Hyderabad, September 9 : BRS Working President KTR spoke to the media after meeting State Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla at Lok Bhavan. He stated that he brought to the Governor's attention the high-handed behavior of the police—acting under the Congress government—towards them on the

first day of the recent Assembly session. He alleged that they were stopped on the road and denied entry into the Assembly when they attempted to stage a protest wearing T-shirts, similar to the protest Rahul Gandhi had staged in Parliament. KTR mentioned that he submitted photographs and other evidence regarding the attacks on them, specifically the incidents involving women



MLAs, to the Governor. He also explained how the police treated BRS woman leader Sunitha Laxma Reddy. He alleged that the police failed to respond despite complaints being lodged regarding the attacks. KTR criticized the Congress party for attacking them and then turning around to level false accusations against them. He informed

the Governor that Congress MLAs had visited KCR's residence, created a tense situation, and made inappropriate remarks targeting KCR. He alleged that the state government played a role behind these incidents. KTR stated that he informed the Governor that, despite High Court orders, they were denied entry into the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council, reflecting the government's lack of respect for constitutional bodies and the judiciary. He alleged that they were suspended for this very reason. KTR affirmed their full respect for the Speaker but noted that the Congress party is exploiting this issue for political gain, criticizing their attempts to derive political advantage by misrepresenting events. He stated that they had requested a comprehensive inquiry into the developments within the Assembly. KTR revealed that the Governor assured them an investigation would be conducted into every issue they raised. He also mentioned that they had already lodged a complaint regarding the AI-generated photos and videos released by the government and warned that legal action would be taken against those spreading misinformation.

Request to Raise Upper Age Limit for Jobs



Hyderabad, September 9 : Government Whip Dr. Balmoor Venkat has requested Chief Minister Revanth Reddy to increase the maximum age limit for the recruitment of Constables and Sub-Inspectors (SIs). He met the Chief Minister at the Assembly on Wednesday and submitted a formal representation to this effect. He explained that many unemployed individuals are losing their eligibility due to the impact

of the COVID-19 pandemic and delays in the recruitment process. Balmoor Venkat noted that thousands of aspirants have crossed the age limit because job notifications were not issued on time. He expressed concern over the situation where candidates, who have been preparing for these jobs for years, are at risk of losing their opportunities. He urged the government to give special consideration to this matter. He requested that the maximum age limit for Constable posts, currently set at 34 years, be raised to 36 years. Similarly, he asked for the maximum age limit for SI posts to be increased from the current 37 years to 38 years. He opined that this measure would provide opportunities to many unemployed youths. He pointed out that competitive examinations and recruitment processes were significantly affected during the COVID-19 pandemic.

He explained that many candidates lost opportunities during that period, making a relaxation of the age limit necessary, and urged the government to consider the issues faced by the unemployed with empathy. Balmoor Venkat stated that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy responded positively to the request made by the unemployed. He mentioned that the Chief Minister assured them a suitable decision would be taken after examining all aspects of the age limit extension issue. Balmoor Venkat urged the government to consider the proposal with the future of unemployed youth as a priority, noting that raising the age limit would provide another opportunity to candidates who would otherwise lose their eligibility. Political circles anticipate that the government is likely to make a decision on this matter soon.

Cantonment Development is Our Goal: MP Etela

♦ Secunderabad, September 9 : MP Etela Rajender laid the foundation stone for CC (Cement Concrete) road works to be undertaken using Cantonment Board funds in the Cantonment area, which falls under the Malkajgiri Parliamentary constituency. He inaugurated development works costing ₹59 lakhs in SBI Colony, Chandulal Bowli, and Jayanagar Colony in the presence of the public. Cantonment MLA N. 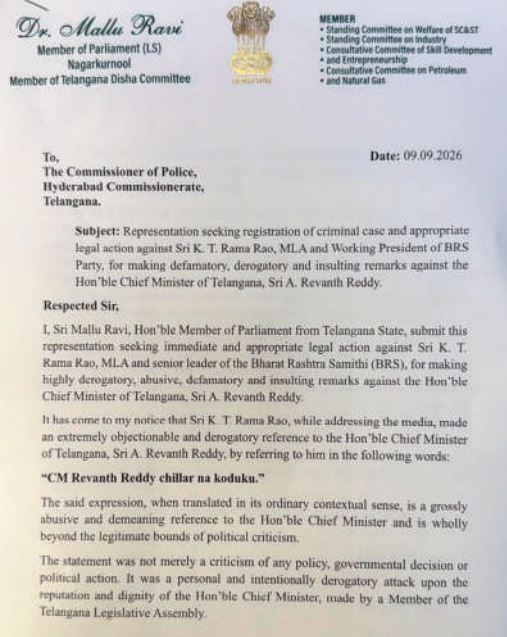

Hyderabad, September 9 : Congress MP Mallu Ravi has lodged a police complaint seeking legal action against BRS Working President and former Minister KTR for making inappropriate comments about Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. He met the concerned police officials and submitted a formal complaint. Mallu Ravi alleged that KTR's remarks regarding Chief Minister Revanth Reddy violated political decorum. He emphasized that leaders in public life must conduct themselves responsibly and opined that political criticism should be dignified. Reports indi-



cate that Mallu Ravi stated in his complaint that KTR's remarks could mislead the public. He suggested that public representatives should engage in political discourse while maintaining mutual respect. Mallu Ravi as-

Inspection of Ganesh Immersion Arrangements at Kapra Lake 'Baby Pond'

Malkajgiri, September 9 : Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation (MMC) officials are undertaking special measures to ensure that Ganesh immersion activities during the Vinayaka Chavithi festival are conducted safely and in an eco-friendly manner. As part of this initiative, the MMC Commissioner and the Uppal Zonal Commissioner, accompanied by officials from relevant departments, inspected the immersion arrangements at the 'baby pond' being constructed at Kapra Lake. Representatives from Civil Supplies, Town Planning, UBD, Ramky, and EPTRI participated in the inspection and briefed the officials on the progress of the arrangements. The special baby pond at Kapra Lake is being prepared with the aim of reducing the burden on natural water bodies during the immersion process. Plans have been specifically designed to facilitate the immersion of smaller Ganesh idols in this pond. Officials believe this will not only reduce conges-

tion at the main lake but also help control water pollution. Special emphasis is being placed on environmental protection while ensuring a convenient immersion facility for devotees. Officials were directed to accelerate activities such as desilting, sanitation measures, and replenishing fresh water in the vicinity of the pond. Orders were issued to take proactive measures to prevent any issues on the day of the immersion. Instructions were also given to the concerned departments to conduct continuous cleaning operations to



prevent garbage accumulation and to maintain the pond's surroundings in a clean state. Aspects such as lighting systems, access roads, drinking water facilities, and resting areas were reviewed, keeping in mind the movement of devotees. Officials were ordered

to complete all arrangements to ensure that the public arriving for the immersion faces no inconvenience. Measures were suggested to ensure adequate lighting for the smooth conduct of events during the night. 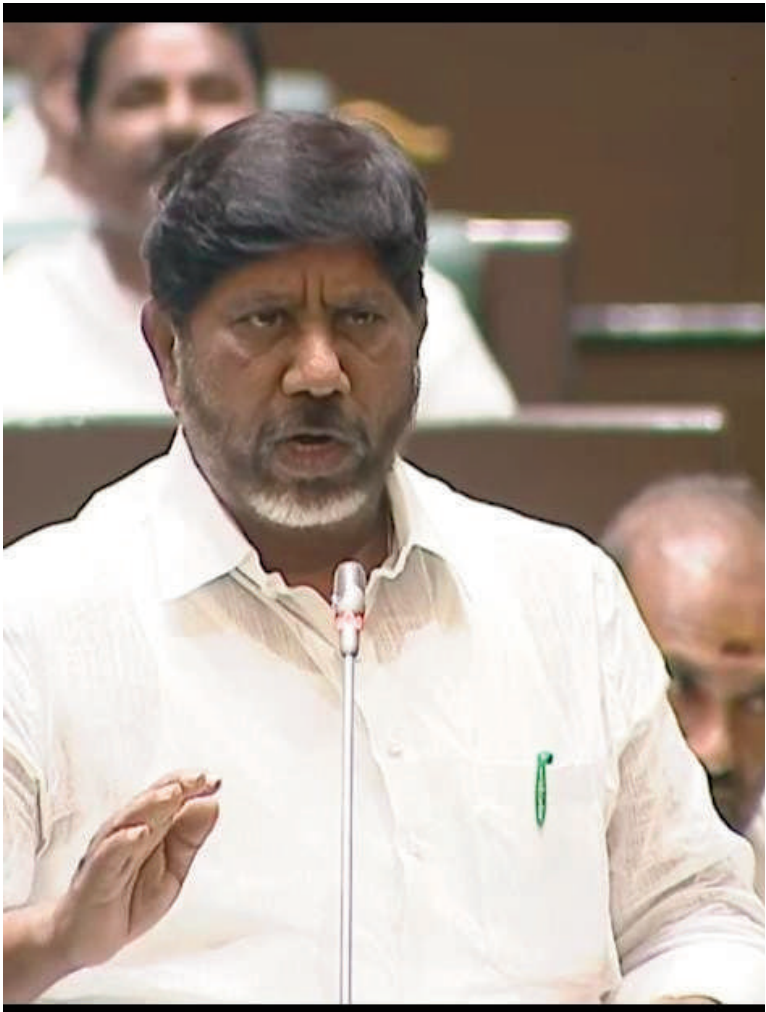

He noted that these incidents had caused concern within society.He strongly condemned allegations that an area was "purified" with turmeric water simply because Dalits had walked on the road there. He stated that such actions run counter to social equality. He emphasized that everyone bears the responsibility of ensuring equal access to the rights and dignity guaranteed by the Constitution. Bhatti asserted that society must move forward without any room for discrimination against Dalits, tribals, and backward classes. He affirmed the government's commitment to social justice and equality and made it clear that actions undermining the self-respect of weaker sections would not be tolerated.He stated that the struggle for social justice would continue. He stated that in a democratic system, everyone deserves respect and equal rights. He emphasized the need to completely eradicate discrimination based on caste and class. I Will Undertake a Padayatra in 2027: Jagan



- YCP chief announces plans to launch a *padayatra* (foot march) in September or October 2027
- Allegation that local body elections are being delayed
- Alliance government failed to keep its promises to the people
- YS Jagan Mohan Reddy

Tadepalli, September 9 : YSR Congress Party President and former Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy announced that he would undertake a state-wide *padayatra* in September or October 2027. He revealed this during a meeting held at the party's central office in Tadepalli with local body representatives, party leaders, and activists from the Parchur constituency in Bapatla district. He stated that the public is comparing the YCP government's five-year tenure with the current Chandrababu Naidu administration and clearly noticing the difference. Jagan asserted that the YCP government upheld its credibility by implementing 99 percent of the promises made

in its election manifesto. He criticized Chandrababu Naidu and Pawan Kalyan for failing to implement the promises contained in the signed pledge documents distributed before the elections, despite having come to power. He emphasized that his government had succeeded in keeping its word to the people. Jagan noted that during his tenure, administration was brought to the people's doorstep through the village secretariat and volunteer systems. He added that welfare schemes were implemented transparently, free from bribery and discrimination. He stated that a welfare calendar is announced annually during the budget session, accompanied by a clear plan for the implementation of various schemes. Jagan highlighted the reforms undertaken in the education and healthcare sectors. He mentioned the modernization of government schools through the 'Nadu-Nedu' program and noted the introduction of bilingual textbooks, digital classrooms, TOEFL training, and the distribution of tablets to eighth-grade students. He explained that the scope of the 'Aarogyasri' scheme had been expanded from 1,000 to 3,300 medical treatments, making services worth up to ₹25 lakh available to the public. He also referred to the establishment of village clinics, family doctor services, and 18 new medical colleges. Jagan stated that initiatives such as 'Rythu Bharosa Kendras'



(farmer support centers), e-crop registration, and price monitoring systems were introduced to support the agricultural sector. He mentioned that measures were taken to ensure farmers received remunerative prices. On the other hand, he alleged that the current government had failed to fulfill various promises made to students, women, farmers, and the unemployed. Jagan also addressed the issue of local body elections, alleging that

the government was postponing them by citing reasons such as BC reservations and the special comprehensive revision of the voters' list. Immersion Arrangements at IDL Lake

- HYDRAA takes special measures for Ganesh immersion
- Removal of 20 feet of accumulated silt
- Lake restoration works in full swing



Hyderabad, September 9: HYDRAA has initiated special measures to ensure that Ganesh idol immersions at IDL Lake in Kukatpally proceed without any hindrance. Officials are working intensively to increase both the water level and the depth of the lake to facilitate the immersion of the thousands of idols expected to arrive. Arrangements are being made to deepen the lake on the side facing the main road and fill it with water. Operations to remove over 20 feet of accumulated silt from the lakebed are currently underway. Alongside silt removal—which is allowing natural spring water to emerge—measures are also being taken to fill the lake with additional fresh water. The work is being executed according to a specific plan to prevent the inflow of wastewater and ensure adequate water storage for the immersion process.HYDRAA Commissioner AV Ranganath has already visited IDL Lake to review the immersion arrangements. He instructed officials to ensure that the lake restoration works proceed without interruption while simul-



taneously ensuring that no difficulties arise for the Ganesh immersion activities. Local public representatives and members of the Ganesh Utsav Committee have also made representations to HYDRAA regarding the immersion arrangements. Officials noted that large quantities of waste are being unearthed as the excavation work progresses. Large quantities of plastic waste, Plaster of Paris residues, coconut coir, and debris carried in by sewage are being dredged up. It was observed that the accumulation of this waste at the bottom of the lake over decades had compromised its water storage capacity.Officials explained that Plaster of Paris residues settling at the bottom not only increased pollution but also hindered groundwater recharge. The millions of tons of silt currently being removed are being transported away by the Ramky organization in an environmentally safe manner. Work has been accelerated to ensure adequate water levels in the lake by the time of the Ganesh immersion festivities. Following the immersion, HYDRAA has formulated a plan to undertake the complete restoration of the 72-acre IDL Lake. Officials stated that the objective is to rejuvenate the lake and develop it for the benefit of future generations.

Farmers Rally for Irrigation Water

- Demand for water release from Srisaillam to Somasila
- Massive protest at Nellore Barrage led by YSRCP
- Call for government response to farmers' issues

Nellore, September 9 : A massive protest was organized at the Nellore Barrage under the aegis of the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP), demanding the provision of irrigation and drinking water to the farming community of Sri Potti Sriramulu Nellore district. The event was led by former Minister and District YSRCP President Kakani Govardhan Reddy. Former Minister Sake Sailajanath, Nellore Rural in-charge Anam Vijay Kumar Reddy, Gudur constituency coordinator Buduru Guravayya, along with a large number of



party leaders, farmers, and activists, participated in the protest. They demanded the immediate release of water from the Srisaillam project to the Somasila reservoir. A massive rally featuring hundreds of cars and two-wheelers was conducted from the YSRCP district office to the Nellore Barrage. Tensions arose when the police obstructed the farmers and party leaders upon their arrival at the barrage. Kakani Govardhan Reddy engaged in an argument with the police and subsequently staged a protest by sitting on the road alongside the farmers. Later, despite the lack of police permission, he visited



the barrage area accompanied by the farmers and party leaders. Speaking on the occasion, Kakani Govardhan Reddy alleged that failing to release water to the Somasila reservoir—despite there being sufficient water at Srisaillam—constitutes a grave injustice to the farming community. He noted that the Somasila reservoir currently holds only 17 TMC of water, while the Kandaleru reservoir holds 18 TMC. He emphasized that the government has a responsibility

in villages such as Kanupurupalli, Nukanapalli, Yadanaparathi, Verubotlapalli, and Gopavaram in Kaluvai Mandal. He remarked that releasing water for just one day through the Somasila-Kandaleru flood canal could fill the local irrigation tanks. He demanded that the government respect the water rights of the farmers and urged it to review plans for alternative crops and irrigation management, taking weather conditions into account.Kakani criticized the Andhra Pradesh government for remaining unresponsive even as the Telangana government utilizes the water. He alleged that details regarding reservoir water levels are being withheld from the public. He expressed strong displeasure that, instead of addressing farmers' issues, the government is deploying the police machinery against those who raise questions. He accused the government of prioritizing other interests over the welfare of farmers. Kakani recalled that while Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy laid the foundation stone for the Nellore Barrage, it was completed by Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy. They stated that removing the names of former Minister Nallapareddy Sreenivasulu Reddy and Mekapati Goutham Reddy from the projects was inappropriate. They warned that the agitation would be intensified if the farmers' issues were not resolved. They made it clear that they would not be intimidated by false cases or arrests and would continue the fight for the interests of the farming community.

- Students gain hands-on understanding of soil sample collection

Jangaon, September 09 : District Collector Sandeep Kumar Jha has called for reducing the use of chemicals and protecting soil health. He attended as the chief guest at a soil analysis and awareness program held on Wednesday at the Kol-konda ZP High School in Devruppula Mandal as part of the 'School Soil Health Program.' During the event, he explained the importance of soil testing to the students. 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App Introduced to Ensure Transparency in Fertilizer Distribution

-Will Continue It Keeping the Larger Interests of Farmers in View

Minister Tummala in Legislative Council

Hyderabad, Trinet News, Sept. 9: Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao made it clear that there is no question of withdrawing the app introduced to ensure that urea and other subsidized fertilizers reach genuine farmers transparently and according to their requirements. He said technical issues arising during implementation of the app are being resolved from time to time and steps are being taken to make the system easier and more efficient for farmers in the future. Responding to questions raised by MLC Nellikanti Satyam in the Legislative Council on Wednesday, Minister Tummala gave a detailed explanation. Several members raised issues relating to urea supply, booking through the app, difficulties faced by tenant farmers, transportation charges for supplying urea to co-operative societies and technical problems. App to Ensure Subsidized Fertilizers Reach Genuine Farmers The Minister said fertilizers were earlier distributed on the basis of Aadhaar. However, he said the government has a responsibility to ensure that subsidized fertilizers reach farmers who are actually cultivating the land. He explained that the main objective of introducing the app was to prevent illegal diversion, black marketing and excessive

stocking of fertilizers while ensuring that farmers receive fertilizers according to their actual needs. The Telangana government introduced the "Urea Booking App" during the Rabi 2025-26 season to ensure transparent supply of subsidized urea to genuine farmers according to their requirements, the Minister said. He said a technical team appointed by the Government of India, along with State officials, is continuously monitoring the functioning of the app and resolving problems whenever they arise. He said all alternative options are being made available so that farmers who are not familiar with technology or do not own smartphones do not face difficulties. Temporary Differences Between Digital and Physical Stocks The Minister explained that temporary differences between digital and physical fertilizer stocks may occur due to the time taken to transport fertilizers from warehouses to retail outlets, accounting of receipts, stock transfer entries, e-POS synchronization and network connectivity issues. To overcome these problems, officials have been instructed to conduct district-wise stock inspections and regularly reconcile digital records with physical stocks. He said district officials have also been given clear instructions to take strict action against anyone deliberately involved in irregularities. Server Capacity Being Increased to Handle Peak Load The Minister said measures are being taken to ensure there are no technical disruptions even if the number of farmers increases or a



large number of users access the app simultaneously during upcoming crop seasons. He said the FFS technical team is continuously conducting load testing and the system is being designed to automatically scale up server capacity according to demand. The technical infrastructure is being strengthened to provide uninterrupted services even during peak usage. Members Seek Withdrawal of App Several members later brought to the notice of the House that urea was not always available to farmers when required. They said tenant farmers were facing difficulties in booking fertilizers through the app and that farmers in rural areas were suffering due to signal problems and other technical difficulties. The government has now taken steps to ensure that farmers can purchase urea at the same price anywhere in the State, he said. Minister Tummala also made it clear that steps would be taken to ensure that tenant farmers do not face difficulties in booking fertilizers.

Centre Calls for Strengthening AYUSH Services

Hyderabad, September 09 : Pratap Rao Jadhav, Union Minister of State for AYUSH, strongly urged states and Union Territories to further strengthen accessible, people-centric, and high-quality AYUSH services across the country. He stated that the AYUSH system of medicine offers immense health benefits to the public and emphasized the need to take it to every remote area. Noting that the Central Government is implementing various schemes for the development of this sector, he called upon the states to cooperate and fulfill their responsibilities. He explained that AYUSH plays a pivotal role in providing affordable and superior healthcare to the people. A national-level workshop titled "Strengthening the AYUSH Ecosystem in States and Union Territories" was successfully organized by NITI Aayog at Kanha Shanti Vanam, on the outskirts of Hyderabad. Minister Pratap Rao Jadhav, who attended the workshop as the chief guest, outlined the measures required to boost the AYUSH sector. He highlighted the growing global acceptance of traditional Indian medical systems and stressed the need for their further expansion. He urged that the benefits of Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, and Homeopathy be taken closer to the public and noted that the workshop would facilitate the sharing of experiences among the states. A large number of senior Central Government officials, representatives from over

30 states and Union Territories, and experts from various organizations attended this national workshop. Participants engaged in extensive discussions regarding strengthening the AYUSH ecosystem, sharing their experiences, best practices, and collaborative measures. They held in-depth deliberations on the current status of AYUSH services in each state, the challenges being faced, and strategies to resolve them. Officials expressed the view that this meeting, organized by NITI Aayog, would serve as a guiding framework for future action. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister highlighted that the AYUSH system is highly



beneficial not only for improving public health but also for preventing chronic diseases. He suggested taking medical systems like Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, and Homoeopathy to the public on a wider scale and strengthening AYUSH hospitals at the district and mandal levels. He urged state governments to allocate specific funds for the



AYUSH sector in their budgets and to encourage the youth to pursue opportunities in this field. He also emphasized the need to integrate modern technology with traditional medicine to deliver higher-quality services. 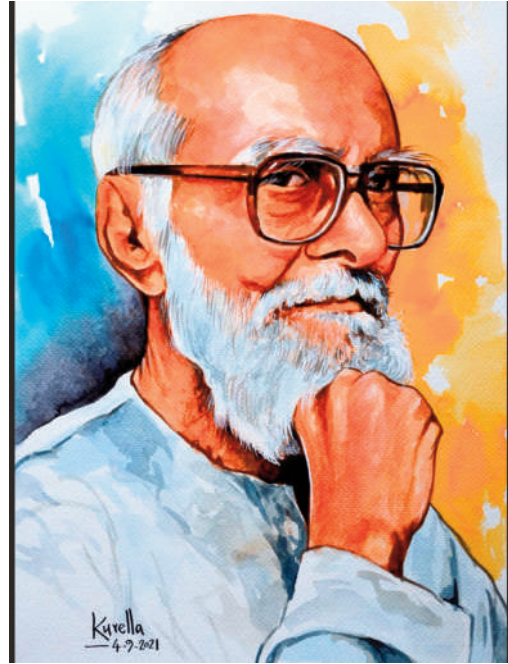
Hyderabad, Trinet News, Sept. 9: BRS Legislature Party MLAs have demanded an immediate investigation and legal action against those widely circulating fake, morphed and AI-generated images and malicious content targeting BRS MLAs and other elected representatives on social media and various digital platforms. BRS MLAs Devireddy Sudheer Reddy, Bandari Lakshma Reddy, Palla Rajeshwar Reddy and MLC Madhusudhana Chari, on behalf of the BRS Legislature Party, submitted a complaint to Mahesh Muralidhar Bhagwat of the Telangana Police (Law and Order). In their complaint, they alleged that fake digital content was being deliberately created and circulated to divert public attention from the alleged attack and rude behavior against BRS women MLAs and other public representatives near the Telangana Assembly two days ago. The BRS Legislature Party stated that circulating AI-generated images as genuine could spread misinformation among the public and seriously damage the reputation of elected representatives. They urged the Cyber



Crime wing to immediately identify and investigate fake, morphed and AI-generated images and posts, and trace those responsible for creating, uploading and circulating such content. The BRS Legislature Party made it clear that creating and spreading fabricated digital content against elected representatives merely because of political differences was unacceptable. The complaint also sought strict legal action over the conduct of the police during the incident near the Assembly and against the Congress leaders and workers allegedly involved.

Opposition Put on the Defensive

BRS Misses a Good Opportunity

Strategy Backfires

Hyderabad, Trinet News, Sept. 9: The Opposition, which was expected to put the ruling party on the defensive during the Assembly sessions, itself ended up on the defensive following the conduct of some BRS MLCs. Although the Congress government is nearing 1,000 days in office, there is some public



dissatisfaction over the non-fulfilment of several promises. The Assembly sessions provided the Opposition with a good opportunity to question the failures of the ruling party. During Question Hour, Zero Hour and discussions on resolutions, the Opposition had the

chance to corner the government on various issues. Having been in power for ten years, BRS legislators are well aware of which issues could be raised to put the Congress government in a difficult position. With the intention of mainly highlighting the alleged fai-

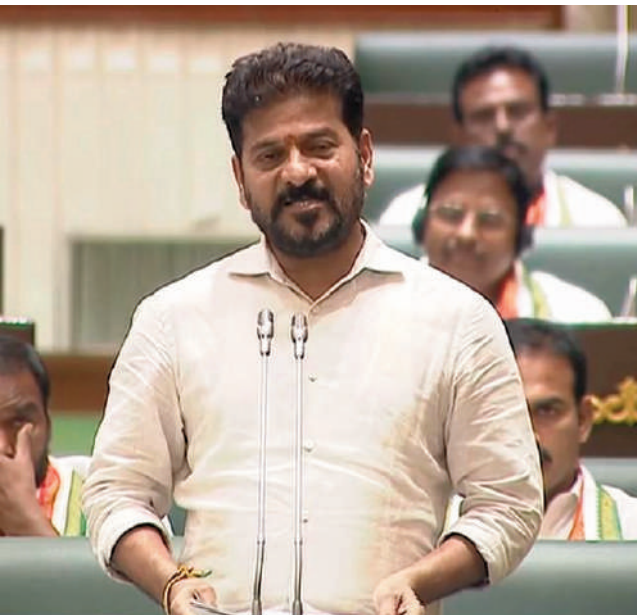


lures of the government during its 1,000 days in office, BRS Legislature Party Deputy Leader Harish Rao and senior leaders K.T. Rama Rao, Talasani Srinivas Yadav, Jagadish Reddy and Prashanth Reddy had reportedly done considerable groundwork. However, discussions have begun within BRS circles that the entire plan backfired due to the aggressive behavior of party MLCs Tata Madhu and Naveen Kumar Reddy. Even leaders within the party are reportedly criticizing the two for being overly aggressive. There are opinions that

the inappropriate remarks made against Assembly Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar after losing patience in an attempt to gain media attention caused damage to the BRS party. The ruling party's strategy of ensuring that discussions remained focused on the same issue for two days reportedly succeeded. A resolution seeking action against the concerned MLCs was sent to the Legislative Council, and the suspension of the two members until the conclusion of the session gave the ruling party an upper hand. The eagerness to attract media attention also became a matter of concern for the party on the opening day of the session. During a scuffle with police while entering the Assembly, inappropriate remarks were allegedly made against the Speaker in the heat of the moment, while the conduct of some senior MLAs also drew criticism. Some newly elected MLAs reportedly argued with the police in an attempt to gain media attention, while others removed the T-shirts they were wearing. It appeared that some senior MLAs had encouraged such actions. Police had reportedly told the members that they would not be allowed into the House wearing black T-shirts carrying slogans. Following this, former ministers created a commotion by removing their T-shirts and saying they would enter the House half-dressed. Political circles are now debating whether such conduct was appropriate.

Comprehensive Inquiry into Assembly Incidents

Hyderabad, Trinet News, Sept. 9: Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy came down heavily on the BRS, alleging that a conspiracy was planned at a farmhouse. He accused BRS members of conspiring to disrupt the Assembly proceedings. Speaking on several issues in the Assembly on Wednesday, CM Revanth Reddy alleged that the farmhouse was the center of a conspiracy behind the incidents that took place over



the past three days. He said that an inquiry had been ordered into the incidents in the Assembly. He warned that deliberately insulting Dalits, disturbing law and order, and provoking hatred and violence were criminal offences. The Chief Minister said that those responsible for oppression and atrocities against Dalits must be punished according to law. He added that a decision had been taken to bring both those who planned the conspiracy and those who executed it before the court and ensure that they are punished.
