past few years. Both countries are working in coordination on matters such as maritime security, counter-terrorism measures, training programs, and regional security. It is expected that discussions regarding the further expansion of this cooperation will take place during the visit.



India views Sri Lanka as a key partner in strengthening the strategic partnership within the Indo-Pacific region. Against this backdrop, high-level visits are further enhancing mutual trust between the two nations. This visit is set to contribute to the development of bilateral relations. During the visit, Rajnath Singh is likely to meet with the President of Sri Lanka, senior defense officials, and other prominent figures. Discussions are expected to cover defense cooperation, regional security, and matters of mutual interest. Officials are optimistic that this visit will further strengthen India-Sri Lanka relations.

Lathi-charge Follows Protest for Arrears: N. Ramachandra Rao



Hyderabad, September 8 : BJP State President N. Ramachandra Rao expressed strong indignation over the police's conduct during the 'Chalo Assembly' protest organized to demand the release of fee reimbursement arrears. He accused the government of resorting to a crackdown on the agitation held on behalf of lakhs of students awaiting these dues. He visited the BJP activists who were injured in the lathi-charge and were undergoing treatment. Speaking later, Ramachandra Rao criticized the government for its negligence regarding the payment of fee reimbursement arrears. He noted that the government has failed to respond despite approximately

40 lakh students across the state awaiting these payments. He demanded an immediate halt to policies that jeopardize the students' future.

Ramachandra Rao termed it unfortunate that a democratically organized protest demanding the release of fee reimbursement arrears was obstructed. He criticized the government for wielding lathis against protesters instead of resolving the issues, calling such actions contrary to democratic principles. He made it clear that the BJP would never tolerate attempts to suppress the voice of the people. Ramachandra Rao remarked that those injured in the lathi-charge were not merely BJP activists; rather,

the incident represented an attack on the aspirations of Telangana's students. He expressed dismay that the government sought to suppress, through the use of force, a struggle aimed at resolving students' issues. He assured the injured activists that the party would stand by them. He accused the Congress government of attempting to stifle criticism instead of addressing the people's grievances. He made it clear that there would be no compromise regarding students' rights and vowed to continue the agitation until the fee reimbursement arrears were released. He demanded that the government take immediate action on matters concerning student welfare. After inquiring about the health condition of the injured activists, Ramachandra Rao urged the medical staff to ensure they received the best possible treatment. BJP leaders and activists participated in the event. Leaders stated that the party would further intensify its agitation regarding the issue of fee reimbursement arrears.

District Collector Sneha Shabarish Inspects EVM Warehouse

Mahabubabad, September 8 : As part of quarterly inspections, Mahabubabad District Collector Sneha Shabarish inspected the EVM warehouse located near the Collectorate on Tuesday. Relevant officials and representatives from various political parties also participated in the inspection. During the visit, the Collector examined the security arrangements for the Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and VVPAT machines stored in the warehouse. She inquired whether the regulations regarding the safety of election materials were being properly implemented. She inspected the CCTV cameras installed at the warehouse, the duties of the security personnel, and the access control systems, offering several



suggestions to the officials. She directed that all measures be continued in accordance with Election Commission guidelines. She instructed the concerned officials to remain vigilant and ensure there was no room for negligence regarding the safety of the machines. She also empha-

sized the need to consistently maintain cleanliness and safety standards within the warehouse premises. Officials explained the arrangements at the warehouse to the representatives of the political parties. The Collector advised that operations be conducted with transparency to foster public confidence in the election process. Election department officials, security personnel, and representatives from various political parties participated in the inspection. Officials stated that all necessary measures are being continued, placing the utmost importance on the security of election materials.

BRS Files Complaint Seeking Case Against CM Revanth Reddy



Hyderabad, September 8 : BRS State General Secretary R.S. Praveen Kumar lodged a complaint at the Banjara Hills Police Station on Tuesday, seeking the registration of a criminal case against Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. He demanded that an FIR be registered under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). Several BRS leaders and women leaders accompanied him. BRS leaders stated that the complaint sought criminal cases

against both Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Shadnagar MLA Veerlapalli Shankar. They alleged that recent remarks made by them were likely to incite social tensions and urged the police to respond immediately to the matter.

BRS expressed strong objection to the comments made regarding the Telangana movement leader and former Chief Minister KCR. R.S. Praveen Kumar stated that the remarks about KCR were inappropriate and condemned them vehemently. He remarked that while political differences are natural in a democracy, making such comments at a personal level is unacceptable. In the complaint submitted to the police, BRS leaders urged for legal action to be taken regarding this issue. They urged political leaders to act responsibly and refrain from

making remarks that incite the public. They also appealed for measures to ensure that law and order in the state remains undisturbed.

BRS leaders arrived at the Banjara Hills police station and submitted a formal complaint to the officials. Reports indicate that the police accepted the complaint and stated they would examine the legal aspects before taking further action. This development has become a topic of discussion within state political circles. Along with R.S. Praveen Kumar, former MLC Karne Prabhakar and several other BRS leaders—including women leaders—visited the police station. They expressed their protest against the remarks made about KCR. BRS sources indicated that the party is likely to announce its future course of action regarding this issue soon.

Collector Rajarshi Shah Inspects EVM and VVPAT Warehouse

♦ Adilabad, September 8: District Collector Rajarshi Shah inspected the EVM and VVPAT machine warehouse located in Shantinagar on Tuesday as part of a quarterly inspection. He thoroughly examined the arrangements made for the safety and preservation of these machines, which play a crucial role in the conduct of elections. He reviewed the warehouse's management with officials to ensure compliance with the regulations prescribed by the Election Commission. The Collector paid special attention to the security arrangements in place at the warehouse; he inspected the functioning of CCTV cameras, the duties of security personnel, and access control systems, instructing officials to ensure there were no lapses. He directed them to remain vigilant regarding the security of election materials. The Collector also reviewed the cleanliness and hygiene conditions within the warehouse. He advised officials to take precautions to protect the stored machines from moisture, dust, or other adverse factors. He emphasized the strict adherence to all



standards to ensure the machines' functionality remains unaffected. Additionally, the Collector inquired about fire safety measures. He inspected the availability and maintenance status of fire safety equipment and instructed the staff to be prepared for an immediate response in the event of an emergency. Officials were clearly instructed not to compromise on safety standards. The Collector stated that the maintenance and inspection of EVMs and VVPAT machines must be carried out regularly, in accordance with Election Commission guidelines. He directed that records in the

warehouse be maintained properly and that details of every inspection be duly recorded. He emphasized that such inspections are crucial for further strengthening public confidence in the electoral process. Additional Collector R.S. Chithru, District Fire Officer Suresh Kumar, Election Wing Supervisory Officer Nalanda Priya, Naib Tehsildar Madhusudan, and other relevant staff participated in the inspection. Bhadradri Kothagudem, September 8 : Swetha IPS participated in a four-day special training program organized for police trainers from the Bhadradri Zone. The program focuses on the effective management of crowds during festivals, religious events, processions, and other law-and-order-related occasions. Officials stated that the primary objective of the program is to further enhance the capabilities of police personnel. The training highlighted that maintaining law and order during large public gatherings poses a challenge for the police and that specialized skills are required to handle such situations effectively. Training was provided on how to handle various scenarios arising during festivals, political meetings, social events, and protests. Beneficiaries Must Reside in 2BHK Houses: Collector Rizwan Basha Shaik

- Strict action if rented out or sold
- Officials directed regarding vacant houses
- Assurance on providing basic amenities
- Awareness raised on cleanliness and welfare schemes

Gadwal, September 8 : District Collector Rizwan Basha Shaik warned that only the selected beneficiaries must reside in the government-constructed two-bedroom (2BHK) houses and that strict action would be taken against those who rent out or sell them. On Tuesday, he conducted a surprise inspection of the 2BHK housing complex on the town's outskirts alongside officials from various departments and spoke directly to beneficiaries to understand their issues. Touring several blocks, the Collector examined the allotment documents of some beneficiaries and offered necessary suggestions. Observing that some houses were locked, he ordered officials to gather details of beneficiaries who were not residing there. He instructed them to issue notices to such individuals and prepare a



comprehensive list. The Collector urged beneficiaries to make proper use of the government-provided housing. He assured them that measures would be taken to provide necessary basic amenities in the colonies, stating that issues related to roads and streetlights would be resolved. He also mentioned that steps would be taken to soon extend the benefits of the 'Gruha Jyothi' scheme (free electricity) to eligible residents who had not yet received it. During the visit, the Collector met a handloom weaver's family and inquired about the saree weaving process and marketing aspects. He advised all eligible individuals to apply for pensions and urged the public to fully utilize the benefits of government



welfare schemes. The Collector emphasized the need to prioritize cleanliness in the colonies. He suggested forming committees with residents in each block to ensure the surroundings remain clean. He directed officials to take measures for constructing sheds where members of women's self-help groups could sell essential commodities. He also advised clearing overgrown bushes in the area to ensure a hygienic environment. The Collector stated that all eligible homeless individuals should apply, adding that the sanctioning of houses for eligible applicants in the next phase would be considered. He encouraged locals to make good use of the community hall built in the colony. Subsequently, he visited the nearby Indira Mahila Shakti Bhavan and inspected its various sections. Officials who participated in the visit included Housing PD Srinivasa Rao, Panchayat Raj EE Prabhakar, DEs Narendar and Lakshman, Tahsildar Hari Krishna, Municipal Commissioner Janakiram Sagar, and AEE Satish.

Ensure no eligible voter is left off the list: Collector Priyanka



- Accelerate the voter list verification process
- Special focus on notices, verification, and document uploads
- Orders issued to resolve pending cases
- Comprehensive review of details regarding unmapped voters

Dhanwada, September 8 : District Collector Priyanka directed officials to take measures ensuring that not a single eligible voter is omitted from the voter list. On Tuesday, she visited the Gram Panchayat office at the Dhanwada mandal headquarters and reviewed the implementation of the special voter list verification program. She held a meeting with election officials, AEROs, and BLOs to gather details on the ongoing field-level process. The Collector instructed that the voter list verification process be conducted swiftly and transparently. She ordered continuous monitoring

of the number of notices issued daily, the number of necessary documents received, and the status of pending cases. She directed that once notices are issued, the relevant procedures must be completed and details entered into the app without delay. The Collector stated that in instances where an applicant does not need to visit the office, the verification process should be carried out at the field level in accordance with the rules. She emphasized that officials must ensure the proper recording of necessary photographs and verification details, as well as the complete uploading of relevant information to the app. She also advised taking precautions to ensure there are no errors in the process. The Collector inquired about the number of polling stations assigned to each AERO and the details of pending cases within their jurisdictions. She directed officials to focus specifically on resolving pending applications and objections and instructed them to verify whether the BLO declaration and verification processes were being implemented correctly. The Collector emphasized the need to check whether



the voter, the concerned in-charge, and the BLO were taking a group photo—as required by regulations—and uploading it to the app. She instructed officials to examine any one of the eleven prescribed valid documents submitted by voters and proceed with the necessary processing. She ordered a special review of details regarding 'unmapped' voters, directing officials to identify the reasons for incomplete mapping and resolve the issues immediately. She also advised them to clearly identify the number of unmapped cases, pending cases, and other notices, and to formulate a specific action plan to address them. Interacting directly with some voters in the field, the Collector verified whether their details had been correctly mapped to the respective polling stations. She stressed that officials must work in coordination to ensure justice for every eligible voter.

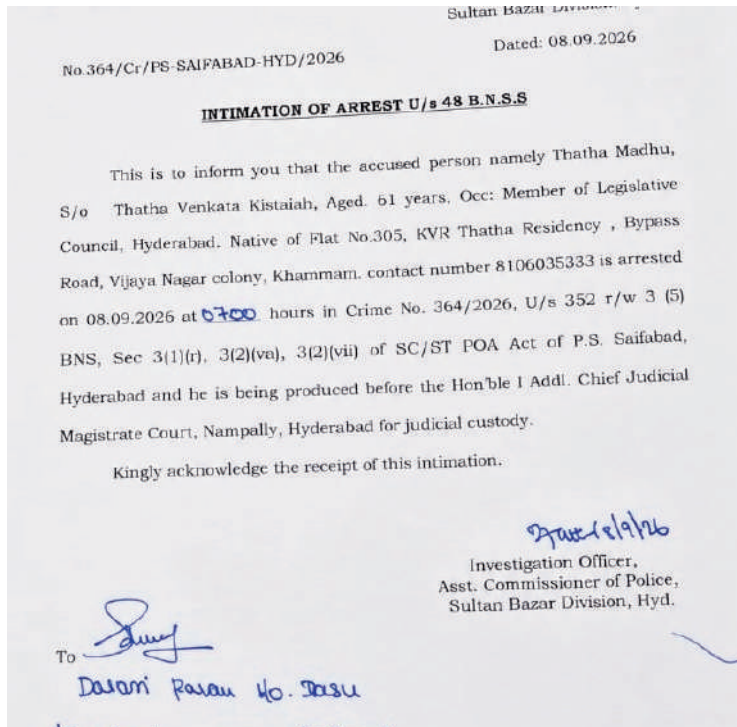


BRS MLC Tata Madhu Arrested



- Action taken following allegations of inappropriate remarks against the Speaker
- Case registered under BNS and SC/ST Atrocities Act
- Police produced him before the Nampally Court
- Tata Madhu denied the allegations

Hyderabad, September 8 : Police arrested BRS MLC Tata Venkata Kishtaiiah, alias Tata Madhu, on Tuesday following allegations that he made inappropriate remarks against Telangana Assembly Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar. He was taken into custody amidst heavy police security at the new MLA quarters in Hyderabad; the situation at the location was tense during the arrest. Along with Tata Madhu, the police also detained BRS MLC Naveen Reddy. Allegations arose that Tata Madhu used inappropriate language directed at the Speaker during a scuffle between BRS public representatives and the police at the Assembly gates on



Monday. Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy reacted strongly to the incident, stating that the language used against the Speaker was an insult to the dignity of the Legislative Assembly and the self-respect of Telangana. He urged Legislative Council Chairman Gutta Sukhender Reddy to dismiss Tata Madhu from his membership in the Legislative Council. According to the arrest intimation released by the Telangana Police, a case (Crime No. 364/2026) has been registered against Tata Madhu under Section 352 read with Section 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). Additionally, cases have been registered under Sections 3(1)(r), 3(2)(va), and 3(2)(vii) of the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act. Police stated that following the arrest, Tata Madhu was produced before the First Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Court in Nampally, Hyderabad. The arrest intimation further noted that proceedings to remand him to judicial custody were initiated thereafter. This development has become a topic of discussion within state political circles. Meanwhile, Tata Madhu has denied the allegations leveled against him. He asserted that he made no derogatory remarks against the Speaker and accused the ruling Congress party of distorting his words. He claimed he was physically assaulted and criticized the police for behaving inappropriately towards female MLAs. BRS leaders are demanding an explanation from the government and the police department regarding this incident. Further proceedings concerning the case will continue in court.

Expedite Land Re-survey Operations: Collector Ankit

Kothagudem, September 8 : District Collector Ankit (IAS) has directed officials to expedite the land re-survey operations. On Tuesday, he inspected the ongoing re-survey work at Survey Number 77 in the Bojya Thanda area of Palvancha Mandal and reviewed the progress of the process with the officials. He instructed them to accurately record land details using modern technological equipment. The Collector observed the process of measuring land and identifying boundaries using 'Rover' devices. He directed officials to precisely determine land extent, boundaries, and location using modern technology and to integrate this data with existing land records. He also ordered that

able records. He directed officials to work towards daily targets and complete the re-survey within three days. He emphasized the need to conduct the survey with transparency and



precautions be taken to ensure no errors occur during the survey. Officials informed the Collector that while a re-survey is required for a total of 458 acres in the Bojya Thanda area, work is cur-

rently underway on 88 acres within Survey Number 77. He inquired about the staff, equipment, and progress regarding the survey of the remaining lands. He further instructed them to formulate an action plan to ensure the work is completed within the stipulated timeframe. The Collector stated that every landowner should verify their land boundaries on the ground and cross-check them with avail-

accuracy to prevent future land disputes. The Collector urged farmers to cooperate by providing their pattadar passbooks, registration documents, and other land records to the survey officials. He noted that indicating the actual land boundaries on the ground would facilitate the survey process and advised that any issues encountered during the survey be immediately brought to the officials' attention. Officials and staff, including Tahsildar Dhara Prasad, surveyors Venkanna and Kalyan, licensed surveyors Madhu, Vamsi, and Kavitha, and GPO Radha, participated in the inspection. Collector Ankit emphasized the need to complete the re-survey process efficiently and ensure that farmers receive clear land records.

Hyderabad, September 8 : Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar became emotional during a discussion in the Telangana Assembly regarding the events that unfolded on Monday. Responding to comments made by former Minister Harish Rao, he stated that remarks directed at his mother had deeply hurt him. The Speaker's statement—"It was my mother who was targeted, not yours"—became a topic of discussion in the House. Harish Rao had criticized the government for its inaction regarding incidents involving BRS MLAs Sabitha Indra Reddy and Sunitha Laxma Reddy. He expressed anger at the government's conduct, alleging that cases had been registered against three BRS women MLAs. In response, Speaker Prasad Kumar clarified that he, like the House, holds women members in high regard. He advised Harish Rao not to get unnecessarily agitated while he was speaking and urged him to act with an understanding of the situation. Speaking emotionally, the Speaker remarked, "It is I who should be angry, not you. It was not your mother who was targeted; it was mine." He reminded the members of the need to maintain decorum and respect within the House. The Speaker stated that he holds BRS MLAs Sabitha Indra Reddy, Sunitha Laxma Reddy, and Kova Lakshmi in high regard. He revealed that he has already directed officials to submit a report regarding the inconvenience caused to them and assured that appropriate action would be taken immediately upon receipt of the report. These developments in the Assembly have sparked discussions within political circles. The Speaker's emotional remarks, made amidst heated exchanges between ruling and opposition members, assumed special significance in the House. Further action will follow the submission of the report concerning the incident involving the women MLAs.

Tension at KCR's Erravalli Farmhouse



- Congress and Dalit groups attempt to lay siege to the farmhouse
- Heavy police deployment
- Arrest of several BRS leaders, including KTR and Harish Rao
- Congress cadres stage protest accompanied by the beating of traditional drums

Erravalli, September 8: High tension prevailed on Tuesday as Congress activists and leaders of Dalit organizations arrived in large numbers to lay siege to former Chief Minister KCR's farmhouse in Erravalli. Following the Congress party's call to stage a protest involving a thousand traditional drummers, the police had arranged heavy security. Tension mounted when protesters heading towards the farmhouse were intercepted en route. The Congress party organized this protest against the BRS, alleging insults directed at the Dalit community. Congress workers and Dalit group leaders from the Gajwel constituency and various other parts of the state reached Erravalli. Police stopped the group as they ap-

proached the farmhouse via Varadarajapur. Upon being blocked by the police, the protesters staged a demonstration accompanied by the loud beating of drums. When they attempted to remove the barricades and move forward, the police pushed them back, resulting in a scuffle between the police and the protesters. Reports indicate that some police personnel sustained minor injuries while attempting to bring



the situation under control. Tensions prevailed near the farmhouse for approximately two and a half hours. During this time, po-

lice detained several Congress leaders, including former Gajwel MLA Narsa Reddy. A large number of security personnel were deployed in the vicinity of the farmhouse to prevent any untoward incidents. Meanwhile, police intercepted and detained BRS leaders—including KTR and Harish Rao—along with several MLAs who were traveling from the Assembly to Erravalli, at Hakimpet. BRS leaders expressed strong objections to the police's actions; KTR alleged that the police were



acting in a manner that favored Congress activists. Subsequently, KTR was taken to the Bowenpally police station, while Harish Rao was moved to the Jawaharnagar police station. Separately, remarks made by BRS MLC Tata Madhu against Assembly Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar have sparked a political controversy. A heated exchange is ongoing between the ruling and opposition parties regarding this issue. While the Congress, BJP, MIM, and CPI have demanded action against Tata Madhu, the BRS alleges that the move is an act of political vendetta against their party.

Panic ensued among those present when Raju, the Personal Secretary (PS) to Naveen Mittal, collapsed unexpectedly. Noticing the situation, Minister Srihari immediately rushed to Raju's side. He took steps to provide first aid before the medical staff could arrive; assessing the emergency, he performed CPR. Through the timely assistance provided by the Minister, efforts were made to stabilize the victim's condition. Subsequently, he immediately alerted the medical staff and ensured that emergency medical services were provided. Upon receiving the information, medical personnel arrived at the scene and examined Raju. He was then shifted to a nearby hospital in an ambulance for further treatment. The incident caused a brief period of anxiety within the Assembly premises. However, thanks to the prompt response of the Minister and the medical staff, the victim received immediate medical attention. Reports indicate that doctors are continuing to monitor Raju's health condition. Public representatives and officials present on the Assembly premises wished him a speedy recovery.

New Delhi, September 8: A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the 2026–27 financial year was signed in New Delhi on Tuesday between the Department of Food and Public Distribution (DFPD) and the Food Corporation of India (FCI). The primary objective of this agreement is to make the food grain management system more efficient and to accelerate its modernization. Through this MoU, a comprehensive performance framework has been established for FCI. Clear targets have been set to enhance operational efficiency, strengthen accountability, and improve service quality. Performance will be evaluated based on these established targets. Reducing losses during food grain storage is a key aspect of the agreement. Measures will be taken to manage warehouses more effectively and fully utilize



storage capacity. Special emphasis will be placed on grain safety and storage quality. The agree-

ment also aims to expedite grain transportation and distribution processes by improving logistics and the supply system. Measures will be taken to enhance transparency and efficiency in the supply system by leveraging modern technology. Strengthening quality control systems is also a key aspect of the MoU. It has been decided to further fortify monitoring mechanisms to ensure that consumers receive high-quality food grains. To this end, inspections and quality tests will be conducted in accordance with established standards. Officials express optimism that this MoU will boost efficiency across the nationwide systems for food grain procurement, storage, transportation, and distribution. They noted that this agreement would serve as a crucial milestone in making the Public Distribution System more effective.



Greater Focus Needed on Public Services: Chandrababu



Amaravati, September 8 : TDP National President and Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu called upon party MLAs and leaders to focus on delivering government and administrative services to the public more efficiently. Addressing the second day of the leadership conclave, he noted that certain constituencies are achieving remarkable results in the implementation of citizen services. Inauguration of 132/33 kV Substation Built at a Cost of ₹29.71 Crore

Guntur, September 8 : A 132/33 kV substation, constructed at a cost of ₹29.71 crore using AP Transco funds, was inaugurated on Tuesday at Acharya Nagarjuna University in Namburu village, Pedakakani Mandal, Guntur district. The committee also examined the matter of granting a No Objection Certificate (NOC) for the mining project. Extensive discussions took place concerning environmental protection, the conservation of heritage assets, safety standards, and the necessity for scientific studies. The meeting also highlighted the need for continuous monitoring, scientific analysis, and studies regarding the impact of seismic tremors or mining activities on the Ramappa Temple. It was decided to take



into account the recommendations of the Archaeology, Forest, and Environment departments. The Collector stated that the views expressed by officials from the concerned departments and committee members have been recorded. He clarified that a further decision would be taken only after a comprehensive review of all aspects and a thorough study regarding regulations, safety standards, and the preservation of heritage structures. Goal is Accessible Healthcare for All: Union Minister J.P. Nadda

New Delhi, September 8 : Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda participated in the Ministerial Roundtable held during the 79th session of the World Health Organization (WHO) South-East Asia Regional Committee. He emphasized India's commitment to providing equitable and accessible healthcare services for all. He outlined the measures being taken by the Central Government to strengthen health infrastructure nationwide and enhance the capacity of healthcare personnel. The Minister stated that medical education is being expanded into underserved areas to help alleviate the shortage of doctors in rural regions. He noted that the quality of services is being improved across the spectrum, from Primary Health Centres to referral hospitals. He also revealed that special measures are being implemented to increase the availability of specialist doctors in challenging areas. J.P. Nadda highlighted India's significant progress in the digital health sector, noting that telemedicine services like e-Sanjeevani and ABHA-based digital health records are enabling faster access to medical services for the public. It was explained that digital technology is being utilized to deliver healthcare services to the public more effi-



ciently. The Union Minister stated that the government is working with the aim of providing quality medical services to every citizen. He mentioned that a multi-skilled healthcare workforce is being developed to move towards achieving universal health coverage. He added that meas-

ures are underway to ensure timely healthcare services reach people in rural and remote areas. J.P. Nadda emphasized that the government's goal is to improve the living standards of the country's people through comprehensive development in the health sector. He further stated that special focus would continue to be placed on expanding healthcare services, strengthening the medical workforce, and developing digital health systems in the future.

Women's Congress Demands Immediate Removal of Tata Madhu

Hyderabad, September 8 : A protest was held on Tuesday under the aegis of the Telangana Pradesh Women's Congress to condemn the alleged remarks made by BRS MLC Tata Madhu against Telangana Assembly Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar. Telangana Pradesh Women's Congress President Errabelli Swarna led the event, which took place at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar statue at Lower Tank Bund. A large number of women leaders and activists participated in the protest, organized under the leadership of the Women's Congress presidents from Khairatabad, Secunderabad, and Medchal districts. They emphasized the need to respect the office of the Speaker and stated that making inappropriate comments about constitutional posts within a democratic system is improper. During the protest, Women's Congress leaders burned an effigy of Tata Madhu to express their dissent. They remarked that making insulting comments directed at the Assembly Speaker goes against democratic values. They criticized the incident as unfortunate, noting that a person expected to act as a responsible public representative had spoken in a manner that undermines the dignity of the Legislative Assembly. They warned that the public would not tolerate attempts to disparage the office of the Speaker, which symbolizes the constitutional system. They emphasized that the conduct of public representatives should serve as an ideal for the



people. Speaking on the occasion, Mahila Congress President Errabelli Swarna stated that the remarks made against Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar were not merely personal insults but an attack on the constitutional system itself. She alleged that this incident reflects the BRS leadership's attitude towards women and Dalits. She condemned the act of targeting and making derogatory comments against a Speaker belonging to the Dalit community. She asserted that every constitutional office deserves respect in a democracy and that all political parties bear the responsibility of upholding that dignity. The Mahila Congress demanded the immediate removal of Tata Madhu from his MLC post and insisted that he offer a public apology to Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar. They advised those in public life to exercise restraint in their speech and avoid making statements that incite social discord. They noted that mutual respect among political leaders is essential to strengthen the democratic system. Mahila

Congress leaders participating in the protest expressed the view that civil discourse should be maintained in state politics. They remarked that personal attacks and derogatory comments do not benefit political culture. They expressed regret that leaders, who ought to be discussing public issues, are resorting to personal abuse. They urged all political parties to act responsibly in order to uphold the dignity of constitutional offices, such as that of the Speaker. State Vice-President Dr. Rekha Boyalapalli, Khairatabad District President Shambhula Ushasree, Secunderabad District President Kavitha, Medchal District President R. Lakshmi, along with State Women's Congress executive members, leaders from various districts, and party activists, participated in the event. Following the protest, Women's Congress leaders voiced their views, demanding that both party-level and legislative action be taken against Tata Madhu. The event concluded with slogans calling for respect to be accorded to the office of the Speaker.

Hyderabad, September 8: As speculations continue in the political circles about Cabinet expansion and change of ministerial portfolios in Telangana, the comments made by TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud have gained importance. In a chitchat held with the media at Gandhi Bhavan, he said that there is a need to reorganize the departments currently assigned to ministers and assign them new responsibilities. He disclosed that he has conveyed his instructions to the party leadership in this regard. Mahesh Kumar Goud stated that as the President of PCC, he has conveyed his opinion to the high command keeping the interests of the party in mind. However, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy made it clear that the Congress leadership will take the final decision on matters such as departmental changes and cabinet reshuffle. He said that he has made only the necessary suggestions to move ahead with the coordination of the government and the party. Recently, Konda Surekha was removed from the cabinet, changes were made in several key posts, and the discussions on filling up the vacant ministerial posts, the issue of cabinet reshuffle has become more important. The campaign is also continuing that there is a possibility of new equations in the politics of the state. Mahesh Kumar Goud, who responded to the campaign about the possibility of his inclusion in the cabinet, said that he has left the matter entirely to the decision of the party leadership. He said that at present his main responsibility is to strengthen the party at the field level and as the President of PCC he is fully focusing on the organizational structure. But in the last few days different news is coming out about the cabinet expansion. While some leaders say that there has been no discussion on expansion, other political circles predict that there may be changes in departments and selection of new ministers by the end of this month. With this, an interesting debate is going on internally in the Congress. With Mahesh Kumar Goud's latest comments, the focus is once again on the cabinet reshuffle. Political circles are keenly waiting to see if there will be changes in the ministerial departments, if the vacant positions will be filled, if new faces will be given a chance in accordance with the social equations of the party. As the final decision is in the hands of the Congress leadership and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, there is a possibility that this topic will continue to be a topic of discussion in the state politics for some time.
